

we can observe nothing of the running after many things such as is happening in our day in the Biblical account of the early church in the Book of Acts. OFFICIAL STATEMENT OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE UNITED PENTECOSTAL CHURCH CONCERNING THE SO-CALLED LATTER RAIN OR NEW ORDER

We recognize, with heartfelt gratitude and thanks to God the latter rain outpouring of the Holy Spirit since the year 1901, with its accompanying signs and marvelous blessings from God and the subsequent truth and manifestations of such outpouring from God in the revelation of the absolute Deity of the name of Jesus and other truths that have been a part of such outpouring. Furthermore, we are in full accord with all scriptural and biblical teachings and progressive spiritual moves that harmonize completely with the Bible.

Ever since the outpouring of the Holy Spirit which began approximately 50 years ago, it has been necessary to guard against unscriptural excesses and fleshly manifestations which have led to unscriptural practices. We regret that such a move has become prominent in recent years and has brought controversy and division among those who are sincerely seeking a deeper place in God. This group refers to itself as the "latter rain" movement and among them are many clean and Godly men and women who have been earnestly seeking God for a deeper walk with Him. However, the scriptural pentecostal outpouring of the latter rain has been manifested from God for the past 50 years.

In considering our position with regard to this so-called latter rain movement we hereby state our disapproval of their teachings and practices as follows:

Doctrine

They do not accept nor regard the scriptural teaching on water baptism by immersion in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins nor the fullness of the Godhead in Jesus. See Acts 2:38; Colossians 2:9. In some instances they allow converts to choose their own formula of baptism. We do not accept any formula for water baptism except as recorded in Acts 2:38; 8:16; 10:48; and 19:5, which are fulfillments of Matthew 28:19.

Holiness

We do not believe that the Lord would bestow spiritual gifts upon those whose lives, reputations and characters are under reproach and who have been disfellowshipped by clean and good organizations and ministers. Some of those who are teaching and practicing the socalled latter rain and whose lives have been so corrupt that we have refused to fellowship them for years, are now leaders in this new order. Seemingly some of them take the attitude that the so-called "latter rain" will "cover all" without repentance and restitution.

Ministries and Gifts

The Bible clearly teaches that the Church is built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone. We reject the claim that the church today is built upon so-called present day apostles and prophets. "I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience, and how thou canst not bear them which are evil; and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars." Revelation 2:2.

We do not endorse the promiscuous laying on of hands for the bestowing of gifts. I Corinthians 12:11.

Organization

They are opposed to any form of general organization, both for ministers and churches, whereas the Bible clearly teaches in the fifteenth chapter of the Book of Acts that the Apostles called a conference or council of ministers who passed upon a most vital subject

and then sent forth their decrees or resolutions to the churches scattered abroad at that time. See also Acts 16:4-5.

We feel to admonish our brethren not to be misled by the claims of this new order but let us follow those things that make for peace and adhere to sound doctrine, and not be upset by so-called prophecies, tongues and interpretations and by those who claim they are apostles and prophets and are not. See Revelation 2:2.

The Pentecostal Outpouring


Message given over Radio Station KOLE, Port Arthur, Texas, on January 1, 1950, by Pastor A. T. Morgan of Faith Tabernacle, during the Pentecostal Jubilee Celebration at Faith Tabernacle January 1-3, inclusive.

In October, 1900, Rev. Charles F. Parham procured a building in Topeka, Kansas, for the purpose of conducting a Bible School. The building was known to the people of Topeka as the "Stone Mansion" or "Stone's Folly" because it had been patterned after an English castle and the builder, Mr. Stone, having failed to "count the full cost" was unable to finish it in the style planned.

The one and only purpose of the school was to fit men and women to go to the ends of the earth and preach "The Gospel of the Kingdom," Matthew Chapter 24, to every creature. The school was given the name of "Bethel College."

An invitation was extended to all ministers and Christians to attend the school regardless of their church affiliation. The only requirement was that anyone attending must be willing to forsake all and enter the school willing to trust God for all material needs. The school was opened for business with forty men and women enrolled as students. Bible was the only textbook and Brother Parham, who was a former Methodist minister, was the very capable teacher. The classes went along fine and the subjects of Repentance, Con-Consecration, Sanctification, Healing, and the Second Coming of the Lord were covered - and examinations were given. However, during the periods of study a great question had arisen in the class—"What about the second chapter of the Book of Acts?"

Many religious groups claimed different proofs as the evidence of the Baptism of the Holy Ghost, just as they do now, but the second, the tenth, the nineteenth chapters of the Book of Acts and other passages in the New Testament constituted an altogether different thing from the accepted teaching of the day—

"speaking with other tongues as the Spirit gave the utterance." Mr. Parham was obliged to leave the school for a three-day appointment in Kansas City, charging the students to give the subject careful study with much prayer. This they did during his absence. When

Mr. Parham returned, he called the class together, questioned each one, and found that each of them had the same conviction—"speaking with tongues was the Bible evidence of the baptism of the Holy Ghost."

The students and about seventy-five others had gathered for a Watch Night Service, December 31, 1900. A mighty spiritual power filled the entire school and the presence of God was felt in a mighty way. At 10:00 o'clock on the morning of January 1, 1901, Sister Agnes N. Osman (now LaBerge) asked that Brother Parham lay hands upon her to receive the Holy Spirit. Brother Parham at first did not know what to do as he had not had any supernatural evidence of the Holy Ghost baptism in his own life but finally laid hands upon her and began to pray. He had scarcely uttered many sentences of prayer when the glory of God fell upon her and she began speaking in another language and was unable to speak her own language (English) for three days. For several days this meeting continued and the group tarried and waited upon God. They were wonderful days of marvelous blessing from God—twelve ministers who were in the school of different religious denominations were filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke with other tongues. Brother Parham, seeing the mighty manifesta-tion of God, fell to his knees, promising God that he would dare to be different and declare this mighty truth to the

of the word of God since that time.

whole world if the Lord would fill him with His wonderful Holy Spirit. The power of God fell on him and he was baptized with the Holy Ghost and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit gave him utterance.

The mighty manifestation of God was noised abroad and a great revival broke out which spread far and wide and soon reached the state of Texas. On Easter Sunday, 1905, this message was preached for the first time in Texas in the town of Orchard. The school now having been discontinued in Topeka, Mr. Parham moved to Houston and started a school there at 503 Rusk Street. Rev. Howard A. Goss, the General Superintendent of the United Pentecostal Church, was associated with this school and Brother Parham at that time. The Lord blessed this undertaking in a wonderful way and a mighty revival broke out, God filling many souls with the Baptism of the Holy Ghost with the Bible evidence of speaking with other tongues.

The first anniversary of the entrance of the Pentecostal message into Texas was celebrated with a convention at Orchard, Texas, on April 14-15, 1906. Several hundred people were present at this gathering and about twenty-seven workers were ordained to the ministry. Many of the workers returned together from this gathering and were to change trains at Alvin, Texas, for Houston and other points. As the train was speeding along on its journey, the mighty showers of Pentecost fell and by the time it reached Alvin, twelve persons had been gloriously filled with the baptism of the

Holy Ghost speaking in other tongues—among them was our General Superintendent, Brother Howard A. Goss. It was an experience never-to-be forgotten. God was working and moving in mighty power.

From Houston, Brother W. J. Seymour, a former Baptist minister, who attended Mr. Parham's school, was sent by Mr. Parham to assist Lucy Farrow in the work in Los Angeles, California. In the year of 1906, it centered in an old building on Azuza St. Ministers and evangelists gathered in Los Angeles from every section of the United States and Canada, and missionaries returned from the foreign fields to learn more about this marvelous visitation from God. Being hungry for more of God, many of those who came were filled with the Holy Ghost. From here it spread throughout the whole earth, penetrating even into the heathen darkness of India, Africa, China, and the Isles of the Seas, thus fulfilling the great commission of

our Lord: "... go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." The 20th Century outpouring of the Holy Ghost from God was in full swing.

With the outpouring of the Holy Ghost, the word of God became a new book. Truths which had been hidden in its pages for many years were made clear. In the year 1914 came the marvelous revelation of the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. This great truth of the absolute Deity of Jesus Christ and baptism in His name became tenets of faith among a large group of these people. At this point the Pentecostal movement divided into two camps, one group maintaining that baptism was to be administered in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost as recorded in Matthew 28:19, and that God was a Trinity—three separate and distinct personalities; while the other group maintained that baptism was to be administered in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, according to Acts 2:38 and other scriptures, which is a fulfillment of Matthew 28:19. The latter group also maintained that Jesus Christ was none other than God manifested in the flesh. He was the one true God with three manifestations as Father, Son and Holy Ghost. God has marvelously confirmed this message as the Cospel in its fullness has been preached. The power which was hidden in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ began to be revealed in all its glory. Literally thousands were rebaptized into the name of Jesus Christ and multitudes received the baptism of (Continued on page 13)

It has been the aim of the United Nations to place Jerusalem under a U. N. trusteeship council. This, of course, has been opposed by the new state of Israel. Recently at a tense session of the Israeli Parliament Premier David Ben-Gurion proclaimed Jerusalem as its national capital in defiance of the United Nations decision to internationalize the Holy City. The Israeli government will set up headquarters in the "new city" of Jerusalem. The intention is to move most of the Israeli government activities from the present capital Tel Aviv. Premier Ben-Gurion bitterly attacked the U. N. decision to place Jerusalem under the trusteeship council and said "We cannot lend ourselves to enforced separation from Jerusalem, violating without reason or need the historic natural right of the people of Zion. As for the state of Israel, there always has been and always will be one capital -Jerusalem the eternal. So it has been for the past 3,000 years and so it will be, we believe, until the end of time." Thus events of the latter days shape up more and more with prophecy concerning Jerusalem being fulfilled.

The editor of a small weekly newspaper in a certain Nevada town was in need of some material to fill up his columns, so he had his compositor set up the Ten Commandments and he ran them without making any editorial comment. Three days after the paper was published, he received a letter saying, "Cancel my subscription. You're getting too personal." -From Christian Victory

The Catholic press has vigorously tried to subdue the allegation that any official sanction of the persecution of Protestants in Spain has been given. As late as January 1, 1948, their officially approved magazine El Iris de Paz, under the caption "Moral Guidance," asked the question: "Is it lawful to enter into the chapels or meeting places of Protestants or any other propagators of false doctrines, with the sole idea of distributing and of destroying the furni-ture and other articles?" The answer given: "As regards destroying furniture and other articles . . . that have a heretical significance, such as Protestant Bibles, prayer books . . . employed in their sacrilegious rites . . . it would not be unjust to deprive them of the object for which they are designed, even if it meant destroying them . . ." This is from Prophecy Monthly. Editor's Note: Religious persecution in Spain has been played down to the American public for obvious reasons. There are many that would like to see the government of Spain receive official recognition by the Governments of the Western Hemisphere in entirety. We hear a great deal about tolerance, etc., but we cannot conceive that the above is in any way tolerant of those who have a conviction and belief on the proper way to worship God. In Spain evidently you are a Catholic - - - or else - - -.

Richard Barbour, a public school official of San Diego, made a special study of comic book publications and reveals the fact, as quoted in "Christian Century," that of the 730,000,000 books tury." printed in the United States last year, 720,000,000 were of the comic nature. This means that 72 out of every 73 books was a comic. Mr. Barbour further discovered that some stores stock as many as 600 different titles of comics.

It was recently reported that the liquor interests have "Alaska by the throat" and a drive is on aimed at kindling antiliquor campaigns in every Alaskan community. Dr. Mark A. Dawber, co-executive secretary of the Home Missions Council of North America, returned recently as head of a four-man commission appointed by Secretary of the Interior Krug to study native prob-lems in Alaska. He said that with the launching of such a campaign, Alaskan churches might "lose some of the most influential members," but they would gain the respect of right-thinking peo-

A recent opinion given by the Arkansas Attorney General's office in Little Rock, Arkansas, held that hymn singing in public schools, instruction in any creed, or the assignment of Bible verses for memorization would be a violation of the state constitution. Assistant Attorney General Jeff Duty said that "religious instruction" was prohibited, but that teachers are directed by a 1930 law to "read the Bible without comment and that some prayers or the Lord's Prayer may be recited. He said that although teachers could read from the Bible, they could make no comments on the reading. Moreover, he said that pupils may not be required to attend the reading. It is gratifying that the Bible can at least be read in public schools.

America's total debts - private and public—stood at a record \$429,400,000,-000 level at the start of 1950 after a 12 month climb of \$14,000,000,000. That would be over \$2,875 indebtedness for each man, woman and child in this country. A staggering total indeed.

Protestantism in Czechoslovakia is thriving despite Communist restrictions. The Slovak Lutheran Church, largest of the older Protestant denominations in that country, has 430,000 members including adherents in the Czech regions, according to recent census figures. This is a gain of 23,000 over the 407,000 reported in 1930. Membership in the Church of Czech Brethren, second largest of the older Protestant groups, has grown from 299,000 in 1930 to 337,358. The church has 225 pastorates, 30 subordinate parishes, and 311 preaching stations.

JAPAN CALLING

LEONARD W. COOTE, San Antonio, Texas

On October 4, 1913, I arrived in Japan. I was 22 years of age and employed by the world known firm of Lever Brothers, Limited. I had never come in touch with anything of the full gospel movement in any shape or form, and had not read, heard, nor had ever been in-

fluenced by any kind of holiness teaching. After a striking conversion in my bedroom due to my inability to tear the Bible to pieces, I vowed an absolute obedience to it in its entirely, and it was not long before I was filled with the Pentecostal baptism of the Spirit.

Only two ways opened up to me. I was either to be a very nominal Christian and plunge into business with earnest ambitions to make my way in life, or to throw everything of this nature overboard and become an aggressive witness for Christ. I followed the latter course, and by giving out tens of thousands of tracts, preaching on the streets nightly, I soon had three mission halls at one and the same time. Obeying the Lord about Matthew, chapter 6, "lay not up for yourselves treasures on earth," I sent my entire savings to practically every missionary country in the world.

Strange though it may seem, I did not feel that God would call me to Japan, but rather I had a tremendous burden for the Belgium Congo and three days before I received the distinct call "Japan and Pentecost until Jesus Comes" even had my bags packed to go to that land. Not knowing any church organization or group of people that would stand by me, I am amazed now as I remember how confidently I stepped out on the promises of God.

We spent a week in seeking directions from the Lord. His call was for me to leave the language alone for a period and so I desperately sought His face by spending eight hours a day in prayer until God baptized Japanese in the Holy Ghost. Outside of one, here or there, there had not been any general outpouring whatsoever. I offered to give Brother and Sister Gray (who were then in charge of the Yokohama work) an every night campaign "until the power fell." Praying most of the day, we conducted a tarrying service every night until God sent the old-time power of the Holy Ghost with signs following. It came in eight weeks, and including the various churches where God led me to have shorter campaigns, 250 received the glorious baptism of the Holy Ghost. Opposition arose from the headquarters of the trinity work in America, so that again I had to step out in faith and start my own "oneness" work.

Again, in Yokohama, Tokyo, Osaka

Again, in Yokohama, Tokyo, Osaka and neighboring towns and cities the power of the Holy Ghost descended and many were swept into the Kingdom of God. The need arose for a training school for native workers as God con-

stantly laid on my heart that He had called me not to one city, or one district but to "Japan." The great Japanesse earthquake that destroyed the cities of Yokohama and Tokyo with a staggering death toll of 100,000 souls revealed the reality of our message. Other missionaries were wounded, their workers killed, but not one Oneness missionary, worker, man, woman, boy or girl was killed or even wounded because the name of Jesus is a strong tower, into which the righteous run and are safe.

On the first anniversary of the Japanese earthquake \$1,000 was received from a stranger which proved that it was now time to build the headquarters of the Oneness work in Japan, now known as Japan Apostolic Mission. Here stands today eight major buildings, all protected again from the bombing in World War II. The value of this property, without any mortgage, is around \$80,000.00. It is another monument to the power of the Word of God.

Pearl Harbor came as a great shock to us all. The Coote family were in San Antonio, Texas, endeavoring to give the young members nourishment for depleted bodies, and arrangements had been made for Brother Coote's return to Japan. The Spirit twice hindered Brother Coote by a definite warning, which had he not listened to, would have meant the loss of his life as in the early days of the war long articles about his being a spy of the British and the American Governments were printed in the newspapers in Japan.

After the war, late in the summer of 1948, concern was felt about Brother Coote going to Japan on an observation visit. A lady, to that time a stranger to us all, gave \$2,000 earmarked for a flying visit to Japan. Thus all the expenses of this visit were made without taking anything from any other fund. It is impossible to describe the full conditions. Two outstanding matters were seen (1)That the disaster of Pearl Harbor was, in a way, one of the greatest blessings to Japan. It had brought them to their knees; they had now lost faith in their idols, forms of religion, and in their Emperor, and they were turning to God and to Christianity, in a way that could not be exaggerated. The disaster of war was still a calamity, however, as Christians were scattered, and the moveable furniture in all buildings on the Bible School Campus and Missionary Headquarters was gone, stolen by the Japanese at the outbreak of the war.

(2) The greatest opportunity that ever presented itself to the Church in any age now presented itself to us Oneness Pentecostal people. Not a scratch had been made on any of the buildings by falling bombs, and the Japanese Government had been instructed by the headquarters of General MacArthur to put every building in tip-top shape. Missionaries and Christians were being besieged for the Word of God. Hundreds were being filled with the Holy Ghost. An outstanding brother, named Brother Murai (I remember him twenty years ago when he resisted the working of the Spirit, and refused to accept the speaking with other tongues) was now filled with the Spirit of God and had received the message of the Oneness of the Godhead in Jesus. I consulted with him for many hours on my recent visit and the joy that came over us as we talked over our message cannot be placed on paper. He had been disfellowshipped by the Trinity brethren for his belief in the Oneness message, and had been praying for a Bible Training School for the spread of this Gospel throughout the length and breadth of Japan.

Those who have watched events in the Far East feel that this is Japan's and the Church's golden opportunity. If we go in now it is possible that Japan in turn will become the MISSIONARY COUNTRY of the next few years, evangelizing China, and other Asiatic countries. If we fail God now, the reverse might become true, and Japan may be swept by Communism, and become a worse menace than ever before by combining with Red China and Russia against America. What a challenge is ours NOW.

DOES THIS STIR YOU?

While some countries are closing, Japan is open like it never was before. Their defeat has changed things completely, their Emperor worship is gone and they are looking for a new God—let us tell them about Jesus the God "whose years shall not fail." General MacArthur says, "PERHAPS ONLY ONCE IN A THOUSAND YEARS, IS AN ENTIRE NATION LIKE JAPAN READY IN A SINGLE GENERATION TO FORSAKE ITS RELIGION AND ACCEPT ANOTHER." The Roman Catholic Church is sending hundreds of priests and nuns to Japan, while we, the United Pentecostal Church, have one missionary—only one with his feet on Japanese soil that we can claim

as ours. I refer to W. J. Nukida, an American born Japanese from Idaho. Brother Coote hopes to go soon and possibly take others with him, but at present, we have but one. United Pentecostal Church—let us awake and pray as never before for Japan, and for God to send forth laborers into that vineyard before it is too late. Christian workers, Ministers, — why not consider Japan in your prayers and consecration? Missionaries, whose land of calling has been closed and you have been crowded out, why not consider Japan and ask the Almighty if He would have you go there. Time is failing; the harvest is almost past, the SUMMER is almost ended, and maybe Japan is one of our last chances to witness and glean for the Master ere the day is done. Pray for Japan.

Greetings in the precious name of Jesus. You have encouraged us so much to build up the Tokyo church and we surely appreciated your sending the Christmas boxes for the Japanese.

I am sorry to say that we could not have tent meetings in Majayama as Brother Ohoka was ill. However, God is working among them and adding to the church daily such as should be saved. I went there recently and after a very pleasant meeting with Brother Ohoka God really began to move. I baptized a bridegroom in the early morning in the name of Jesus, and then had a wedding ceremony. After this a Holiness woman was seeking God and she was baptized with the Holy Ghost. At the service that same night at the church a man was baptized with the Holy Ghost and spoke in tongues. The next morning, Brother Ohoka was able to go with me to Iwade.

Three women were waiting for us to seek for the Holy Ghost and God wonderfully filled each one of them. In the afternoon we went down to the river and baptized 7 women in the name of Jesus. At night two girls received the baptism of the Holy Spirit at the altar service. The next morning a sick women, 62 years old, asked me to come and pray with her that she might receive the Holy Ghost. God wonderfully filled her and she spoke with tongues. The blessing of God was so real that a woman who lived next door also prayed through and God baptized her also with His Spirit. We also visited a woman in the hospital and after praying for her God wonderfully filled her with the Spirit. That night we returned to Majayama.

On the next Sunday morning a girl received the Holy Ghost after service. In the afternoon we baptized a boy, two men and four women in the name of Jesus. One of the men was a teacher who had been convicted by the power of God in a wedding service. The next morning, Ohoka's mother and myself visited a sick man and prayed for him. This sick man's mother, who was an idolater, was convicted by God, repented of her sins and in about 15 minutes the Lord wonderfully filled her with the Holy Ghost. Praise the Lord! In many respects my health is much better than it was while I was in the Belgium Congo. It is much cooler and drier here although at present we are just entering the rainy season and in consequence I may not be able to leave for another distant part because the roads would be too boggy, with numerous huge puddles, etc., as you may guess it would be in these parts.

I have applied for a permit to practice dentistry but so far it has not yet come to hand. There is no regular "door of utterance" open to me except that a small group of "Apostolic" brethren asked me to give a word on two occasions while at their meetings. There are a few of them who need water baptism. Whether they will ask me to minister this rite to them I don't know at present, although I have spoken to them about it. Of course personal work dealing with one or two or small groups is the work that is often at hand. D. L. Moody has said that if the world is to be won for Christ it must be done on the one by one principle. Every believer should be a soul winner.

Recently, I received the "Pentecostal Herald" and I enjoyed reading it very much.

At one of the meetings recently, one young Afrikander stood up to pray; he broke into tears crying out between his sobs that God would make him more like Jesus. Oh, how I was blessed in my soul. 

WE CAN DO ALL THINGS THROUGH CHRIST

I Will Go, Sir

The title of this message has been taken from the chapter of Matthew, and concerns the parable of "the two sons." Obviously, the design and teaching

of the parable brings us a challenge that sinded as the first Daniel is to think of lions and a dungeon, but before these we associate him with a prayer closet where he lifted his voice toward heaven three times daily. He was not ignorant concerning the plot against his life. He knew of the decree against his praying to Jehovah. He was fully aware of the penalty that must be paid for disobeying the king. YET, HE PRAYED. And thus, he was cast into the den of lions. He reached his objective in this particular phase of his life. This objective was to prove that God was able to close the mouths of the lions and set him free from death. We would never have known that God could do it if Daniel had said, "I go, sir, but went not." Being a servant of God, he was dependable and trustworthy, full of courage and zeal. He was out to prove the power of his God, so he said, "I will

go," AND HE WENT.

We would have never heard of the wonderful story that surrounds the eventful lives of those three Hebrew boys whose names were Shadrach, Meshack, and Abednego unless they had decided to denounce the King's command, and be fearlessly thrown into the fiery furnace. If the same challenge and decision were placed before us in this day, it is likely that we would have more courage and boldness to face the same, just because these three boys proved to the world that it could be done. Faith and courage are accumulative and increase through the years because of those who leave behind a record of their experiences. "I had fainted, unless I had believed to see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living." Psalms 27:13.

It is fairly easy to reveal to others our intentions and determinations for the future. It is easy to say, "I will go," until we hear the roar of the lions, and feel the heat of the flame. Then, often-times, we find our faith bewildered and our courage gone. But, blessed is that man who says, "I WILL," and unfalter-ingly carries his challenge to the end.

Such a man was the Apostle Paul! His first acquaintance with Jesus came as he was lying on the dusty road that led to Damascus. He was positive that the light from heaven that smote him to the ground was dealt to him from the hand of the Lord, for he asks, "Who art thou, Lord? What would you have me to do?" We envy not the life of Paul or his experience for they belong to him, but we pray that we can finish our life with the words of his final testimony. We can only do this if we say, "I WILL GO, SIR," and mean it.

In speaking of notable characters that went far beyond the mere profession of religion, we cannot help but think of Stephen. He was the first martyr of the New Testament church. He proved his worth to God, the Bible, and to the world by his deeds. He was stoned to death because he dared to preach the truth. We would never have known the unselfishness and glory that comes from being a martyr for the Lord Jesus Christ if this man had recanted when he beheld the angry mob. Thank God for his un-shakeable faith. He endured the contradictions of the mob, which finally turned into stones hurled at his defenseless head. We now have the knowledge that if we are ever called upon to travel the same road as Stephen did, we will be assured of companionship, and looking up into heaven we may behold the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. And thus, another human soul took its flight to the realms of paradise escorted by the divine Spirit that created it. The import of such an experience is invaluable and beyond comprehension, yet is real and obtainable if we say, "Yes,

Lord, I will go," and mean it.

God is looking to and fro throughout the whole earth in search of those who are able to conquer. Such men as Daniel, Paul, the three Hebrew children, and Stephen are now dead. Their deeds and experiences are history. They prove to us WHAT GOD HAS DONE. We must prove to the people of our generation that what God has done, he is still doing. Our living for God will mean nothing if while we are living we do no proving. The young people of our day proving. The young people of our day are calling for proof, and the only proof that bespeaks of holiness, salvation, and hope is our lives. Let your life be con-secrated as an altar to the Lord. "Let your lights so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your father which is in heaven." May this be the day when the entire group of PENTECOSTAL CONQUERORS throughout the world shall say no to the devil, and yes to the will of God, to say, "I WILL GO," and mean it!

An example is the product of genuine Christianity and is a guide and inspiration to others. It is a noble ambition, not to be first, but to be the best among the good. Paul, the loving missionary,

realized that youthfulness is not a disability in doing good, and wrote these words to Timothy, a comparatively young man: "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (I Timothy 4:12).

Paul was telling Timothy, his son in the gospel, that he should be an example and so act as to win the esteem and respect of all people. Let us now consider these words of exhortation given to this hoice young man for they will be of great benefit to us.

WORD (speech): It is a much needed, though many times an absent, thing for the young minister to not only deliver edifying messages, but to be an example in his everyday speech. If the message is not backed up by a good life, it will do very little good, and one is tearing down with one hand what he is building up with the other. An undesirable tendency in youth is to exaggerate in speech, and here there is a grave danger in that mere playfulness many times becomes misrepresentation. Young ministers must realize that from the heart are the issues of life, and one's speech is the index to his character. Jesus declared that a tree is known by the fruit it bears. One's words are the fruit of one's lips whether they are good or bad.

CONVERSATION (conduct): It is absolutely possible and proper for the young minister to so act and behave himself as to gain the respect and admiration of both the church and the world for his office and work. Not only the young minister, but all Christians are obligated to so act at home, in the church, and in all social relationships as to merit this respect.

CHARITY (love): It perhaps will seem that no comment is needed on this subject, but many things could and need to be written about this great theme, though space limits comment here. The world is in desperate need of believers who will dare to be examples in charity. Many times you, no doubt, have heard the statement, "We want a revival of power," but it is obvious that we will not have a revival of power until we have a revival of love. Why? Because God and love are inseparable. John wrote, ". . . God is love" (I John 4:8). One cannot say, "I have enough of God, but I have not enough of His love." If there were more good examples of love, there would be more faithful servants. Jesus declared, ". . . If a man love me, he will keep my words" (John 14:23).

SPIRIT (attitude): The spirit that animates us will make itself evident in word and action. Every Christian should cultivate and develop a right and becoming spirit. In many instances when obstacles are encountered, the right

attitude is the secret of success and triumph. Think of Joseph who was acted against, envied and hated by his brethren, sold to foreigners, made a slave, falsely accused, thrown into prison; but was made victorious because he kept the right spirit.

It was once said of Caleb, a courageous man, after his spying out the Land of Canaan and bringing back a good report, ". . . He had another spirit with him . ." (Numbers 14:24). Why was Caleb so courageous and successful? Because he had the right spirit.

A courageous example is contagious. Think of Paul when he, after having fasted and prayed, stepped forth to encourage the men on a storm-tossed ship. His courage was contagious. When he became encouraged, others became encouraged with him. If the true believers will be examples in "spirit," they will find others smiling with them.

Christ is our supreme example. He manifested a kindly spirit in every act of His life. When he was mistreated, rebuffed, and smitten, He did not retaliate as many so-called Christians do, but had quiet self-possession.

FAITH: Timothy was admonished by Paul to be an example in faith. That is, not merely the profession, but the possession of the Christian faith. It is true that faith begets faith and faith is cultivated by use and exercise. Many older believers have great faith by virtue of the fact that they have had that faith developed by many years of consistent Christian living. However, it is possible and proper for the youth to be examples in faith too.

PURITY (holiness): The young minister should cultivate deep spiritual experiences of the spiritual life. The believer who is an example in "purity" will be found pure in thought, word, intention, action, and in character. Not only will he be found pure in the church, but in his relationship with others, even when he is not aware of others watching. Purity of motive will be manifested in consistency of holy action.

The young as well as the old may be an example for good, and so be an encouragement to the young and old. An example of youthful fidelity is an inspiration to many. Therefore, may we submit to the ability of Christ and permit Him to make us good examples.

the Holy Ghost while in the water. Great numbers have been healed of all kinds of diseases, demons have been cast out and other mighty works done as were accomplished in the days of the Apostles, all through the name of JESUS. In many cities where this message has gone, the report of the Samaritan revival has been duplicated. "But when they believed Philip's preaching the things concerning the Kingdom of God, and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized both men and women" - Acts 8:12.

The number of those who believed the full Pentecostal message grew rapidly, and it was soon realized that in order to properly reach the world with this great latter day revealed gospel message, "... how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; and that He was buried, and that He arose that He was buried, and that He alose again the third day according to the scriptures:" (I Corinthiam: 15:74) and that God -- "... now commandeth all men everywhere to repent:" (Acts 17:30): -- "... and be baptized everywhere to repent the man of Tanas Christ one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and . . . receive the gift of the Holy Ghost." (Acts 2:38), it was necessary to have a proper basis of cooperation and fellowship.

During the early half of this century various groups were organized. Among them were two of the major bodies believing in and standing for the "oneness" message, and known as The Pentecostal Church, Inc., and The Pentecostal As-semblies of Jesus Christ, Inc. They became so closely associated in doctrine and fellowship that in 1944 steps were begun to unite the two bodies into one organization and in September, 1945, in St. Louis, Missouri, this merger took place and the united body became known as the United Pentecostal Church, Inc. The purpose of this united body was to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ; to publish and distribute religious literature; to establish new churches; to send forth missionaries; to perform any other duties connected with religious work, and to help in any way possible to meet the needs of local churches. How marvelously God has blessed this undertaking. At the present time there are some 2,500 ministers affiliated with this organization scattered throughout the world who are trying to "preach this gospel" to the uttermost parts of the earth.

To this end we now pledge our prayers, our faith, our life and love, our earthly means of support and our time in the fear of God and for His glory alone. May I close with this scripture found in James 5:7: "Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, until he re-ceive the early and latter rain."

The Kingdom of God

"For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost." Romans 14:17.

Christ's first coming to the earth was so utterly different than what the people in general had expected when their Messiah would come that they rejected Him. The religious leaders of the day, known as Scribes, Pharisees and Elders, expected a Messiah to come, of course. Their version of the coming Messiah was that a great Monarch would come to the earth with great splendor, pomp and glory and in a magnificent manner. He would live in some magnificent palace and ride in a great chariot drawn by many teams of horses; He would overthrow the hated yoke of Rome, make Palestine the greatest nation in the world, restore the former glories of David and Solomon and give them all positions of respect and honor in the new kingdom. That was what they were hopefully looking for in their Messiah.

Even the Old Testament prophets were confused in many ways in their expectation of the Messiah. At times they would be inspired to write of His glory and exaltation; then again under the inspiration of the same Spirit, they would write of His suffering and humiliation. Isaiah, for instance, wrote on two oc-casions—In Isaiah 9:6, he told of the coming child which would be called the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father and the Prince of Peace and that of the increase of His government and peace there would be no end. He was to sit on the throne of David and establish it with judgment and justice even for-ever. Again Isaiah writes under the influence of the same Spirit in Isaiah chapter 53 of a coming Messiah who would be humiliated, despised, rejected and led as a lamb to the slaughter which before her shearers is dumb. Doubtless time and time again these prophets asked themselves, "How can this Messiah be exalted and glorified; yet at the same time be humiliated and suffer the things that we have written about Him.' They did not understand that His king dom was to be a SPIRITUAL KING-DOM and not a Material Kingdom.

When Jesus came, born in obscurity in a lowly manger, reared in dire poverty and coming forth from that little insignificant country of Nazareth, the foster son of an almost unknown carpenter named Joseph, the Pharisees and Scribes would not believe that He was their king even though events proved that He was. "Look at Him" they must have declared. "He Himself confesses that the birds have their nests and the foxes their holes, but He does not even have a place to lay His head. He doesn't ride upon some spirited horse of war; but rather upon the lowly ass. When our Messiah comes He shall come with great pomp and glory."

Jesus so completely evolutionized the theories of His day that they rejected Him. The Master plainly and emphatically declared that His kingdom was not of the world. He again stated that His kingdom came not with observation; but rather that His kingdom was a spiritual kingdom which would be set

up in the hearts of men and women. Its headquarters would not be in some far away embassy building, but rather would be in the hearts and lives of men and women. He stressed that if a man through the power of this kingdom in his life could rule himself, he was far greater than he that took a city by violent force. His kingdom was a spiritual kingdom whose power was in the Holy Ghost.

Even His disciples could not fully comprehend Him—one of the last questions they asked Him before He ascended after His resurrection was "Lord when wilt thou restore the kingdom of Israel?" After the Day of Pentecost they did not ask any such questions. Then they knew definitely that they had the kingdom IN them which was greater than any force that was in the world. They had received the baptism of the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in unknown tongues. When Jesus comes into a life, He will announce His arrival by speaking through that one in unknown tongues.

One of the religious leaders of the day came to the Master by night, namely Nicodemus. Jesus promptly informed him that he could not join His kingdom; nor could he reform and get into it; but it was a spiritual kingdom and that he must be born of the water and of the spirit to enter in. "For by one spirit are we all baptized into one body." Peter carried out the formula for being "born again" very precisely on the day of Pentecost when he gave the orders to the multitude to repent and be baptized every one of them in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins and they too would receive the Holy Ghost and get into the Kingdom of God.
