Mau 31 Mothers' Memorial Deadline Pastors, at some time or other, all have heard it. "Brother, I love you and I love the church, but the Lord is leading us to leave. We definitely feel that He wants us to worship with another assembly." That message can come in person, it can come by letter, or it can come by an absence that is very noisy silence. The bottom line is, "We ain't comin' back no more."

I recently read an article by Loren McAlister concerning this subject. I would like to share some of his thoughts and some of mine with you. I believe that to hear the statement, "We are leaving," was one of the hardest things that I, as a pastor, had to handle. Mr. McAlister said, "A pastor's personality fills in with a flash of frustration, anger, and scorching, screaming pain because of rejection. The communique can have more kinks and twists than a game of snakes and ladders, but the message always distills down to the fact that 'we're leaving' and rejection can become the automatic counter emotion."

Mr. McAlister said he suffered for years in silence through these "led to leave" exits, but finally decided it was time to face up to it and meet the problem head on. Don't misunderstand me. I believe there are times when it is best for the members, saints, and the local assembly for a change to evolve. This can be helpful. However, by and large, I think that most leavers should have been stayers, because all they do is change their geography. They take their problems with them.

The author I mentioned said, "There are some people who are going to leave because they are going to leave and you just have to let them go. There are others who not only are sincere in their direction decision, but who are also teachable. They will be better believers and better body members as a result of a pastoral confrontation (carefrontation) in a prearranged, private, confidential setting in which no one feels threatened. You can initiate a Bible-based conversation on the church and unity."

Mr. McAlister uses Ephesians 4:1-3 where it speaks of lowliness, meekness, long suffering, forebearing, love, endeavoring, peace. From verses 4-6 there is a discussion of the doctrine of unity, one body, one spirit, one hope, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all. Verses 7-11, and particularly verse 11, divulged the diversity in the midst of unity. Diversity in the church is God's idea. Unity must never degenerate to a zombie-like conformity. We are all different, but we are members of the same body and work for the unity of that body.

# SAINTS WHO ARE "LED TO LEAVE"

The author continues, "In our world, war is norm. Unity in the church is a miracle. That miracle preaches the message that Jesus the Son of God is one with the Father. Unity on earth is only possible because of unity in heaven. Jesus' prayer teaches this truth, '... that they may be one as we are.' Whenever Satan destroys unity in the church this message about Jesus and the Father loses it's most visable illustration, the oneness of the church.

"You don't push away from a body because of a problem. A major portion of the New Testament teaching, particularly the epistles, is written to local churches with problems. I have yet to find a verse which says, Brothers and sisters take your Bible and quit. Go to FIRST REALLY SPIRITUAL ASSEMBLY on the corner of Harmony and Holy.

"It's not your option to quit. That's shocking but scriptural. Once you get married you lose some options. You are not supposed to quit. Once you become a citizen you lose some options. It is not your option to quit the body any more than it is your hand's option to become divorced from the wrist. The two women who tangled at Philippi were told to '. . . be of the same mind in the Lord.'

"A can of worms called Corinth was not to be praised or pushed aside as being too difficult to correct. Their problems were confronted one by one. No one was given permission to leave." McAlister continues, "I believe in the local church, and the more local the better. Only a very few people in the Bible were rich enough to own an animal for transportation. The people had to gather with the closest body of believers. The curse of the car is that it takes you to fast too far when you could really walk to the nearest gathering place. You would, like the early church, have to face the local issues and find the eternal answers."

I do not believe God is leading so many people to leave. I am growing more and more comfortable telling people so. People use that line because it's convenient and spiritual-sounding.

Mr. McAlister makes this final observation. "The first principle with which I always end these loving encounters is, if you're still going to leave, then please make sure this move is the last move you make. The second thought I present in my prayer. I release them and myself from the shepherd-sheep relationship. My eyes are generously moistened as I drop their hands with an 'amen'."

So I dedicate this ode to the "Led-to-Leavers." Please do not again blame God for your own carnal desires. The Bible gives us explicit direction. "If your brother has aught against you go to him . . ." There is nothing so precious as caring enough to confront. Next time, let's sit down and talk about it before we think about—leaving.

# Many Shall Come from the East

It is a known fact that all directions given in the Bible, unless otherwise specified, use Jerusalem as the center or point of origin. Thus, when we are told by the Lord in Matthew 8:11 that many shall come from the East and the West, we know it means east and west of Jerusalem.

We, of course, recognize this as a prophetic utterance by the Lord. Given to the Jewish disciples in that day, it meant that those other than Israel would sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the Kingdom.

In that Jesus spcke of both East and West, let us consider for a moment the West. Geographically, and historically, this means all nations that were located to the west of Jerusalem. This would have included all the nations of Europe. If we examine the biblical record of the New Testament, plus the historical accounts, we know that the nations west of Jerusalem have witnessed great revival. This is not to say that much more missionary work is not to be accomplished in this area. Every living soul in any generation has a right to hear the gospel and be saved. However, if the Lord should call His Church today, there would be a host of saints who would rise from those nations west of Jerusalem.

But what of the East? What of the vast continent of Asia and the island nations in what is known as the Orient? We have no absolute record of any great gathering of Christians. The point that our Lord made was "many shall come." It would seem that the many from the East should equal the many from the West.

If this is the case, then it is the responsibility of the established Church of this generation to reach the nations east of Jerusalem. Listing all of these nations would take much time. But let us at least touch on the major ones and what we, the United Pentecostal Church, are doing and possibly can do:

China: This huge nation is populated by one billion people. We have a wee crack in the door. A daily broadcast is bringing some response. We need much prayer for this communist nation with no way, within the country itself, to publically proclaim the Gospel.

Hong Kong and Talwan: Open Chinese-speaking



nations. They could be the only possible way of reaching mainland China. Presently, there are four missionary families appointed to Hong Kong. In time we would like to see others called to this small country. In Taiwan there are two missionary families, and we currently need two more couples.

India: Over seven hundred million people who live in an area one-third the size of the U. S. Thank God for our church there with approximately 50,000 believers. At present, there is no open door for a resident missionary. However, there is a desperate need for financial aid. India needs 100 PIM'S at \$20.00 per month. There is revival, but our national brethren need financial assistance to reach this nation. Literature needs to be printed. Crusades need to be held, and church buildings need to be constructed. You who are able, please respond to this great need!

Pakistan: Eighty-five million people with only three missionary families. Again, we appeal to our Canadian churches. Visas cannot be obtained by U. S. citizens. We need at least one more family. Canada, will you answer this call?

**South Korea:** This is another open-door field. At least one more missionary family is needed. Evangelism, church planting and Bible school teaching are the essential needs.

Philippine islands: Revival is happening throughout this island nation. It is possible for missionaries to obtain visas. We need further missionary assistance to harvest this field.

indonesia: We are able to obtain visas for a family appointed to this nation as Bible school teachers. This is a desperate need. A new national training center is under construction and the national leadership is asking for our help in teaching their Bible school students.

Yes, many shall be saved. But, they will only come because we who have the Truth have brought them this Gospel. Let us first of all pray for these needs. If God should call you, then be quick to respond. If you are not called, then you can give of your finances. Above all, make it possible for "many to come from the East."
