#### QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

One of the methods used in Sunday School teaching is that of questions and answers. It is commonly called the co-operative because both the teacher and the class take part. This is an interesting way to present and remember information. In radio, many quiz broadcasts gather and hold the attention of large listening audiences through this same medium. You may be surprised and enlightened to note how often this method of imparting spiritual truth is found throughout the Bible.

#### WHERE DID GOD COME FROM ???

Question: Where did God come from is a question often asked.

Answer: . "The Lord came from Sinai ." Deuteronomy 33:2; "God came from ." Habakkuk 3:3. These passages, without reference to their texts, are usually given as the scriptural answers to prove that the Bible says where God came from. These verses referred to above are undoubtedly, symbolic, and are not to be taken literally. Moses merely means that, Sinai is the mount of revelation, which was the starting point where God began to manifest himself to the Israelites and came to abide in their midst. Teman, also, is used as a figure of speech; Teman means, "on the right hand." Paran was a mountain range between Sinai and Seir. Apparently these verses picture the presence of Jehovah as beginning at Sinai and accompanying Israel through Teman. Therefore, the scripture speaks of the manifestation of the presence of the Lord God as coming from Sinai, and from Teman. (In some instances in the bible, the word Teman seems to be used synonomous with Edom.)

#### DID JOB PASS HIS EXAMINATION???

Question: "I will demand of thee, and answer thou me." (Job 38:I-3)

Answer: "I uttered that I understood not; things too wonderful for me, which I know not." (Job 42:I-5)

Job's answer is interesting; he confesses that he has talked out of turn. He admits speaking of things which he did not understand. In this, he is not alone, for the human family is much alike. How often we speak when we ought to be silent. The lesson which the Lord taught Job is very revealing. In rapid machinegun fashion "eighty-five questions" are fired at Job. These questions are record-

ed in the 38th, 39th, 40th, and 41st chapters of the book of Job. As we read these same questions today our head swims; and his answer becomes ours, "things too wonderful for me." The simple truth is the Lord is instructing him. Although Job may not have passed the examination, HE DID LEARN HIS LESSON OF HUMILITY, and in the end the blessings of the Lord were doubled to him.

### WHAT WAS THE LORD GOD'S FIRST QUESTION ???

Question: "Where art thou?" — Genesis 3:9.

Answer: According to the record, this is the first question ever asked the first man recorded in the first book of the bible. This first question, "Where art thou," takes on added significance when it is compared to the second question which the Lord asked Cain sometime later, "Where is Abel thy brother?" Genesis 4:9. The importance of these two questions is ENORMOUS when christians today realize, "THEY ARE THEIR BROTHER'S KEEPER." It is our duty to witness and work for Christ. Souls are at stake. To answer this first question rightly, "man must find himself—in the will of God."

Only then can the second question be answered correctly. By the concern we have for others, to the extent of "finding our brother." It is no accident that these two questions are placed as they are in the scriptures. So let us all be true to ourselves and to God, that we may be faithful soul-wirfners.

### WHO SHALL ABIDE IN THY TABERNACLE ???

Question: "Lord, who shall abide in Thy tabernacle? Who shall dwell in Thy holy hill?—Psalms 15:I.

Answer: The answer to these important questions is found in verses 2 to 5 of this same chapter. Yes, the answer is not left to guess work or personal opinions. The qualifications and requirements are herein stipulated in plain and positive language, that hardly needs interpretation.

- He that CONTINUES to walk uprightly.
- (2) His works are always RIGHTEOUS.
- (3) He tells the TRUTH always.
- (4) He does NOT talk behind one's back.
- (5) He does NO evil.
- (6) He NEVER harms anyone.
- (7) He DESPISES sin in anyone anywhere.
- (8) He HONORS and RESPECTS christians.
- (9) His WORD is good.
- (10) Money loaned WITHOUT usury.
- (11) He takes ADVANTAGE of None.
- (12) He cannot be BOUGHT, or bribed. The wonderful conclusion in verse 5 is, 'such a man will ABIDE FOREVER

with the Lord dwelling continually in his presence — **HE SHALL NEVER** (have to) **BE MOVED.** This is a comforting thought, don't you agree?

### WHAT SHALL I RENDER UNTO THE LORD FOR ALL HIS BENEFITS???

Question: This is a personal question, "What shall I render unto the Lord for all his benefits toward me?" — Psalms 116:12.

Answer: Here again the scripture clearly sets forth the answer in verses 13 and 14 of this same chapter. Surely everyone should be interested in the answer to this important question. It is VITAL to all because God's word here presents "God's will and desire" in this matter. Sometimes we sing,

"When I think of the goodness of Jesus, And all he has done for me;

My soul cries out, Hallelujah! Praise God for saving me."

This is all well and good, but we should take NOTE of the fact that here again the scriptures plainly points out what one can do in appreciation to him, "from whom all blessing's flow." To really and truly say, "Thank you Lord;" for all your benefits, the BIBLE presents the following answers:

1. "I will accept salvation." Do not reject the Lord, nor his saving plan. In believing and obeying you may be saved on the terms of the gospel. ONE SHOWS THEIR SINCERE APPRECIATION FOR SALVATION 'ONLY' WHEN THEY AC-CEPT IT!

2. "I will call on the name of the Lord." This is not duty, this is privilege of the HIGHEST HONOR. "Praise the Lord." Authority to use the greatest of ALL names; the name that is above every name, JESUS! This is how the scripture suggests our saying 'thank you.' Could anyone improve it? Christ has said, "if ye shall ask ANYTHING in my NAME, I will do it."—John 14:14.

3. "I will pay my vows." We say 'thank you' Jesus, by being thoroughly honest. Being true to ourselves and to God. Here is the bible saying, "make your word good." People are good, only as their word is good. "Owe no man anything"; St. Paul wrote in Romans 13:8. Thus, in this simple manner we again show our sincere appreciation to the LORD for ALL his BENEFITS toward us amen.

### HOW MANY HAIRS ON THE AVERAGE HUMAN HEAD???

Question: This question is often asked because of the statement of Jesus which is recorded in both Matt. 10:30 and Luke 12:7, saying, "the very hairs of your head are all numbered."

Answer: According to a scientific research, numerous attempts have been made to estimate the average number of hairs on the human head. It is estimated that the number of hairs on the average human head is about 110,000 or about 1,000 to the square inch of the scalp. Women have a greater number of hairs on their heads than men. When we think of the words of Christ, "the very hairs of your head are ALL numbered;" we feel to say, "Our God takes care of the smallest detail." IT IS AN ESTABLISHED FACT, Jesus knows all about us. We can cast all our care upon him, for He careth for us.

### THE ESSENTIALITY OF THE NAME OF "JESUS" IN BAPTISM

All through the ages past, it is a noticeable fact that God has demanded great respect and reverence for His NAME.

We have heard the statement, "What's in a name?" The very tone of such in referring to any subject under discussion involving the NAME of the Lord, is very irreverent. It could only be an expression of the unlearned or willingly ignorant.

When God began leading Israel out of Egypt, He never waited until He brought them to the promised land, but enroute He warned them that His "Angel was sent before them to keep them in the way." (Read Ex. 23:20-23). He warned them to, "Beware of Him and obey His voice, provoke Him not, for My name is in Him."

In the giving of the ten commandments, God said, "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain." (Ex. 20:7).

God introduced Himself to Moses and Israel by His glorious and wonderful name, "Jehovah," when He said to Moses, "I am the Lord, and I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my Name "Jehovah" was I not known unto them; Wherefore say unto the children of Israel, 'I am the Lord (Jehovah), and I will bring out and I will redeem you with a stretched out arm." (Ex. 6:3, 6).

The value of God's name is so great until He threatens those who dare to profane it. "If thou wilt not fear this glorious name, the Lord (or Jehovah) thy God; then the Lord (Jehovah) will make thy plague wonderful." (Deut. 28:58, 59).

David said, "And they that know Thy Name, will put their trust in Thee." (Psa. 9:10). And Isaiah declared, "Make mention that His name is exalted." (Isa. 12:4)


Solomon encouraged us by saying, "The Name of the Lord is a strong tower; the righteous runneth into it, and is safe." (Prov. 18:10). And the prophet Zechariah speaking of Christ setting up His earthly kingdom, said, "And the Lord (Jehovah) shall be king over all the earth: in that day shall there be One Lord, and His Name One." (Zech. 14:9).

The Apostle James acknowledged in Acts 15:14, how that God did visit the Gentiles, "to take out of them a people for His Name." To this agreed Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist, when he said, "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel; for He hath visited and redeemed His people." (Luke 1:68). The angel of the Lord that appeared unto Joseph, also confirmed it by saying, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call His Name Jesus: for He shall save His people from their sins." (Matt. 1:21). The very Name of Jesus, means Jehovah-Saviour, or Jehovah who saves.

To this agreed the prophet Isaiah, and repeated by Matthew (1:23), "Behold a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call His Name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, 'God with us'".

Jesus, in His prayer in John 17:6, said, "I have manifested Thy Name unto the men which Thou gavest me out of the world." He had also stated in John 5:43, "I am come in My Father's Name and ye receive Me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive."

How could it be possible for those men whom Jesus acknowledged had witnessed the manifestation of God's Name, be mistaken in the manner in which they obeyed His command, "That repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His Name? (Luke 24:47). Surely they knew



what was the name of the Father, for He taught them to pray, saying. "Our Father, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name." (Matt. 6:9).

Every reference of Christian baptism, or everything it symbolizes, points us to Jesus, the One that died and was buried

and rose again. To be identified with Him, to be buried with Him in baptism, is the least one could expect to do to walk with Him. There is no other way to reach God or find God. "For whosoever shall call upon the Name of the Lord shall be saved." (Rom. 10:13).

"Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other Name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." (Acts 4:12). In the preceding verse (11), the Apostle emphasized that the Name of Jesus, was the "stone, set at naught of the builders." This is proven because of the question he was answering in verse 7, "By what Name have ye done this?"

In James 5:14, we find definite instructions regarding prayer for the sick among us. All holiness and Pentecostal movements or groups have laid great stress on this verse, and we all believe it, because it is the inspired Word of God. Let us notice this verse very closely, "Is any sick among you? let him call for the elders of the church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the Name of the Lord." This is exactly the same words and language we read in Acts 10:48. "And he commanded them to be baptized in the Name of the Lord." If you anoint the sick in the name of the Lord, which is Jesus ("Ye shall lay hands on the sick, in My Name") why try to avoid the truth and the true meaning of God's Word in the matter of baptizing in the Name of the Lord?

You can never claim the cleansing of His blood, without accepting and believing on His Name. The blood is in His Name. "Whosoever believeth in Him shall not perish," (John 3:16 also 18) "Because he believeth on the Name of the only begotten Son of God." "And that believing, ye might have Life through His Name." (John 20:31).


Why sing any longer, "Where He leads me I'll follow, and I'll go with Him all the way," and then refuse to bear His wonderful holy Name in baptism? Why try and debate the question and resent being "buried with Him in baptism," in His Name?

#### **OUR COVER**

W E are happy to present to our readers a picture of the First Pentecostal Church of Kilgore, Texas of which A. W. Buie is pastor. The church was erected on the same ground that was occupied by the former church which was completely destroyed by fire. The new church stands as a memorial of the courage and faith of Brother Buie and saints to overcome the loss of their church only to build a bigger and better church for the glory of God.

The exterior of this fine church is built completely of brick and has an overall dimension of 50 by 160 feet. The church proper stands 50 by 120 feet with a seating capacity of 750. Then the educational building that is attached to the church proper and forms a T at the rear has dimensions of 40 by 80 feet. There are 16 class rooms in the educational building with room on the second floor, that has already been framed in, for 24 more rooms making 40 class rooms in all. The value of the church property has been placed at \$125.000.

The first service was held in the church in the early part of June and dedication services were conducted in August of 1952 with A. T. Morgan, General Superintendent, preaching the dedicatory sermon. Several District Superintendents were present along with some 30 ministers for the grand occasion of dedicating this worthy church as a soul saving station that is capable of reaching some 100,000 people in the vicinity of Kilgore. May the Lord continue to bless this fine church.

# GIVING TO GOD

The words found in the twentieth chapter of the book of The Acts of Apostles and the thirty-fifth verse read like this: "I have shewed you all things, how that so labouring ye ought to support the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive." Also the words of Jesus recorded in Matthew 10:8 — "Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils: freely ye have received, freely give."

Truly God has given us many things to enjoy. Our homes, families, friends, health; yes, our very lives. They all belong to Him. "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and they that dwell therein." Psa. 24:1. God said "the silver is mine and the gold is mine." Haggai 2:8. We are told that "every good and perfect gift is from above coming down from the father of lights." Again in Acts 17:25—"Neither is worshipped with men's hands, as though he needed anything, seeing he giveth to all life, and breath, and all things." We should never take the blessings of the Lord for granted.

When we think of giving to God, we usually think of money, the love of which is the root of all evil. As we said, it is God's to start with, but He loves obedience on our part in giving to Him. Maybe you say, "I know where what I have came from; I worked for it." Have you considered that you could not have worked for it had not God allowed you to obtain the job and given you the health and strength to work? Deuteronomy 8:18 says, "But thou shalt remember Jehovah tlly God, for it is he that giveth thee power to get wealth." So, you see, we have nothing to boast of. It is all the blessing and goodness of God, and He can take it at will. "What hast thou that thou didst not receive?" I Cor. 4:7.

But there is much more that we owe to God. Money is the cheapest thing we can give Him. There is time, talents, and strength. In fact, all we have and all we are should be dedicated to God, to be used to His glory. On the grave of a certain man was this epitaph:

What I gave, I have, What I spent, I had, What I left, I lost By not giving it.

We should never think "how little can I get by with giving?" but, "how much can I give?" Our giving is to be cheerful, out of a heart of love. 2 Cor. 9:6. Some say, "Give 'til it hurts." Not hurting you to give, but until it can be felt. Ever try denying yourself of something in order to give more to God? Sacrificial giving is well-pleasing to God. Note what Paul says in 2 Cor. 8:3, "For to their power, I bear record, yea, and beyond their power they were willing of themselves."

I suppose there are a lot of church people who think that tithing is too much. Tithing was practiced under the Law of Moses, and before. We are under grace, or the law of Love, and more is required of us under this law than the old one. The first and great commandment is this: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with

all thine heart and with all thy soul and with all thy strength. Friend, if you love God that much, you won't be offended about the tithe. I don't believe we will stop with just the tithe; we will give more. If we do not love Him that much, there is something wrong with our religious experience.

Jesus said, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and dust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal. But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor dust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal; "WHY???" For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Matt. 6:19, 20. In another place we are told "We brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out."

We are to give, not expecting anything in return, or a reward in this life. Note Luke 14:12-14 — "When thou makest a dinner or a supper, call not thy friends, nor thy brethren, neither thy kinsmen, nor thy rich neighbors; lest they also bid thee again, and a recompense be made thee. (or it be returned) But call the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind: and thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just."

However, there are certain promises made to us who obey His commands. We are promised a prosperous life. "Honor the Lord with thy substance, and with the first-fruits of all thy increase: So shall thy barns be filled with plenty, and thy presses shall burst out with new wine." Prov. 3:9. Also, "Give and it shall be given to you" and "he which soweth bountifully shall reap also bountifully." (or sparingly) You notice that we reap according to the amount that we sow.

Consider these also: "He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the Lord; and that which he hath given will he repay him again." "Cast thy bread upon the waters; for thou shalt find it again after many days." So, you see, we do receive something in return, even in this life. This poem states it pretty well:

There are loyal hearts, there are spirits brave,

There are souls that are pure and true; Then give to the world the best that you have.

And the best shall come back to you.

Give love, and love to your heart will flow, A strength in your utmost need;

Have faith, and a score of hearts will show

Their faith in your word and deed.

Then, we are all familiar with the promise found in Malachi, third chapter and tenth verse, where God said He would pour us out a blessing that there would not be room enough to receive it. "And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine

cast her fruit before the time in the field," saith the Lord of hosts. Listen to Deuteronomy 15:7-11: "And if there be among you a poor man of one of thy brethren within any of thy gates in thy land which the Lord thy God giveth thee, thou salt not harken thine heart, nor shut thine hand from thy poor brother: But thou shalt open thine hand wide unto him, and shalt surely lend him sufficient for his need, in that which he wanteth. Thou shalt surely give him, and thine heart shall not be grieved when thou givest unto him: because for this thing the Lord thy God shall bless thee in all thy works, and in all that thou puttest thine hand unto." For what thing would the Lord bless? For giving.

Friend, if you aren't saved, first of all give God your heart. Paul, in speaking of the saints at Macedonia, said, "but first gave their own selves to the Lord." Present your body a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. Romans 12:1.

All the hands that Jesus has to work with down here now is our hands; all the feet—our feet. Likewise, our minds, tongues, eyes, etc. In Romans 6:13, we are commanded to "yield your members as instruments of righteousness unto God." The love of God will then make you willing to give to Him — even your life if needs be. Remember, what we give to God, whatever it be, is all that we really save, for "heaven and earth shall pass away." (Yes, be destroyed and finally burned up) Give Him your heart; save your soul from hell. Give Him your substance; save your treasures by laying them up in heaven.

This is the second and concluding installment in a series of excerpts from an old Methodist book given me by my mother entitled, "Perfect Love; or, Plain Things for Those Who Need Them", printed in 1861. There is a striking parallel, you will notice, between the Methodism of that era, and the general Pentecostal movement today, although I am persuaded our precious organization is resisting the modern trend of Laodiceanism and clinging to the "old paths, the good way". As you read these excerpts, however, substitute the word "Pentecost" for the word "Methodist" and the amazing present-day parallel will unfold itself. word "Methodist" and the amazing present-day parallel will unfold itself.

WHAT IS THE GRAND SECRET OF HOLY LIVING? It is to obtain and retain the perpetual presence, fullness, and illumination of the Holy Ghost. "He shall abide with you forever." He will subdue your lusts and propensities. Gal. 5:16. He will impart liberty. II Cor. 3:17. He reveals the things of Christ. John 15:26. He presents the truth of God and the things of God to the mind. I Cor. 2:10, 11.

He imparts light and wisdom. John 16:13. He sustains in the hour of affliction. John 14:16. He imparts the virtues of a holy character. Gal. 5:22-25. He gives the witness of adoption and salvation. Rom. 8:16. He imparts the divine image -the heavenly signet—to the soul. Eph. 1:13. He is the source and author of all love to God. Rom. 5:5. He is the source of strength and success. Zech. 4:6. His presence and work make the soul a temple, sacred to the service of God. I Cor. 3:16, 17,

Be careful, my dear reader, and not grieve the Spirit, but "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God which worketh in you, both to will and to do of His own good pleasure".

IS THERE NOT GREAT DANGER OF GETTING THE STANDARD OF HOLINESS TOO HIGH? There is far more danger of getting it too low. There is no danger of getting it too high if we keep to the Scriptures. The Bible standard is holiness — simple purity. The Savior gave the standard as follows: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength, and thy neighbor as thyself". I think there is but little danger of getting the standard higher than this.

#### HOW DOES OPPOSITION TO HOLI-NESS USUALLY MANIFEST ITSELF AMONG PROFESSORS OF RELIGION?

Often by sneers and taunts in regard to those who advocate and profess it. "He makes a hobby of holiness". How often we hear this and kindred declarations in reference to those who profess and preach holiness, and urge believers to press after "the fulness of the blessing of the gospel of Christ". It is so common to hear the advocates and professors of holiness accused of making a hobby of it, and this accusation is to my mind so objectionable, as to demand a passing notice.

That some may go to an unwarrantable extreme in regard to the subject of Christian holiness, we admit, and believe it to be a source of grief to all the true friends of holiness. Untimely, unintelli-gent, and over action, we think injurious to any cause. Nevertheless, I fully believe where there is one thus chargeable in regard to this subject, there are fifty who

fail, and live below their privilege and duty.

To say a man makes holiness a hobby is the same as saying he makes a hobby of religion. What is holiness but religion in full gospel measure?

If I mistake not, this accusation is usually made by those whose experience is indefinite, uncertain, and ambiguous. It comes from those who are not walking in the light of love, and who neither profess it nor give evidence of enjoying it.

This taunting accusation serves to quiet the convictions and groanings of many who see and feel their need of a clean heart.

The point of great danger, in regard to this subject, is not that men will make too much of it, and overdo the matter. (though this may be done), but that they will fail to come up to the Bible standard of Christian privilege and duty. While there may be found occasionally one who overdoes the thing, the great mass ne-glect it altogether. And over-action on this subject is less harmful than no action at all in regard to it, or than opposition to it. — "A living dog is better than a dead lion".

This accusation is now made mainly by persons within the pale of the Methodist church itself. The time was when the early Methodist preachers had plenty of this kind of treatment from without the Methodist church. They were accused of making a hobby of "free grace" and of "full salvation", by the opponents of those doctrines in other churches. Now, while that kind of opposition from abroad has well nigh ceased, we have an abundance of it at home. Is this just as it should be?

Christian holiness and its friends find an abundance of opposition in the depraved hearts of the unconverted, and in those professing Christians who reject the doctrine altogether, without an ambush fire of this kind from our professed friends.

Let me ask, in the language of John Wesley, "Why have the preachers of it been hooted at like mad dogs, even by men that fear God, nay, and by some of their own children, some whom they, under God, have begotten through the gospel?"

Ministers who profess and preach holiness have to encounter suspicion, denunciation, theological and ecclesiastical ostracism. Is it not time that this thing was not only abandoned, but regarded with shame and penitence?

The Bible gives prominence to the subject of holiness. Why, then, is it censurable for a minister to give it prominence in pulpit and pastoral labor? It is undeniable that multitudes in our ministry but seldom preach a sermon specifically of the subject of holiness, notwithstanding thousands in the church are suffering for want of purity and power.

I believe there is a class of temporizing, tobacco-chewing, cigar-smoking ministers getting into the pulpit, who neither preach nor enjoy much religion, but are ever ready to utter this accusation against any who may profess or preach Christian holiness. This manifest and unhappy fact can not be palliated or concealed by the stale, silly, and unmeaning cry of "Croaker!"

What is the grand object of Christianity? Holiness.

What constitutes the great prerequisite for heaven? Holiness. Heb. 12:14.

For what did Jesus shed His precious blood? "Who gave Himself for us that He might redeem us from all INIQUITY"

What is the great present want of the church and of the world? Holiness.

When I was ordained to the work of the ministry, I declared I was groaning after it. Have my groans been turned to shouts of victory? or am I still groaning? or have my groans given place to indifference or opposition? Do I make "Holiness unto the Lord" my motto, and do I preach it to believers CONSTANTLY, STRONGLY, and EXPLICITLY?

IS THERE ANY HARM IN THE PUT-TING ON, OR THE WEARING, OF JEWELRY OR COSTLY ARRAY? Thousands in the church of God, and many ministers and their families, are drifting away from the old landmarks on this subiect.

It is positively and distinctly forbidden in the Scriptures. I Tim. 2:9; I Peter 3:3, 4; I John 2:15, 16; Rom. 12:1, 2. Aim at obeying and pleasing God, and all your ornaments, if you have them, will drop off at once.

It cannot be put on or worn in the Name of the Lord Jesus, or to the glory of God, Col. 3:17.

It causes a professor of religion to falsify his profession. Christians profess that they are "not of the world"; that they are "pilgrims and strangers"; that they seek "a city which hath foundations"; that they are "crucified unto the world, and the world unto them"; that they are "dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God"; that they are "laying up treasures in heaven"; that they have "no fellowship with the unfruitful works of dark-ness"; and that they are not "conformed to this world, but transformed by the renewing of their mind". The wearing of jewelry and costly array, in effect, contradicts all this. It is both a sign and a fruit

It serves to engender pride, excite unhallowed passions and love for the gilded gewgaws of a depraved world. It not only cultivates and develops the passion of display, but it excites envy, jealousy, evil speaking, covetousness, hypocricy, hatred, and discontent. It increases fearfully the love of the world. Every action has a tendency to make you love the world more, or Christ better; and no action can increase our love for both. The wearing of jewelry either increases or lessens our piety. Which does it do? This sin is a distinguished mark of the multitude who throng the way to hell.

It furnishes the world with an argument against Christianity. The world knows how Christians ought to live. They can see a sad inconsistency in Christians decorating themselves with the extravagant trappings of modern fashion. They know the exterior of many professing Christians brands their profession with hypocrisy.

Christians should so dress as to show that their minds are occupied with nobler objects. Their external appearance should evince gravity, simplicity, decency, and modesty. They should dress neatly, plainly, and suitably to persons professing godliness.

While we claim that jewelry and gaudy attire are inconsistent with the marks of genuine piety, we do not claim that plain-(Continued on page 8)

## A SENSE OF TRUE VALUES

#### Radio Message Delivered over Station K.O.L.E. Port Arthur, Texas

(Text) — Rev. 3:17—I am rich and increased with goods, and have need of nothing:

Perhaps one of the greatest assets in human life is to possess a sense of true values. Winston defines the word perspective, as the ability to see things in their proper proportion. For example, a little boy would place greater value on a few shiny trinkets, pleces of string, bright tin-foil, marbles or a top, than he would on some rare paintings or valuable old books. To question the reason for this behavior, the answer is not difficult; It is because he is a child, his mind is undeveloped, and he has yet to learn the sense of true values.

Writing to the Corinthians, Paul said, "When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: But when I became a man, I put away childish things.

An African native, living in the dark recesses of some remote jungle, and having never been exposed to our modern civilization, would quickly reach for a piece of bright red cloth, beautifully colored beads, or shiny copper wire. He would gladly choose these in preference to a sack full of crisp United States Currency. Possessing the understanding we do, it is easy to laugh at his lack of understanding; To mock him for being a savage and a heathen; To pity his ignorance and superstition. Yet every day, in this complex civilization of ours, millions of intelligent and other wise level-headed men and women, are tossing aside those things which possess real spiritual and moral value, and are reaching for the shallow, the superficial, the tinsil glitter of that which has no value.

When rough, craggy faced old Joshua, in those ancient by-gone days, stood before the Israelites, he very soberly and very earnestly said, choose you this day whom you will serve. It was a crucial day in the history of Israel. She had come to the cross roads of her national and religious destiny, with one of three choices to make.

First—She could choose tradition: Or the heathen gods of their fathers before the flood. But it was because of these sins that the deluge came upon the earth and man-kind was destroyed.

Second—She could choose popular present fellowship: Or the gods of the land, therefore, having fellowship with the Amorites, the very people who had kindled the wrath of God, and the people God had sent Israel to destroy.

Third—She could choose the One True God: The God who could and had sustained them, led them, fought for them and had helped them in time of need.

Perhaps we would be qualified in saying that today, our so-called Christian civilization is presented with this same three fold choice. Carnality or spirituality: World conformity or Christ conformity: The power of God or the popularity of the world.

Writing to the church in Laodicea, God speaks to them as a people whose values, or sense of values have become confused. According to their materialistic Philosophy they were rich and increased with goods. In their self-sufficient way of thinking, they had need of nothing. What

a striking similarity to religious America today. But in the eyes of God they appeared in an altogether different light. God said, You're wretched, and miserable, and poor and blind and naked. And the thing that brings consternation, they were not aware of their true condition.

That such a church as Laodicea existed is beyond question. Yet when John, through the inspiration of the Holy Ghost, penned this message, it is conceded by all Bible authorities to have a more prophetic and far reaching view. It was a message for the end-times. That final state of gentile world apostasy, and the wretched, miserable, blind condition, humanity find themselves in today.

The skeptic will say, the church has failed in her purpose. We answer . . . No, the church has not failed, yet we are compelled to say that in many ways religion has failed. In their blind concern over brick and mortar, programs and popularity, the true spirit of evangelism has been lost.



The Most Valuable Asset To Humanity

As a certain renowned church leader, high in the realms of the religious world, and discussing the advancements his particular religious body had made, the wealth it had amassed, the beautiful edifices erected, turned to a friend and said, "The church cannot say, as Peter said to the lame man at the beautiful gate, silver and gold have I none, for we have become very wealthy".

"That is true sir, replied his friend, but neither can it say, as Peter said to the lame man at the gate, in the Name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk"

Can we not see this same sad spectacle of a civilization prostrate, bleeding, dying, decaying. Though church membership is rising to gigantic proportions. Though the mails, the air-waves and channels of communication are filled with literature and religious services, yet seemingly it is doing nothing to stem the tide of worldliness, of vice and crime and sin. Of drunkards, and murders and dope fiends. Of juvenile delinquency, divorce, and a rising box score of un-wed mothers.

More than one man of sober mind, and concerned with the present trend of affairs, of sin and vice and crime, and the ever closer encreachment of atheistic communism, have asked, where lies the

answer: Paul speaking in 2nd. Timothy chapter 3, pin-points the reason. He says, and I quote:

This know also that in the last days perilous times shall come.

For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy,

Without natural affection, truce breakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good,

Traitors, heady high-minded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God Having a form of godliness but denying the power thereof.

From such turn away.

In verse one of Chapter 2, Paul uses the word, perilous, which means dangerous times, or deadly times, and something even more significant and far reaching, it means times of decay.

A decay of those spiritual and moral forces that made the primitive church such a mighty force in early times. A decay of decency and of honor and fair play; And most of all, a decay of the power of religion. For men shall have a form of Godliness, but shall deny the power thereof. And the Apostle says, from such turn away.

For what is the purpose of religion. Do men profess Christianity solely for the intrinsic value they receive from its pagentry, its pomp, its ceremony. For what did Jesus Christ live and die? That choirs might sing of a babe in a manger, of a star in the east, or of three hoary bearded wise men from the orient, bending reverently over a bed of straw. Why do people go to church: For the sake of meeting friends, or to show their Easter finery. This is not the purpose of the church; and if this is what Jesus Christ died for, his death was in vain. For true religion is not just a social activity. A popular place to go. A social or business asset for those who belong to the proper congregation. If this is the reason men go to church, their sense of values are mixed, and they have sadly perverted the spirit of true religion.

The primary purpose, underlying the reason for religion, is the fact that two great realities exist. A place called heaven. And a place called the lake of fire. Regardless of your position in life, one of these will be your eternal abiding place. Jesus Christ, born of the virgin, lived a life of spotless purity, died at calvary and rose from the dead, that he might save sinners from the lake of fire. Ignore these cardinal facts, and you ignore the fundamental principles for which the Bible was written.

But does truth always come out victorious. True the poet speaks in sublime terms that, "Truth crushed to earth shall rise again". Yet in many instances, tradition, habit, convenience and public opinion, has far greater weight on ones thinking, than does truth. As far as possessing convictions of their own, countless thousands do not. They believe what they do is because of the fact that dad and mother believed this way. Grandfather was this and grandmother was that, and sad

#### **NEWS FROM URUGUAY**

We arrived in Montevideo the 3rd of September and spent the first few days at the Salvation Army Hotel here. They treated us wonderful and we stayed nine days without them charging us one cent, and since then they have been most kind to us in many ways. We were able to rent a small apartment not too far from town, yet in a nice section of the city. We can reach the center of the city in less than 20 minutes on the electric trolly bus that runs a few blocks from the house.

The weather was very cold when we arrived, but now it is a lot warmer as it is getting to be spring. The seasons are reversed here from those in North Ameri-

ca. December and January will be the hottest months of the year here. During the winter it gets very cold here as we get the winds right off the South Pole.

We have three men who have been baptized in Jesus Name that come to the meetings regularly and the wife of one of the men will be baptized soon. We have been having two services weekly in the apartment, mostly what you would call prayer meetings, as we are still a people of few words when it comes to the Spanish language, but we are learning more of it every day. We have had strangers out who are interested in this truth and enjoy the meetings. One Sunday the Salvation Army Captain came and interpreted for us so we could have preaching, and last week we had a Mennoite girl at the service and as she could speak English she interpreted for me. We have been made happy at our services as the people really like to pray and seek the Lord and we are waiting until we can speak the language well enough to be able to hold public services.

We also have 16 people that have been baptized in Jesus name in Northern Uruguay which is located about 400 miles from here. They have accepted us as their pastors. They have their meetings in the different farm homes and really have good cottage meetings and they are now beginning to have public services. One of them wrote me recently that he had received the Holy Ghost. God is moving among them and they want us to come up there at least once a month, but we anticipate going oftener when we learn the language. We can say that they are wonderful Christian people.

We are also glad to report that we have oneness people in Buenos Aires, Argentina, and in Paraguay. We haven't visited the last two places as yet, but we plan to as soon as possible. From this you can see the need here, and we are the only missionaries for all these people. We want to do all we can for the Lord in these last days. Pray much for us, and our needs here in South America.

#### MISSIONARY SECRETARY PLANS TRIP TO FOREIGN LANDS

It seems to be the mind and will of the brethren for us to make another missionary trip in 1953. Also it "seems good to the Holy Ghost and us" to do this. This will be the fifth major missionary trip since the United Pentecostal Church was formed of God on September 24th, 1945. In 1951 the conference saw the blessing and necessity of these visits to the field, and duly passed a resolution to the effect the Missionary Secretary should visit each field once in three years. Our first trip was in 1947 when we visited Colombia and Jamaica. The second was in 1950 when we visited Mexico, Central America, Colombia and Jamaica. The third was in 1951 when we visited India, Ceylon, Iraq, Palestine, South Africa and Liberia. In 1952 we made the fourth trip which was to Alaska. We expect to start early in February this year to visit Java, Japan and Hawaii. We hope to spend from four to six weeks in both Java and Japan, and two or three weeks in Hawaii. We will do our best while there, and will bring you back the best honest report of the work that we possibly can. Jesus said, "The gospel must first be published among all nations". And if we believe that we have it in its fulness, we MUST publish it. We appreciate the way you have helped with your prayers, offerings and in many ways. Your help, and these visits to the field have contributed largely to the growth of the missionary work. The work has actually tripled in the past few years, and the end is not yet. We have sixty active missionaries at the present time, and approximately two hundred native workers in the various fields. We will need your daily prayers for Spiritual, physical and mental strength on this trip. We have an Assistant Missionary Secretary now. Brother Oscar Vouga will take care of writing the vouchers and managing the major matters in our absence. We also have extra help in the Missionary Department in the office. Sister Bernice Fivecoats began work January 1st. Pray for the Missionary Department, and each member of the Mission-ary Board that they will be anointed of God for the task.



- 15. Have you taken steps to eliminate all un-necessary noise and confusion during Sunday School?
- 16. Do you open and close your Sunday School on time?

If you cannot answer these questions favorably, I am sure you will do something about it.

to say they never search their Bibles to see if their beliefs are scriptural.

For instance, there is not a single recorded instance in the Bible or in any other genuine first century book, where any person was ever baptized in any other name, saving the Name of Jesus. Yet how very few out of the countless millions of church goers actually practice Baptism in the name of Jesus. Furthermore, let us stop and consider, that every bona-fide member of the church, recorded in the New Testament, were men and women, who after having found faith in God, were immersed in water in the Name of Jesus Christ, and baptized of the Holy Ghost according to acts 2:4, and spoke with other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Yet how few, perhaps because of tradition and public opinion, believe this experience is available today. Yet the Bible speaks of Jesus Christ as the same yesterday, today and forever.

What does truth mean to you? Pilate admired Jesus greatly. Declared, "I find no fault in this man; and finally taking water, tried vainly to wash his hands of the whole affair. Yet because of his position, and his fear of offending the elders of the Jews, released Jesus to the fury of the mob. Though he and Herod had been mortal enemies, yet with Jesus on trial, they clasped hands in friendship.

But let us look further into the life of Herod. Of all the men in his province, he possessed no truer friend than John the Baptist. Here was a man in spite of the threat of imprisonment, shunned not to declare unto him the whole council of God. Fearlessly looking adulterous old Herod square in the eye, he said, "It is not lawful for thee to have thy brother's wife. What other man in his realm would dare, even for the sake of Herod's soul, tell him the truth. According to the Bible he heard John gladly. Yet after the daughter of Herodias danced before him, and because of his foolish promise, he found it impossible to spare the head of John. He would have lost prestige and respect in the eyes of the elders. Because of personal opinion, and expediency, truth was sacrificed.

As we are presented daily with truth, let us pray that God will give us a clear vision, a proper sense of values, to choose the good, the right and the true.
