

These words, found in the latter part of the 14th verse of the 4th chapter of the Book of Esther, were spoken during a very critical time in the history of the Jews. A decree had been signed by the king of Persia, Ahasuerus, at the instigation of one of his wicked leaders, to kill all of the Jews in his kingdom. This evil man, Haman by name, had been re-fused homage which he thought due his position in the kingdom, by a Jew named Mordecai, who was the uncle of the then queen of Persia, Esther. It is almost amazing as to what ends some people will go to satisfy their spirit of retaliation upon those whom they might think have not "done them right." The terrible slaughter during the last World War with its toll in human lives, to say nothing of the suffering and misery brought about which will not be erased mostly by the evil whims of one man and only the judgment will reveal the penalty which will be extracted from this one and his evil henchmen for the terrible catastrophe perpetrated upon humanity. Esther might have thought within herself that she was safe for was not she the QUEEN, and her husband the king. She felt secure in her position but seemingly forgot that she too was a

Jewess and as such would also come under the terrible indictment of the decree. Mordecai sent back word to indifferent Esther that if she, in her position, did not do something to help her people and plead their cause before the King, that God would raise up someone else to deliver His people. He also de-clared that she might have been placed in her place of honor for just such a time as that - to stand in the breech and do something to prevent the slaughter of her kinsmen. Sad to say, many people seem to take the same unconcerned attitude today as Queen Esther did in her day. People are perishing all around us and time rushes on, bringing and the clock of the clock. us closer with every tick of the clock to the day when the fearful judgments of God will be executed upon a sinful and ungodly world. Just as Esther was in a position to "do something" about the predicament of the Jews, we believe that God has raised up His people in these latter days and given them the wonderful blessings and truth of His word to plead the cause of sinners be-fore the throne of God in order to bring help and deliverance to those bound in chains of sin. Yes we are here "for such a time as this." # **FULL STRENGTH CHRISTIANS**

"And Jehu drew a bow with his full strength . . .

On October 31, 1517, there had been a great feast in Wittenburg, Germany. Men, women, and children from every walk of life had gathered for a day of merry-making. As the sun sank below the horizon and darkness covered the countryside, a young man stepped up to the threshhold of the cathedral in the city, posted a written document squarely on the door, and nailed it there. Each blow of the hammer set off spiritual dynamite, because this action caused a theological explosion which still resounds over the face of our present-day civilization. That young man was Martin Luther, and this deed was the first great outward manifestation of the Protestant Reformation. He was God's "Man of the Hour."

God has always had a man whom He could use in critical times of the world's history. Such a man was Jehu. There came a day when King Solomon in all his earthly glory and splendor passed off the scene of life. His son, Rehoboam, came to the throne, but instead of easing the burdens of the people, he listened to the wrong counsel and made the load heavier. The people became more restless, and finally the kingdom was divided into two sections. The ten northern tribes, under the leadership of Jeroboam, separated themselves from the two southern tribes of Benjamin and Judah. These ten tribes retained the name of Israel, and the two lower tribes took the name of Judah. As these two kings failed God, they were removed from the scene and others followed, some of them serving the true and living God and others following the idolatrous worship

of pagan gods.

The day of wicked King Ahab came and passed, and Jehoram ruled in his place, a wicked and corrupt man. Elisha, that great spiritual prophet being led of God, sent one of the sons of the prophets to anoint Jehu to be the next king of Israel. The young man went to Ramoth-gilead and there found Jehu in a council with the captains of the hosts of Israel. He led him into a private room and there told him of the plan of God. Jehu went back to his men and tried to conceal the mission of the young servant of God. He did not know how these men would receive this news that he was to be the new king of Israel. In the natural sense, Jehu had a good position—the chief captain of all the armies of Israel. That is one thing to be admired about this man. He was not seeking a great office. He seemingly had no desire to shoulder the responsibilities of a royal monarch. But after the captains encouraged him to tell all, he told them the truth. Once and for all, Jehu made the decision to go all the way for God. After this slight moment of hesitation, he was constantly driving toward his goal—the will of God.

We can see him as he looks them in the eye and with grim determination informs them that he has been ordained of God and anointed to be the new king of Israel. His fears were useless. He had nothing to worry about. At once the men put their garments under his feet and blew the trumpets, by these acts signifying their pleasure at the new

Jehu at once set out to accomplish his task. God had not only given him a commission to be king but had also sent the message that he was to destroy the wicked king Jehoram and his family. "God's man" Jehu set out in his chariot to the city of Jezreel, where he was to find Jehoram. As he came close to the city a watchman on the tower called down that a company of men were coming. King Jehoram and the visiting king Ahaziah from Judah sent out a messenger to see what was causing the commotion. The messenger came out and repeated the words he had been told to say. "Is it peace?" he cried. The question was brushed aside and the messenger was compelled to follow along with the company and was not permitted to go back and report on his mission. Another messenger was sent with the same question and achieved the same results. The watchman on the tower cried out to the fearful kings that the messengers had come to the troop and had not returned. Notice what that watchman said, "And the watchman told saying, He "And the watchman told saying, He came even unto them, and cometh not again: and the driving is like the driving of Jehu the son of Nimshi; for he driveth furiously." (II Kings 9:20.) That phrase characterized this man Jehu—"he driveth furiously." After he had once given all for God, his purpose was sure and his goal certain. sure and his goal certain.

Someone has said that in our present age the situation is desperate but the people of God are not! Such is the sad truth. If there has ever been a time when God needs men who will drive furiously, it is today. We have saints in many places who can only testify of the good old times long since past and the glorious by and by. God wants men to work here and now. One noted American evangelist today makes the true claim that many people in the church of the living God are trying to substi-tute a cushion for the cross, that they are acting like they were on an excursion but had better prepare for an execution. How true! How sad it is to hear someone always giving forth the idea that we cannot have revivals today like we once had. God has not changed! He is only looking for men and women who will drive themselves furiously along the path that He directs. Perhaps one man cannot bring a revival to the masses, but he can have the revival in his own heart and do much toward

spreading it among others.
When Jehu arrived at the gates of the city, the wicked kings became frantic and rushed out in their royal chariots to meet him. The king who had lived a life of sin and moral degeneracy, caring nothing for the things of God, suddenly changed his tactics and asked, "Is it peace?" Then when he saw that his sinfulness and his worldly goods could not bridge the gap between him and his former chief captain, he turned and fled.

"And Jehu drew a bow with his full strength, and smote Jehoram between his arms, and the arrow went out at his heart, and he sunk down in his chariot." (II Kings 9:24.)

When this man drew the bow with his full strength, he hit the mark! The reason many don't accomplish spiritual goals might be due to the fact that they (Continued on Page 14)

# Signs of the Jimes

General Douglas MacArthur was recently asked what message he would like to send to the American churches and his reply was: "Tell them that the Christian Church has never met such an opportunity in five hundred years as it is now meeting in Japan. Where they have sent one missionary, now let them send a hundred. And let them lay plans big enough for this task. Japan cannot have a democracy without Christianity. The door will be open for another ten years." What a challenge Douglas MacArthur has given to us. May God help us all to do our part.

It was recently reported in an English publication "Dawn" that not a single convert was made last year in 11,394 churches in the United States. The official yearbooks of the Presbyterian, Northern Baptist and Methodist Episcopal churches show that 3,269 Presbyterian churches failed to secure a convert and that 500 of the others had only one convert each. This is indeed a startling "Sign of the Times." We thank God for the many new souls that were scripturally "Born Again" in the United Pentecostal Church during last year. Truly God is good to His people.

Americans spent over ten billion dollars for recreation last year. This is the first time that this mark has been passed. There were increases in expenditures for radios, phonographs, pianos, photographs, gardening supplies and especially for college football games, patriotic and women's organizations and luncheon clubs. How much was really spent for religious purposes? This is indeed a question

Christian missionary work is safeguarded in the Provisional Constitution of the United Republic of Indonesia, which has recently been drafted. It provides not only for freedom of religion but also the privilege to change one's religion and to preach religion. This is certainly good news for Java.

Prior to World War II, 24,000,000 volumes of Scriptures were printed each year by the Bible societies of the world, according to the American Bible Society. In 1948, fewer than 18,000,000 were printed. Despite increased demand, the production fell 6,000,000 copies short of prewar levels.

An interesting study—According to recent figures, one week's average wages in the United States will buy 394 pounds of bread. Russia's average wage for a week will buy 22½ lbs. The American can buy 276 quarts of milk—Russian 15½; American 81½ lbs. of meat—Russian 8 2/5 lbs. It is easily seen that free enterprise is far more productive than the Socialist system.

The Translations Department of the British and Foreign Bible Society has had a year of steady progress. Translators have added six new translation of languages to the list, bringing the total to 784 out of a world total of 1,084. They have completed six new Bibles, including the Tibetan.

According to Prophecy Magazine in a recent survey made at the State College of Pennsylvania, reveals that "Twice as many college girls drink regularly as those who do not drink at all." The survey concluded that "Both drinking and smoking among women were strongly supported by extensive advertising campaigns and upheld by motion picture models of behavior." Thus these evils invade further and further into our vital educational system.

According to Pathfinder: Fire is one of the most destructive things of our day, with 250,000 individual homes attacked by fire annually in the United States, almost 700 every day — 49,500 stores — more than 30,000 factories — 54,000 apartments and rooming houses—more than 27,000 garages and filling stations—10,000 hotels—12,000 restaurants and taverns — 2,600 churches — 2,400 schools — 1,200 hospitals and institutions! These are astounding figures indeed. "Even worse than the loss in property is the cost in human lives, for 11,000 Americans die needlessly each year by fire, and more than twice that number are severely burned, many of them disfigured for life. 87,000 fires yearly caused by careless smoking alone, particularly smoking in bed, which accounts for the largest loss of life; 52,000 fires can be laid to misuse of electrical equipment and defective wiring. This does not take into account the tremendous loss by forest fires, etc., caused by the careless use of matches, etc.

It was recently stated by Dr. Raymond B. Buker, foreign secretary of the Conservative Baptist Foreign Mission Society, after a three months' trip to the society's stations in Africa, Europe and South America, that "missionaries may have less than 10 years in which to bring the gospel of Christ to Africa and other areas. The rising tide of nationalism and Communism may drive out all foreigners, since missionaries are associated with foreign ruling powers." We need to spread "THIS GOSPEL" with all of our might while it is day lest night cometh when no man can work.

Oklahoma voters are to be congratulated upon their recent victory as they crushed the latest attempt to repeal the state's prohibition laws. The victory climaxed one of the most aggressive drives to influence state legislation ever conducted by religious groups. The campaign against repeal was concentrated in the Protestant churches of the state.

At commencement exercises at the United States Military academy at West Point, New York, each graduate received a specially bound copy of the Bible, as a gift from the American Tract Society of New York. This practice has been followed annually for the past 80 years. The 454 cadets received the Bibles at the close of the graduation exercises. May we say that no greater gift could have been given to these men who will be in places of authority in our armed forces. May they follow its precepts.

About two years ago, near the Dead Sea, an Arab goat herder stumbled into a cave and found eight ancient scrolls. He divided them with his companions and each tried to sell them as antiques. Last summer, Dr. G. Lankester Harding, chief curator of antiquities of Jordan, announced his finding of the scrolls and on hundreds of fragments dug up from the same cave by an expedition this year. He said that they were Bible texts written in the second, third or fourth century, B. C. This would make them at least 1,000 years older than the Leningrad copy of the Prophets which was written in A. D. 916, which has been considered the oldest manuscript of the Scriptures in Hebrew. The discoveries included a twenty-two-foot scroll of the complete Book of Isaiah, a commentary on the Book of Habakkuk, a hitherto unknown book called "The War of the Children of Light and the Children of Darkness," a book of hymns, and a book of ritual of an unknown Jewish sect. There were also the Book of Enoch in Aramaic, another copy of the last third of the Book of Isaiah, and one scroll which must have further laboratory treatment before it can be opened. Editor's Note: This is indeed an interesting and informative "find." God's word will be vindicated every time. The foregoing information is from the Good News Broadcaster.

According to the Jesuit publication Civilta Cattolica, the Cominform (Soviet controlled countries in Europe) plans to scramble Marxism with Catholicism and establish an "original Catholic Church." The seat of the new church will be Prague, where the Czechoslovak government has enacted a church control law, according to the publication. The Vatican at Rome says that a network of seminaries to train about 500 "false" priests to sow confusion among Catholic clergy and people, is part of the long range program of the Moscowled Cominform to eliminate the Roman Catholic church in Soviet satellite countries.

According to the Associated Press, a high Vatican source declared recently that Pope Pius XII will proclaim as dogma the assumption of the blessed virgin. The proclamation will probably take place during the 1950 holy year, the source said. Catholic doctrine says that the Mother of Jesus Christ was taken bodily into Heaven. By proclaiming this as dogma, the Roman Catholic church makes disbelief in such doctrine a heresy. Editor's Note: There are no statements whatsoever in the Word of God that will confirm such an assumption that Mary was taken bodily to heaven.

There is quite an interest at the present time concerning the gifts and operations of the Spirit. Some are in favor and some against these things. We cannot be against them and obey the Word of God, for the Bible teaches about them. In Paul's letter to the churches, and especially in his letter to the Corinthians, as found in 1st Corinthians 12:1, we read "Now concerning spiritual gifts brethren, I would not have you ignorant." We want to call your attention to the original text here. It reads like this—"Now concerning "SPIRIT-UALS" I would not have you ignorant. The word "gifts" has been supplied by translators of our Bible. We could say spiritual men or things as well as spiritual gifts and be proper or we could even use "spiritual operations." You will notice in the 8th verse Paul does not use the word "gifts" but it reads "The word of wisdom, and the word of knowledge" by the same spirit. So there are other ways that He may operate besides these special gifts. These gifts or spiritual operations belong to the church and if we were more spiritual we would see them more in operation in the work of the Lord. This might not be true concerning every assembly, except it is in an extra large one, such as they had at Jerusalem, Antioch and Corinth. These gifts were in "gifted men," as we find in Acts 13 and verses 1-3. "Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; ... as they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them. And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away."
Thus we see prophecy in operation in that church, but it was in the hands of mature and experienced men and not novices. We see from the last part of 1st Corinthians 12: . . . "God has set 1st Corinthians 12: . . . "God has set some in the church, first Apostles, secondarily Prophets, thirdly, Teachers;

after that miracles, then gifts of healing, helps, governments, diversities of tongues." Also in Ephesians chapter 4 and verses 11, 12, "And he gave some, apostles; and some prophets; and some evangelists; and some pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ." These gifts of offices of the church are higher and greater than the gifts of the Spirit. These offices of the spirit have the supremacy or supervision over the operation of the gifts. This is proven by 1st Corinthians 14:29-32. The fruits of the Spirit as recorded in the 5th chapter of Galatians are the first results of the spirit-filled life and the most important of all operations of the indwelling Spirit.

In the early days of the Penteostal outpouring, some of the gifts were manifested in a special way at a Bible Conference and school in Houston, Texas, in the years 1908-09. The gifts were in operation in the greatest manner that we had ever seen up to that time, and were developed to a marked degree of efficiency. This great blessing of God continued for several years in our work in the southwest. Brother E. N. Bell, D.C.O. Opperman and others of us were prominent in the work in those days and we got along well as long as experienced leaders kept the oversight of the work. However, some inexperienced and immature preachers tried to run their meetings too much by the gifts of the Spirit only and brought great reproach upon the work. Most of the pastors and

leaders became fearful and drew back because of the confusion wrought by inexperienced men. We found that some of the gifts could be operated in the human realm and this is proven in Paul's first letter to the Corinthians in the 13th chapter and 1st verse and also in the 14th chapter. In the 12th chapter we find the gifts were divided severally as He wills and not as You will, etc., and when the Lord gives us a gift we should not become exalted and advertise that we have one for if we do we may lose it as this is wrong. Let him that glorieth, glory in the Lord-God forbid that we should glory except in Him. On the Day of Pentecost when the believers were filled with the Holy Ghost, they spoke in tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. In other words, they spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit and we should never speak in tongues in public except we are moved by the Spirit of God. Nor should those who have the gift of interpretation try to interpret except they are definitely moved on by the Spirit of the Lord. In that way we will not get in the flesh or human or try to interpret in a mechanical way. People often ask how can a person operate the gifts in the flesh or human spirit. The Lord may give a person the gift of prophecy—that is, supernatural ability to preach under the anointing of the Holy Ghost. That same person may get out of the spirit and preach in the natural or flesh without the anointing of the Lord. So in the same way may some of the gifts be operated in the realm of the human or by the flesh. When this is carried too far it leads to confusion and that is just what is happening in some places. We may have the truth and proper doctrine along these lines but our practices may be wrong the same as Paul wrote about in 1st Corinthians chapter 14. Some who try to interpret think they are doing so through their gift of interpretation but (continued on page 11)

The Word of God states in Luke 17:26-32 "As it was in the days of Noah, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man. They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all. Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they did eat, they drank, they bought, they sold, they planted, they builded. But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven and destroyed them all. Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed. In that day, he which shall be upon the housetop, and his stuff in the house, let him not come down to take it away; and he that is in the field, let him likewise not return back. Remember Lot's wife!

The story of Lot is one of the greatest lessons in the entire Bible. Let us consider the case of Lot. As you know, he was Abraham's nephew, and both were very fond of each other. Abraham had taken Lot with him when he journeyed from his homeland down into Canaan. He had shared with Abraham's Godly and also rich in this world's goods. Genesis tells us that Lot had flocks and herds and tents. As a matter of record, the multitude of Abraham's and Lot's flocks and herds were so numerous that the land was not able to bear them both. So Abraham gave Lot his choice, to remain in the hills of Canaan land, or choose the plains of Jordan which lay near the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. Here is where Lot made the first wrong decision of major importance in his life. There is no record that he prayed earnestly about his decision as to where he should live. As a matter of fact it appears from Scripture that he was entirely influenced by the richness of the plain of Jordan because it looked in those days even as the "garden of the Lord." God was not considered in his choice. That step which seemed a very rational decision at the time, cost Lot just about every-thing he had in this life. It pays us to make decisions only after we have prayed and consulted God in matters of such importance. His word has declared that in all our ways we should acknowledge Him and He would bring it to pass. I do not believe that Lot ever intended to become engrossed in the affairs of sinful Sodom because he did not move into the city but pitched his tent toward Sodom. In other words he pitched his home outside the walls and thought perhaps he would keep aloof from the sins of that cursed town. The Bible makes it clear that the men of Sodom were wicked and sinners before the Lord.

We do not have the details, but after so long a time Lot moved into the city proper. We can imagine that some of the leading men of Sodom came out to Lot's encampment and held a conversation something like this. "Say Lot, why don't you move into town? Why do you want to cause yourself and your family to be annoyed by the inconveniences of country life when we have so many advantages in the city. We have nice stores and market places. You and your wife would not have far to go to shop. We also have fine water and it would not have to be carried as far as you

carry it now. Your wife and four daughters could enjoy the friendship of the folks in Sodom and we could use you in one of our leading political organizations to greet the strangers that come to our fair city. We realize that your religion is a little different than ours, but after all we are all going to heaven, so why don't you stop being narrow minded and come into the city and be one of us. After all, you are enjoying the benefits of our land and the protection of our military force, so come and help us make Sodom a better city. We are sure that your influence will be for the good."

Poor Lot. That was his second big mistake . . . the day he hauled down his tents and moved into wicked Sodom. No doubt the real estate dealers found him a very comfortable home to buy and his family was soon swept into the society of thet doomed town.

of that doomed town.

The Word tells us that the cry of Sodom and Gomorrah was great because their sin was very grievous. It was so sinful and so exceeding grievous that God himself investigated! The Lord appeared with two angels soon after this to Abraham and God revealed to this old God-fearing patriarch that He was going to destroy these twin cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. You know friends, it was a wonderful thing that Lot had a friend in his uncle Abraham that knew how to pray. This same chapter 18 of Genesis records one of the most remarkable prayers ever uttered by human lips. It was the prayer of Abraham, pleading with God to spare his nephew Lot from the terrible destruction that would soon fall on those ungodly cities. Sometimes we consider it a great privilege to have a relative with an abundance of money or earthly influence and many times a relative who is rather religious and whose asset is their ability to pray, is sometimes discounted. May I warn you to be careful not to sell short any friend you have, that knows how to reach the throne of grace in prayer. That kind of relative or friend will be the most valuable in the long run. Abraham knew how to pray. He could not go himself into Sodom to deliver Lot but his prayers made the angels which were dispatched to destroy the city, be first of all, messengers of mercy and rescue his nephew Lot. I am firmly convinced that if it had not been for Abraham's prayers, Lot would never have been delivered from the destruction of Sodom.

Perhaps you have a loved one who is out of the ark of safety... a son... a daughter... a wife... a husband, father, mother or sweetheart and today finds them far far from God. As a matter of fact you do not know where they are right now... maybe in a tavern... maybe gambling or drinking in a place where you could not frequent. You could not go there but don't forget that God is still able to send angels to help rescue and deliver in answer to fervent prayer. Abraham's prayer, without a doubt, caused Lot to be spared.

Let's go down a moment to that wicked city of Sodom, with the angels. This scene is recorded in Genesis 19. Lot was no longer camping outside the city but had moved in, bag and baggage. Not only that, but he was one of the political leaders of Sodom. He was the very one that greeted the angels at the gate

of the city. It was a city that one day he shunned, and now was greeting others to abide there. He evidently had grown even more wealthy in Sodom. He in-vited the angels to his home and pre-pared for them a sumptuous feast. Without question, Lot was one of the leading men of Sodom. In addition to this, he had given two of his daughters in marriage to young men of Sodom. In-stead of following Abraham's example and sending back to his father's house for righteous bridegrooms to marry his daughters, he permitted them to marry these sinners in Sodom. No doubt these sons-in-law made great promises to Lot when they asked for his daughters. "Surely they can worship your God . . . we will not bother them about religion . . . don't worry Lot, your daughters will continue to serve God just the same because we really love them and wouldn't lay one straw in their path against their faith." We will see in a moment how this actually worked out. But let us return to Lot's house where the angels are eating of this great feast. A sudden commotion took place outside Lot's house. The lustful and exceeding sinful men of Sodom had come to commit sin with the angels—Lot's guests! Can you imagine that act of brazen, wanton sin . . . "Nice fellow citizens Lot had in that brute mob that howled at his door!" He stepped out trying to pacify those beasts in human form, and offered to give them his virgin daughters if only they would not harm those angels . . . What do you think of that kind of treatment to Lot by these men who had pretended to be his friends? Even the offer of his daughters would not stop their cravings of sin. Finally the angels reached forth and pulled Lot into the house with them and struck that howling mob with blindness. Right here I want to emphasize that these men of Sodom did NOT return to their homes, or cease from clamoring at Lot's house but continued to beat at his home even in their blinded condition until sheer exhaustion caused them to cease. My friends, you may make alliances with sinners and on the surface, they appear to be your friends, but if you are following God, you had better remain like Abraham on the hills of Canaan than to move down into the valley with sinners because they will turn on you with vengeance some day and it may then be too late. Next we find Lot (continued on page 13)

While we rejoice in our gracious deliverance through the precious name of Jesus, there are other great promises in the Holy Word which belong to those who have made a choice to follow Tesus.

The church at Phillipi received a most unusual promise through the ministry of the Apostle Paul, when he wrote, "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

At first observation, such a statement sounds unbelievable, but upon scriptural investigation, you will find that the Lord Jesus has not only provided a salvation of deliverance from sin, but arranged a provision for the daily life of His disciple and also blessed spiritual necessities.

## But My God Shall Supply All Your Need!!!

In Matthew the sixth chapter our eyes behold the promise of the Lord Jesus. "No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore, I say unto you take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink; nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on. Is not the life more than meat and the body than raiment? Behold the fowls of the air: for they sow not, neither do they reap, nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly father feedeth them. Are ye not much better than they? Which of you by taking thought can add one cubit unto your stature? And why take ye thought for raiment? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they toil not, neither do they spin: And yet I say unto you, that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ## GOD MOVING IN SOUTH AFRICA

Happy greetings in the wonderful Name of Jesus Christ our Lord and coming King. God bless you and each person who contributes to the worthy cause of spreading the Whole Gospel to the Whole World.

We have been visiting as many works as possible since receiving your last letter. First we visited a new work at Belfast. It is called the coldest place in the Union; and I agree. The date to the native pastor was not given and he did not know which Sunday we were to arrive. However, after a wait of about an hour, we started church. The attendance was good but I think the main attraction was a woman preacher (Sister Freeman). It seems that no one there had ever seen a woman preacher before. The Pastor has only been there a short time but God is blessing and the people have a high regard for him.

From Belfast we went to Sabie where we helped on the new church building there. So far the Lord has sent in through the white works here in South Africa, mainly from Bro. Beetge's church, enough money for the windows and also the plastering materials. The block work is all finished and will be ready for the roof in just a short time. This is a big expense as it has to be made of iron. We are encouraging the natives to put everything they possibly can into it. They are doing fine, too, when you consider their incomes. The Lord is blessing and numbers are increasing right along. Four had been baptized a few days before and some more are to be baptized soon. It is a pleasure to be in service with them.

Recently Jeremiah was in an all night service at the West Randontein Mine compound. This is the first time for service there. A number of men from Bechuanaland are working there. The Compound manager has allotted them a certain room for their services. That makes the second mine that we have a very good start in. The other is the Crown mine. The service was well attended by many that were not of any Christian faith.

We also made a trip to Mafeking in connection with getting a better standing for the native preachers in Bechuanaland. We do not know exactly how much we were able to accomplish there. This is under a different government (British Protectorate) from the Union. There is a church at Mafeking. The Chief seems to be more lenient with the two preachers there in his village. About three Sundays previously 27 were bap-tized in the name of Jesus. That put the total number to a little over 700 they claim. I have no reason to doubt this as I have seen two different groups of men, numbering about 100 each, from the church here, who work in the gold mines here at Johannesburg. There are wonderful things ahead for the children of God in this place.

We have other plans to visit six or seven other different churches. The two churches in Johannesburg are moving on for the Lord.

God bless you and keep you. We are still looking forward to seeing you (Brother Stairs) over here in South Africa before too long, d. v. Pray for us as this is our greatest need. I feel in my soul that God has something in store for us here.

Brother and Sister Wang belong to no organization, but they are real Oneness Pentecostal missionaries who had three fine missions in Canton and vicinity.

We have been investigating and find there are a few available buildings which we could rent for the mission. There is a terrible custom here of paying key money which means that a certain amount of money has to be given to the owner before possession of any building could be obtained. We would need from \$500 to \$1,000 to start a mission here. It is the general opinion that Hong

Recently I had to go to Buenaventura to get my car. It had been damaged somewhat in transit but we finally made out all right. We had shipped the car from Cartagena and I was told that I wouldn't need any insurance as no damage had ever been done to any before in transit. It is about 80 miles from the coast to Cali over very dangerous roads and at times it looked like we would never make it. At one time we had gone by a very narrow place when I suddenly heard a roar and looking back we saw a landslide coming down the mountain which wiped out the road over which we had passed only a half-minute before. ## REPORT FROM LIBERIA

Several towns are asking us to send workers to them, but we just haven't the help to send to all of them regularly. A month ago we did take on another town and God has been blessing there. Its name is Buleswah. Recently a young man of the Mendy tribe received the Holy Ghost there. The chief's son-inlaw was standing nearby and recognized the dialect in which the young man was speaking while receiving the baptism of the Holy Ghost. He had never seen anything like it before and finally said, 'That young man doesn't understand one word of that dialect, but now he is talking it." After this altar service a middle-aged man stood with tears in his eyes and told how this same God of whom we were telling them, had appeared to him in a vision. In this vision he was taken to hell and even felt the flames enveloping his body. He was also shown a place so beautiful it was in-describable and he begged permission to stay there. Then he was told that he must quit lying, quit stealing and to re-turn certain stolen articles, including a ju ju of leopard's teeth which he had stolen from a man, expecting it to work magic in his behalf. Too, he was told to go back to his people and tell them that even though they had never heard the gospel of salvation, yet they must pray to God in Heaven. This man, a native blacksmith, was visibly shaken and said now that the gospel had come to them, he wanted to fall down and weep. In talking with him later we learned that he was the son of the woman whom we baptized in Bolah almost two years ago, who had such a pitiful case of leprosy. We wonder if her son's vision had not prepared this mother's heart for accepting the gospel so readily. I hung my head in shame when this man told how God told him to pray even though they had never heard the gospel—yet they must pray. That man and his people have waited for 15 years since then for the gospel. Surely we, His people, have been slack in obeying the Great Commission.

Just recently, Sister Gruse and the workers went to this same village. The Chief's daughter received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost and the Chief was slain under the power of God. They are building a church there and we are thankful for that. Before they started building they asked this question, "If we build a church house, will some one always come to teach us the God-way?" We knew the thoughts and fears that prompted that question. They meant 'If we forsake our ju-ju and its magic, if we leave our witchcraft and walk in this light, will this light suddenly be withdrawn from us? We do not know the way; we cannot read the Bible for ourselves. Unless someone comes to teach us we shall fail and be made ashamed before our people for having turned to the white man's God instead of our own black magic." It was not easy to answer the chief on this question with our limited forces. Pray that we may not fail them and the many others who feel the same way.

Disappointments we meet up with, not a few, but I thank God for the privilege of being here anyway. I am happy here. Pray that we may have strength to make the trips occasionally to the villages for the missionaries are needed there and one does enjoy going where needed so greatly. Sister Robinson.

Two pairs of anxious eyes studied the face of Jesus, as they searched His face for the answer to their request, "Grant that we may sit, the one on Thy right hand, and the other on Thy left in Thy kingdom." Instead of answering them, Jesus asked, "Can you walk the same road I walk, suffer the same privations, and be misunderstood, and misrepresented, and still go on?" "We can," was their answer. Then Jesus informed them that this privilege of occupying the throne with Him would be given only to those who could qualify. Would it be given to James and John; will it be given to you and me? That all depends on whether or not we overcome the world, the flesh, and the devil.

There are no worthy goals in life but what are reached through determination, and often through suffering and hardships. The boy whose aim is to be a doctor, a specialist in one particular field, must face the road ahead with grim determination. He must graduate from high school, then college, then medical school, and he must serve the period of internship, etc. Often he must spend his evenings looking over books, and completing assignments, while many of his friends spend their evenings leisurely. He has to be very saving with his money and often go without things he needs, for money comes slow for him and his schooling demands most of it. But he thinks little of the hardships, he pays little heed to the fact he is being deprived many things his friends enjoy, for he has his eyes on a goal. He dreams daily of the hour when he will be pre-sented with his diploma. He pictures himself a few years hence, with a flourishing practice, and in fancy hears his name on the lips of countless numbers of people who trust his decisions. ## IT COULD HAPPEN IN YOUR TOWN

When the Atom Bomb exploded overthat judgment for 120 years but the Hiroshima on August 6, 1945, a shudder of horror went around the whole world! In a single moment of time 60,000 people were killed, 100,000 injured, 200,000 persons were left homeless and four square miles of city streets were literally wiped out. We were affected by the reports, yet the majority of the people have already forgotten the horrors of this great tragedy. But have you ever stopped to think, "An Atom Bomb could fall in my town." It may seem a remote possi-bility but it could happen!

In 1st Corinthians, chapter 10, the Apostle Paul recounts a portion of the history of the children of Israel. He recites their privileges, their faults, their punishments, their sins and plagues; then he states, "Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come." Their record is left for an example to us, a warning against similar sins, if we would escape like punishments.

"All these things happened." They are not simply fictitious tales or the concoction of one's imagination. The things mentioned in the Bible actually took place. The persons mentioned were actual people, such as might live in your town. Perhaps they dressed differently; their customs were different; nevertheless, they were human beings. The God that lived then still lives today; He is not a mere term in ancient history. God is in action now. The God that was displeased with sin then is displeased with sin in your town, in your home, and in vour life.

If men could presume upon their privileges in that day of which Paul spoke and provoke the judgments of God then the same or similar conditions could prevail in your town and judgments could fall where you live. You may enjoy wonderful spiritual blessings and privileges and yet come short of eternal life. Some folks feel that since they have been baptized in the Name of Jesus and have received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost that they can settle down to an indifferent life, and do as they please and yet be assured of eternal life. But note: the children of Israel were "Baptized unto Moses in the cloud and in the sea," which is a beautiful type of the Baptism of Water and of the Spirit. God worked miracles for their deliverance. They were miraculously conducted through the Red Sea. Yet many of them were overthrown in the wilderness, and never saw the promised land. Just because God blesses a person is no assurance of his salvation. He may be blessed and yet lose the blesser.

Are not the sins they committed, sins that are being committed in your town today? They lusted after evil things, committed fornication, engaged in idolatry, tempted Christ, murmured against Moses, the God-appointed leader, and at times were for going back to Egypt. Judgment fell on them for those things; and judgment will fall on your town as a result of sin. Sin always has and always will provoke the judgment of a holy God.

In Noah's day God pronounced judgment because of sin, and then postponed

day came when God dealt with the moral degeneracy, the corruption and the violence of wicked men. Men scoffed when Noah spoke of the impending flood but the hour arrived when the rain began to fall and the waters began to rise. Some perhaps thought, "It couldn't happen here in our town, to our homes and to our families," but it happened! The same conditions that characterized the days of Noah are in evidence in YOUR TOWN! Though God will not destroy the world with water again yet there will be judgment; when the world shall be renovated by fire. 2 Peter 3:10. Your town will be included in that great conflagration.

For years we have heard the message of the second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ. Some have become so familiar with it these days that they go to sleep when it's being preached. The story of His coming doesn't thrill them any more. Many are saying in fulfillment of the Bible, "... Where is the promise of his . Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation." 2 Peter Many have gone astray from the Old Paths and are adhering to doctrines foreign from the Bible. The Bible still stands and its message is still true. The Lord is coming! Nineteen hundred years have passed since the Lord spoke the words, "Surely, I come quickly . . ." but we are that many years nearer the time of which He spoke. His coming is going to be sudden. Visualize the scene as it may be enacted in your town. Husbands running the streets looking for their wives who have gone in the rap-ture. Unsaved mothers having their babies snatched from their arms. Backsliders weeping over neglected opportunities. Churches filled with weeping multitudes who will find, "It's too late to pray." Yes, it's going to happen and it could happen in your town. Someone has said, "To be ready then is to be ready now." Oh, think of the sorrow, the regret and the disappointment if you should miss out on that, the greatest event in the history of the world!

dashing through the streets of Sodom in order to warn his married daughters and sons-in-law who had made such fair speeches when asking for the hands of his daughters. The angels had told Lot the time was short and to warn any loved ones of the coming disaster! I can see him pounding at their doors, calling to them and warning them of the great calamity . . . but what was the result? I'll let the Bible speak for itself . . . "But he seemed as one that mocked unto his sons-in-law."

Wearily he returned home . . . he knew he was going to lose his married daughters and also his two sons-in-law. His heart must have been very very heavy. Perhaps then he wished he had never compromised with sinners and moved

to Sodom.
"When the morning came, then the angels hastened Lot, saying, Arise, take thy wife, and thy two daughters, which are here; lest thou be consumed in the iniquity of the city. And while he lin-gered, the men laid hold upon his hand and upon the hand of his wife and two daughters and brought them forth and set them without the city. And it came to pass when they had brought them forth abroad, that he said, Escape for thy life; look not behind thee, neither stay thou in all the plain; escape to the mountain, lest thou be consumed." And hardly had they gotten out of the city until the wrath of God fell upon it and it was consumed, both Sodom and Gomorrah with brimstone and fire. But as they were fleeing, Lot's wife looked back. Evidently there was a longing in her heart for the wickedness of sinful Sodom and as she did so, she was turned into a pillar of salt!

Let us sum up the case of Lot. He was getting along fine. He was blessed of God both spiritually and financially but he made a fatal decision. It did not seem fatal at the time, but he chose Sodom instead of the hills of God to live in. He moved closer and closer into the society of those ungodly towns. He bought a home, he gave his daughters in marriage, he became mixed up in political affairs. What did he gain? Absolutely nothing! The citizens of Sodom turned on him like beasts. They disgraced him before even the angels of God. He lost his daughters, his sons-inlaw were also consumed. His house was burned up and as far as we know his wealth. He went in Sodom a rich man he came out poverty stricken! He went in with a fine wife. Even she was en-gulfed in the sins of Sodom and he lost her. His tents were lost. His herds were lost. His daughters were lost, his sonsin-law were lost, his wealth was lost, his position was lost, his wife taken from him and the last we hear of Lot was in a cave in the hills, and his offsprings were the wicked Ammonites and ungodly Moabites which plagued Israel for hundreds of years. The case of Lot is a pitiful story, but Jesus warns us of similar conditions in these very days. As it was in the days of Lot, so shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed. Lot's decision to leave the paths of God for the riches of Sodom, led to his downfall. You are called upon to make a decision in these days for God. Will you look for safety in the prosperity of the sins of the world, or will you take the way of the cross. Remember Lot's wife, and also remember the story of Lot!

don't try hard enough. If Jehu had pulled back the bow with only half of his strength, the arrow would have fallen harmlessly at the king's feet, but he used his FULL STRENGTH! He hit the target. The devil is going around as a roaring lion, but we can shoot an arrow of faith into his evil intentions if we will pull back the gospel bow with our full strength.

There was once a man named Samson who was called of God yet did not fully follow his call. In fact he finally left God so far out of his life, and became so entangled with the world about him, that he ended up in Gaza with his eyes put out, grinding at the Philistine mill. However, he repented of his wrongs and when the opportunity afforded it, Samson determined to accomplish one final work for the Lord. He had a young Philistine lad lead him to the main pillars of the temple where the pagan worshippers had brought him to make sport. Then with a prayer on his lips he pulled back the "bow" with his full strength. We might say that he didn't use a bow. No, he didn't use a physical bow, but the principle was the same. He pulled back the bow with his full strength, and the temple came down upon the idolatrous Philistines. He slew more of them at his death than he had killed in his lifetime. Today the Devil would like to blind our spiritual eyes and have us grind grain for the hordes of darkness. The world would like to see us fall and then make sport of us after we had become its prisoner, but if we walk with God we have a supernatural supply of His strength.

As Jesus hung on the cross and the brightness of the day was darkened with a veil of sorrow, the disciples deserted their Master. They had been taught of Him for three years; they had heard His prophecies of His own death; now the day of sacrifice had come, and they could not remain faithful. The hordes of hell had chased the Lord from the manger to the cross, and now their fiendish plan was consummated by the death of the Savior. Where were His follow-

ers? Where were they who said they would remain faithful and true? They were in a room with the doors locked; they were afraid of the Jews. They thought that they could not afford to expose themselves. After all, their leader was in the grave.

However, the grave loosed the Lord of Glory, and He walked again with those same disciples. Then He went away into heaven and sent the Holy Ghost to be their Comforter and source of power. When He came into their hearts on the day of Pentecost, they were no longer cowards hiding from their own shadows, but they received power to pull back the bow with full strength and shoot the arrow of faith into the camp of the enemy. Peter, who had once followed afar off and denied God, cursing when he declared that he had never known the God-man, came to the front and delivered the message which thrills yet today the hearts of true saints of God everywhere. He pointed his finger in the face of the hypocritical Pharisees, Sadducees, and Scribes and preached Jesus to them. "Him (Jesus) being delivered by the determined council and foreknowledge of God, ye have taken and by wicked hands have crucified and slain: whom God hath raised up, having loosed the pains of death: because it was not possible that he should be holden of it." (Acts 2:23, 24.)

It isn't easy to pull back the bow and shoot the enemy. It takes full strength. But as one writer has said, we haven't been invited to a frolic—but to a fight, a fight not against flesh and blood but against the powers and faces of darkness.

Must I be carried to the skies On flowery beds of ease, While others fought to win the prize And sailed through bloody seas.

Are there no foes for me to face Must I not stem the tide, Is this vile world a friend to grace To help me on to God.

Sure I must fight if I would win Increase my courage Lord. I'll bear the toil, endure the pain Supported by thy word.
