FUNDAMENTAL DOCTRINE UNITED PENTECOSTAL CHURCH

MIRACLE OF THE CROSS

ODAY'S man in the street has asked "What is so different about the execution of a Nazarene Jew two thousand years ago? Why should it compel any special attention today? Wherein lies the reason for contemporary reverence of a peasant who was hung in an obscure land so many years past, or for congregating in thousands of churches to offer humble thanksgiving for his sacrifice?"

An examination of the Cross, as the Roman Centurion examined it, gives the irrefutable answers. This execution was different because it teaches the Love of Almighty God, because it pictures the human destiny for which all of us are created. Sin put the Son of God on Calvary's Cross that day, but His forgiveness, His promise of eternal life, His Love, His approach to suffering, His spiritual thirst, His triumphant life, and His deep, abiding faith have taken Him down.

This is the difference. This is why Christians call Good Friday "Good!"

A medical missionary, captured by Chinese bandits, was taken to their leader's cave in the hills. There was no doubt in his mind that he would be executed at once, but on his arrival the bandit chieftain was found in the throes of appendicitis and the doctor was ordered to attend him. With cautious anxiety, the other members of the band permitted him to prepare for the operation but watched him carefully as they handed him the knife which had been designated for his execution. The missionary cleansed it, purified it over the flames of the camp fire, and proceeded to restore the dying bandit's life. Those desperate men could readily understand the doctor's ability to cure. They had no difficulty in accepting his willingness to do so as a bargain for his own life. The thing they could not comprehend, however, was that he could take the same knife dedicated to his own death, purify it and employ it as the instrument for giving life to his enemy.

So we can also turn evil into good and thus re-enact the first word from the Cross of Christ.

If Thou Canst Believe

THERE is no subject in the entire Bible and the Christian's thinking which deserves more time than this simple subject of believing on Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour. It is also one of the most abused subjects in Christian theology. The caption of this article is taken from the reply Jesus gave that troubled father, who had brought his demon possessed son to His disciples for them to cast out the demon. After much effort they had completely failed. It was then that Jesus came down from the mount where He had been transfigured before Peter, James and John, and found His disciples in an argument with the scribes and asked what their question was. Then the father of the child brought him and requested, after he had described his condition, "If thou canst do any thing, have compassion on us, and help us." (See Mark 9:14-27). Jesus answered him by placing the entire responsibility for the deliverance of the child on the father when He said, "If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth." The father fully realized that Jesus laid the blame upon his unbelief, for he ". . . cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; but help thou mine unbelief."

The first fact in the case is that "... with God all things are possible" (Mark 10:27), for God can even save a sinner from his sin and make him holy in life, heart and conduct. The meanest of sinners can be saved from their sin and enter into the kingdom of God; yes, even rich men can be delivered from their riches and be made to put their trust in Jesus Christ to be saved. God, who can save a sinner from his past sin, and put His Holy Spirit within that blood-bought,

blood-washed person through faith in the name of Jesus can do anything if we can only believe; yet, those mighty works must at all times conform with God's plan for the ages and His corresponding promises. For example, God has promised us a new body which is not subject to death, sickness, and etc., but that promise is not for this present age, even as He has promised a New Heaven and a New Earth in the which only righteousness shall dwell, but no matter how much we believe it will come in this age that is impossible, because God has neither promised it to us now, nor is it according to His plan. So while God can do anything and everything He pleases to do, He also works according to a very definite plan for the ages.

But the thought of this article is to inspire faith for our day, and in harmony with that which God has promised for us during this age in which we are looking for the return of Jesus to set up another age, or the Kingdom of God on the earth. Jesus again said, "He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father." (John 14:12). This promise is clear; those who believe on Jesus as the Christ, the Messiah. the Saviour and deliverer SHALL do the same works that He did while He was here on earth as the Son of God; a Man in whom God was fully manifest. Those works are simple and are given in the four Gospels as recorded by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. He turned water into wine, healed people of all sicknesses and diseases. He walked on water (as also did Peter), He stilled the storm, and raised the dead back to this life. In

raising the dead He did not give them redeemed bodies, but brought them back to this life so that they would die again. Notice that none of His miracles were of a permanent, or eternal nature. All that He healed finally died, and those He raised from the dead died again, and the storm that He calmed came back again, the blind eyes were later blinded by death, and the tongue that He loosed was again bound by death. Because He Himself was in a mortal body He worked miracles in the eyes of mortal men to prove that God was in Him indeed.

In all of Jesus' signs which were given, there was only one which is permanent and eternal, and that is the sign of Jonah which is found . to be fulfilled in His death, burial, and resurrection, and that resurrection brought Him forth into life and immortality of body as well as soul and Spirit. In the promise in the preceding verse this miracle is also promised, but it must follow in its order, and that will only be fulfilled when He comes again and we see Him as He is, and are changed to be like Him and put on immortality. This, we are looking forward to and it is the Blessed Hope of every Spirit-filled person (Titus 2: 11-14; 1 John 3:1-3).

This leaves us with one consuming passion and desire to believe in Him as the Scripture has said (John 7:37-39) so that the Holy Ghost may flow through us and work mighty signs and wonders before an unbelieving world. Also, that we may witness to the resurrection of Jesus and His absolute Deity and Oneness with the Father, and this to be finally completed in our receiving an



When Were Our Sins Remitted?

Editor's note: The contents of this article are the expressed convictions of the author and are not necessarily the views of our entire general body. However, seeing the trend of our times when so many are trying to "Climb up some other way," it behooves us to strengthen our stakes and preach and teach the unadulterated plan for complete salvation. It is our only hope against religious modernization.

HE SUBJECT at hand is one of the most controversial, yet one of the most vital doctrines in the entire Bible. We will not be able to cover all the points of interest on this great subject, however, we trust that by giving you the highlights it will enlighten your minds and hearts to the revelation of how important it is to have your sins remitted and not just forgiven.

Everyone will agree that the only antidote for sin is the blood of Jesus Christ, yet so many have not a biblical knowledge as to when the blood is applied to a sinner's heart and life. This being true, I am fearful lest many have stopped in their journey toward complete salvation and consequently are still in their sins.

The following questions are asked many times by people who have never been taught the real truth of the remission of sins: 1. When was the blood applied? 2. When were my sins remitted? 3. What does a man have to do to get his sins remitted? We hope to answer these questions in this article.

We are presenting to you for your deep consideration two schools of thought: 1. What is the forgiveness of sins? 2. What is the remission of sins? Now, some hold that these two accomplishments are one and the same. In other words, they contend that when you repent and have received the forgiveness of sins you also obtain the remission of sins. However, we do not believe that the Bible teaches that the act

of forgiveness and the act of remission can be used interchangeably in regard to a man's experience. For example, because a man is made righteous this does not necessarily mean that he is holy, but if he is holy he is also righteous. If a child is begotten this does not mean that he is born, but every child that is born is surely begotten. Further, all apostles were disciples but all disciples were not apostles. So, everyone that has received remission of sins has also been forgiven, but he that has just received forgiveness has not received remission, for this only comes through being buried in the precious Name of Jesus Christ. Those disagreeing with the aforementioned views are undoubtedly as honest and sincere in their interpretation as I am. However, let us forget our own theories and see "what saith the scripture."

FORGIVENESS OF SINS

Forgiveness is an Old Testament doctrine as well as a New Testament doctrine and is based upon the act of repentance. For whenever a man repents, he is forgiven of his sins. You cannot say that the Lord forgave sins in the Old Testament and not in the New. At the same time when you consider the word "remission" I heartily feel that it is strictly a New Testament doctrine. When a sinner repents (We call it conversion) he experiences a joy of having his sins forgiven. He believes God, accepts the gospel, does what we tell him to do and turns from his evil ways. That person is pardoned or forgiven of his sins, then when he is baptized in water in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, it is for the remission of his sins.

Forgiveness, then, is one thing and remission is another. The New Testament saints have a benefit that the Old Testament saints did not have. That is, the right to have their sins remitted. In St. John 1:29 we read: "Behold the lamb of God that taketh away the sins of the world." And also in Romans 8:23 we read: "For what the law could not do, Christ did." And further, we read in Hebrews 8:6-7: "But now hath he obtained a more excellent ministry, by how much also he is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises. For if the first covenant had been faultless, then should no place have been sought for the second."

We often sing that wonderful old hymn, "Under the blood, the precious blood, Under the cleansing, healing flood, Keep me Saviour from day to day, Under the precious blood." Yet, while many sing this hymn they are still ignorant of the fact of how to get under the blood, which is the most essential thing in our lives. Forgiveness, then, is both a New Testament and Old Testament doctrine, but the remission of sins is strictly taught in the New Testament. If, in the Old Testament the comers to the altar had to do a certain act to get forgiveness of their sins, we must also in the New Testament do the one thing that will bring a remit-

versus

Juvenile Delinquency

I recently read an article written by J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the F. B. I., telling of the amazing increase of 8.5 per cent in crime. Comparing the first six months of 1954 with

the same period in 1953, he broke it down in this order: Robberies increased an amazing 20.4 per cent; Burglaries jumped 13.2 per cent, and Larceny 9 per cent. He stated that many of these crimes are being committed by youth, boys and girls that should be training to be leaders of tomorrow.

Then like a thunderbolt came the challenge, He said, "Crime thrives on our mistakes, weaknesses and lack of interest."

Crime has increased four times as fast as the population and continues to rise.

Juvenile Delinquency can be prevented but will not until we ourselves become alarmed and concerned. Mr. Hoover stated, "One of the best weapons with which to attack this malady is RELIGIOUS TRAINING. The young boy and girl trained in the teaching of the

Bible have a moral reliance which serves as a compass for everyday living. They know the difference between right and wrong, good and evil. They are able to conquer the temptations of life."

Almost every case can be attributed to a bad home condition. These youngsters are products of spiritual starvation.

Isaiah 59:7-8 describe the picture perfectly. "Their feet run to evil, and they make haste to shed innocent blood: their thoughts are thoughts of iniquity; wasting and destruction are in their paths." Notice this eighth verse, "... The way of peace they have not known, and there is no judgment in their goings." This merely implies spiritual ignorance on their part but adds to the indictment against us.

Property crimes now total more than \$400,000,000 annually. Stick-up men and armed criminals robbed people of more than \$14,000,000 last year. In 1953 there were 226,530 automobiles stolen. More than half of these crimes were committed by persons under twenty-one years of age. The largest percent being seventeen years old.

Gangsters, embezzlers, swindlers and crooks are said to cost the American public some twenty billion dollars a year. This crime army is estimated at nearly 7,000,000 according to Roy F. Cottrell in his article, "Cavalcade of Lawlessness." He goes on to explain that only four percent of these are behind bars while the other 96 per cent of these "Wolves of Society" walk with us

on the streets, ride in good cars, and live in respectable homes, in your own community. If grouped together in one city, this sinister horde would form a metropolis about the size of Chicago and Detroit combined.

Our newspapers herald the news of mob violence nearly every day. Teenagers beat and kill their helpless victims merely for the thrill. One day last week I noted three deaths of small girls by sex maniacs, one confessed by a fourteen year old boy.

Recently in Philadelphia, teenage gangs went on a rampage of vandalism, beatings, hold-ups and robberies. Over 1000 boys and girls were imprisoned before the violence was ended.

These wild escapades prompted J. Edgar Hoover to remark: "Day and night I am haunted by the disturbing fact that youthful crime is on the increase."

How wonderful it would be if we the ministry, Pastors and teachers would have the same kind of concern and unrest. We have the weapons of RELIGIOUS TRAINING. We have and hold the answer to the problem. We know spiritual values and we also know their spiritual ignorance.

Can it be possible that we will ignore this challenge or will we prepare to meet it? Will we fiddle while Rome burns? Will we continue to "Spin our wheels," or will


The Foreign Missionary Secretary Writes About:

REVIVAL ★ PERSECUTION ★ PROGRESS

in the Mission Fields

AST month I wrote some more of "the greatest revival of the century." I told of Saul Remeris, the bartender, finding God and of immediately going out of the rum business that very night; and that he is the pastor of a large Pentecostal Church there now. Also, I told you of the two farmers who had sworn vengeance and death on each other, but when God moved through the hills, they both found God, and both received the Holy Ghost the same night. Much of this great revival had taken place before brother Drost had ever

got up in the mountains. The workers kept bringing word of what God was doing up there. Brother Drost was busy with the revival that was sweeping the Valle.

Finally the day came that Brother Drost went up the hill in the face of danger and death. He was amazed when he found that over one hundred had repented and received the Holy Ghost. But none had been baptized in Jesus' Name. One day, after an all night service, a baptismal service was arranged. It was one hour's journey down the mountains to the place where enough water could be found to baptize. While getting ready to go to the baptism, Brother Drost lay down to rest a bit. While "dozing" he saw in either a dream or a vision, a large farm house, with a pool of water in front of it, and a stout man standing beside a white horse. When he arose, he told the men of what he had seen. Immediately they said, "That is Mr. Isaiah. He has a large farm, and lives only about fifteen minutes walk from here. Likely he would let you use his pool for the baptism." They sent a man over to ask permission to use this place for a baptism. Mr. Isaiah kindly assented. Brother Drost and the people lost no time in going over to this farm. When they entered the yard there was the house, and the pool of water, in front of it, and the stout man standing beside a white horse, getting ready to leave. Brother Drost hurried over to thank the man for his permission to use his pool, and also asked him if he would not stay for the service. Mr. Isaiah consented to stay. In a few minutes, the service began.

Brother Drost preached on Acts 2: 38. In the midst of the message, this owner of the farm ran up to Brother Drost asking if he would baptize him. (Brother Drost thought he was angry and was going to stop him). He said, "Yes, if you repent." The man turned to the crowd and said, "I repent, I want God to forgive me, and I want you to forgive me." Then he went into the house to change his clothes. Soon he came out. Brother Drost baptized him as he was, and he came up out of the water, speaking in tongues as the Spirit gave utterance.

I had the privilege of staying in that house one week-end in April of this year. The man, and his wife, and all his daughters and one son are all filled with the Holy Ghost. Oh! my brother, it does not take God long to do business when we want Him. I have always believed that Peter was not at the home of Cornelius (Acts 10) over two hours until they were all talking in tongues. It was not over thirty minutes from the time Mr. Isaiah in the mountains of Colombia heard the message of the Holy Ghost, until he was filled.

Brethren, we are in the last days. Time is short. Jesus is coming for His people. A CLOUD THE SIZE OF A MAN'S HAND

Honolulu, Hawaii

Dear Brother Stairs:

Greetings in the name of Jesus.

We received your most welcome and encouraging letter last week. We are very much encouraged in the Lord, although the battle still rages.

We are now on the air! We have had two Sunday Morning broadcasts already. PRAISE THE LORD! Our radio work is going to be a big asset to the work here. The very first broadcast produced results, for we have had over a half dozen new families visit us since the broadcast. Some of them are excellent prospects and have come back the second and third time to the serv-

ices. Most of them are trinity and are becoming discouraged because of the dried up churches in their ranks.

We have had a couple to visit us from the Kona on the big Island that heard our first broadcast. As a result of the broadcast some have inquired as to the possibility of starting a church on the Island of Kaui. I sincerely believe our radio work will be our best investment toward winning souls.

We started a little Sunday School drive two weeks ago. Our Sunday School was averaging around fifty. The first Sunday of our drive we had 64. The second Sunday we had 86. The drive is to last for eight weeks and we expect to pass the 100 mark which we set as our goal. The end of the drive will mark the end of one year since our arrival

here. We began with an average of 15 in Sunday School, so we thank God for the way He has prospered us. We thank God for the little cloud that we see as the size of a man's hand. We pray that it will grow into a mighty outpouring.

Greetings in Jesus name.

At this writing we are all well and happy in the service of the Lord. We have never been more contented in our lives and we thank God for sending us to this field of labor. God burdened our hearts for this people several years ago, and we will be able to labor in confidence and faith because we know we are in the land that God would have us work for Him.

We feel that the scripture has been fulfilled in our lives where Peter talked to Jesus in Mark 10:32: "Lo, we have left all and have followed thee. And Jesus answered and said, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or Brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my sake, and the gospels, but he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time and in the world to come eternal life." Along with this we know that He promised persecutions, but we also know that many are the afflictions of the righteous, but God delivereth them out of them all.

Here in Liberia, God is moving upon the native to do more for Him. We are now building a native church in Bugbay. It takes us three hours to walk there from here. A young man who was saved under the ministry of Sister Robinson will be in charge of the church. He will work the surrounding villages also. We are constantly praying that God will raise up gospel workers here for these surrounding villages, and

The amount needed was divided between the different groups, and only amounted to thirty-one quarts of fruit and sixty-two quarts of vegetables. Most of the labor was donated by the fine Brethren of the Texico District. The meals for the workers was also furnished by the sectional Ladies Auxiliary. What we could accomplish for God if everyone would co-operate as this fine group has. In addition to this, they help support several missionaries and have contributed largely to the Home Mission work in their District and in the Dakotas and Indian work.

This beautiful home is being paid for by the Texico District Ladies' Auxiliary. The District Superintendent will occupy the home.

eternal body, like unto His glorious body, when He comes to receive us unto Himself.

The apostles were eye witnesses of Jesus' life and miracles; then they had seen Him die on the cross on Calvary's hill, and had helped to remove His dead body from that cross and lay it in the tomb. From that tomb they walked away defeated, disappointed and hopeless and began to nurse their broken hearts in mourning. What they decided was: the end of a great Prophet who, had been mighty in word and deed, was gone forever. But to their utter amazement and surprise it was announced on the third day that He was risen from the dead and had been seen of several, and while they were gathered together to hear and discuss these reports, lo, Jesus Himself appeared among them and proved beyond possible doubt that He was alive from the dead. This, however, was not the end, for they finally witnessed His ascension into heaven to be glorified with the Father with the glory that he had before the world was created. (John 17:1-5). Thus He returned to His eternal Deity and glory, eternally glorified as God in a body free from death. Having seen Him ascend into heaven after forty days among them, His disciples were left without the slightest doubt about the reality of salvation in His name — JESUS, nor did they have any doubts about His coming back in the power of the Holy Ghost to be with them to the end of this age (Matt. 28:20; John 14:16-20).

The Holy Ghost, through Jesus, has come in grace and mercy to convince the world of sin, and of right-eousness, and of judgment and will be with those who believe and are baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins (Mark 16:16-20; Acts 2:37-39), and will prove His presence by working and performing the same mighty

work that Jesus did while He was here in the body among men to give His life a ransom to atone for our sins. Can we believe on Him as the Scripture has said? Yes, we can if we will cast aside our personal ambitions and take up our cross and follow Him, for at the end of this life there is still death for all of us, but the same kind of death as was His, which is to be followed by the same kind of glorious resurrection.

To the apostles the Holy Ghost was very real, for to them it was the same Spirit that worked miracles through Jesus while He was among them. And they knew that they had received His Spirit in their bodies to manifest to the world that there is salvation in the name of JESUS; and the miracles and preaching was to teach this truth and to convince their hearers that it is of God and not just another religion. True Pentecost is the only answer to the great need of the world, for Pentecost is the results of the Gospel in the believer, and Pentecost only comes in the name of Jesus who is the One and only Saviour: The Way, The Truth, and The Life.

This faith does not come simply by a decision, but to those who seek after Him that they might find Him (Acts 17:27), and by contending for the faith that was once delivered unto the saints (Jude 3). Those who would see the miracle-working power of God must separate themselves from the world unto God, that He may dwell in their mortal bodies (2 Cor. 6:14-18; 4:1-7). We find that in much sincere prayer and consecration we are drawn closer to God and that faith is built up in us because the Bible, His Word, becomes more real as we are made to realize by the witness of the Holy Spirit that it is not just a fable, but the true Word of God. Thus, the Bible becomes God's Word to us by the witness of the Spirit as we read and hear it preached and believing with the heart, faith moves God in our behalf to work miracles, signs and wonders among us for the glory of His name.

Now God works miracles through mortal men, for these miracles are not of an eternally permanent character, but they are to convince siners of their sins and of the coming resurrection to bring all men to judgment if they continue to live in sin here and now. At the judgment, only those whose sins have preceded them in repentance and remission of those sins in the name of Jesus can possibly be saved (1 Tim. 5:24). God has chosen to work through mortal men to save mortal men from sin and death unto life and immortality. This helps us to understand why God requires the Elders of the Church to lay hands on the sick, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord, for the Church is His body, filled with His Spirit, to preach this gospel with power and signs following to a lost, unbelieving world.

Let us pray that God will forgive our unbelief, and pray until simple believing faith becomes a part of our life and nature. Let us wait upon the Lord and renew our strength as the oil of His Spirit anoints our lives and our service to Him that we may see the signs following that He promised. This is a portion of the earnest of our inheritance in the Holy Ghost, and we need not be without this promise fulfilled; let us therefore humble ourselves and pray, and He will hear from heaven and heal us of all our sickness, diseases and many shortcomings, for great is His mercy and grace toward them that fear and obey Him.

tance of our sins. If forgiveness is based upon repentance which was commanded in both the Old Testament and the New Testament then remission of sins must be received through baptism, in water, in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ. "Without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sins." And, of course, the blood has to be applied in order for us to have our sins remitted, after we have had them forgiven through the act of repentance.

WHICH WAY WERE YOU LOOKING?

When you went down in the watery grave in the name of Jesus Christ, which way were you looking? Were you looking back to something that had been done, or were you looking forward to something that needed to be done? This is very important, for we must know the truth of what we were baptized for. Was it for our sins that had already been remitted or were we looking forward to getting them remitted by baptism? That is the reason for the question: "Which way were you looking when you were baptized?" We must arrive at the all important conclusion of whether baptism in water in the Name of Jesus is just an outward sign of an inward change, or whether baptism in Jesus Name is an absolute and essential doctrine for remission of sins. Personally, I believe it is, and, my reason for believing it is this: Everywhere that they received the Holy Ghost in the book of Acts they were baptized in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, whether it was before the baptism of the Spirit, or after the baptism of the Spirit. If it was so urgent and so important in that day, why isn't it just as important today? Many will not give us a clear-cut answer to this important question. Personally, we believe there is a Bible experience to enjoy and a Bible doctrine to preach. How can a man exalt and magnify and glorify the Lord in that experience and ignore the doctrine of baptism in Jesus Name that is taught in no less than five instances in the book of Acts, namely, the second, the eighth, the ninth, the tenth, and the nineteenth chapters?

THE WORD "FOR" IN ACTS 2:38 The single word that causes most of the controversy over the importance and necessity of water baptism is the word "FOR" in Acts 2: 38 which is the only door that opens to complete and full salvation. Some hold to the theory that the word "FOR" means "BECAUSE OF" while others contend that the word "FOR" means "IN ORDER TO." I personally believe the latter to be the true meaning and interpretation. We will not, however, deny the fact that the word "FOR" is used in cases where it means "because of." For instance, I was in a church once where the people were instructed to leap for joy. And, of course, they were leaping and they felt that if they jumped long enough and high enough they would finally obtain the joy they were after. Now in this case, the word "FOR" meant "because of." A person should leap because he is

joyful and not because he is leaping

after joy. You already have the joy and that is the reason you are leap-

ing.

When it comes to the "FOR RE-MISSION OF SINS" in Acts 2:38, it simply means in "order to." We are baptized in order to remit our sins for we have already had our sins forgiven when we repented. In the case of the Apostle Paul, while he was at Damascus, he was commissioned by Ananias: "And why tarriest thou? Arise, and be baptized, and wash thy sins, calling on the Name of the Lord." If Paul's sins had been washed away through repentance, the instructions of Ananias would have been entirely wrong. However, it is very evident that God was the one who told Ananias to convey the message to Paul, and certainly the Lord would not have chosen a man to tell Paul the wrong way to be saved. Ananias did not tell him to get baptized because his sins were gone or remitted, but because his sins had been forgiven, but not as yet



washed away. In other words, Paul was to look forward to the remission of his sins, and not look back to the altar thinking they had been washed away back there. A work was to be done and accomplished in his life that hadn't been done down on the street called Straight where he had repented for three days and nights.

Using the word "FOR" in another instance which means because of: we could say: The worker is paid FOR his labor, that was already done, and not for work that was to be done. But using the word "FOR" meaning in "order to"; we could say, "The worker labored FOR his wages," which means he worked with a "view to" or in "order to" obtain. And, of

course, in the matter of baptism we look forward with a "view to" having our sins remitted. The English word "FOR" is translated from the Greek word Eis, which means in "order to" and not "because of." This translation corresponds with every place in the Bible where the New Testament folk were baptized in water in regard to water baptism. In every instance, it was used with a view to remission and not because of. In the case of the word "FOR" being used to mean because of the Greek Dia is translated into the English word "FOR." In the use of either of these words, there is no contradiction in the scripture. but it all depends on the scripture that is to be interpreted.


FULL SALVATION

I believe that repentance and water baptism in Jesus Name settles the sin question in your life. If I did not believe this I could not say that Acts 2:38 was the plan of salvation. I do not believe that a sinner has any right to seek for the Holy Ghost — he must first have his sins forgiven. On the basis of forgiveness of his sins, he has a right to seek God for the Holy

Ghost as was the case of the 120 in the upper room on the Day of Pentecost. However, though some believe that because a person has been forgiven their sins and have received the baptism of the Holy Ghost and spoke in other tongues that this places them in the church or in the bride of Christ. Yet, every Trinitarian that I baptize in water, although they have spoken in tongues for years, I baptize them in the Name of Jesus Christ for the remission of their sins, for no one can be in the bride or go in the rapture who has not had their sins remitted.

I have heard some make the statement that if you haven't had the blood applied to your heart you haven't received any experience. To this I must disagree. I sincerely believe the Old Testament saints had an experience without the blood of Jesus Christ being shed. I also believe that people today receive the Holy Ghost without the remission of their sins. If you say that an individual has had the blood applied to their heart before they

The Foreign Missionary Secretary Writes About:

Revival - Persecution - Progress

in the Mission Fields

(Continued from Page 9)

After leaving this great revival in the mountains and the "Valle," Brothers Drost and Thompson and I journeyed to the city of Medellin (a beautiful city of over 300,000 people) for some Easter services. Brother Jorge Blanco is pastor here. (He attended Apostolic College in Tulsa four years). The work is small; however, about fifty people gathered in the little chapel for service the first night we arrived. It was Easter Week. All business was closed down, (except the beer parlors and rum shops). The city is filled with Roman Catholic Churches, and the churches were filled with people. The big parades were on. The dead Christ was being carried through the streets with hundreds of devout worshippers following.

Our little service had started. It was about 7:30 p.m., Thursday, April 7th. Some of our folks had come over a hundred miles to be in that service. The singing of the songs in Spanish was beautiful. Soon, dozens of school children gathered about the door and windows. They mocked and yelled as we worshipped. Soon more children of a larger size came and joined them, also a few men. Soon, the occasional stone began to come, then a bit faster; pelt, crack, bang, hitting the building, and the bars on the windows and the door, some coming inside. But the worshipping went on Brothers Drost and Thompson, Jorge Blanco, and I were on the platform. In a few minutes, the procession went by with long lighted candles. The priests were leading, the dead Christ in a glass casket, and images of several saints followed with the hundreds of people following them.

Then, the stones really did come from both old and young, but the singing of the songs of Zion went on in the chapel. I marveled at the calmness of the people. No one moved. No one was excited. Stones literally covered the side entry floor. Some managed to get through the bars on the windows, one coming clear to the platform and struck the side of my head a glancing blow, and bounced to the wall, leaving a deep mark in the plastered wall. I was thankful it was a glancing blow and not a direct hit. The results might have been worse. I was thankful to escape with only minor injuries. Soon after this, Brothers Thompson and Drost walked out in the midst of the fire. They asked, "Why are you stoning us?" The answer was "Because you do not believe in the Virgin Mary." As they started down the street to see if they could get police protection, the mob followed throwing stones. The mob now had increased to four or five hundred, and they were shouting, "Don't wait—kill them—kill them." Soon they were surrounded by the mob, and they began hitting their own people. A large stone went over Brother Thompson's head, as he happened to stoop over, and struck a boy (of their own crowd) and knocked him out. They carried him in a house crying, "You have killed my brother." At this moment, the police arrived on the scene, and quieted the mob; the neighbors had phoned for them. I preached that night, after it was over. At the close of the service two police came in and gave an apology to me for the incident. It was too much before the eyes of the press and public, and they feared publicity. We appealed to the British and American Consulates, and got results. All the next day, they threatened us. When we got on the bus, they would say, "Wait until tonight." The American Consul was out of the city that day, but the British Consul appealed to the military, the city police, and the church officials. The result was, we had no more trouble. But that night, it looked like someone might pay with their life for preaching This Gospel in their city.

Large cities of South America have set in darkness for four hundred years, bound with the chains of darkness and superstition. Where are those who are going to go? And where are those who are going to pay the expense of their going?

We actually now have more candidates than we can send. God has answered and given us the men and women that are not afraid to die, but we lack heavily in those that will send them. We need churches and individuals that will "lift up their eyes and LOOK on the fields that are white unto harvest." Seventy-five dollars a month will take care of the personal support of a missionary in any field. (Of course, there are other expenses connected that are not personal). "Truly, the harvest is great, but the laborers are few."

After leaving Medellin, we went on to Barranquilla for a fellowship meeting on Sunday, April 10th. God blessed all day with a full house of believers. On Monday, we had a little visit with Sister Rose Steeves, who is working with Sister Cooper. On Tuesday, we took a plane back to Jamaica to be with Brother and Sister Pair and Ruth for a few days. Our visit there was cut short on account of some severe troubles at home. Brother and Sister Pair and Ruth have done a good work in Jamaica during the three years they have been there, even though Sister Pair's health has been a han-

There was a great addition to our work at the headquarters church since 1950. While I was there, Brother Pair had a severe car accident, nearly taking his life. While he and I were riding in the back seat of the car, Sister Ruth and the driver in front, we met a heavy oil truck on a narrow curve. It was raining some and the pavement was very slippery. When the brakes were applied, it caused our car (back end) to skid right in front of the truck. It caught our rear fender, causing the rear door to open on Brother Pair's side, throwing him out, almost under the wheels of the oil truck. Through the mercy of God, he did not go under. He received bad cuts on his head, and ankle, requiring medical ai**d. He is** still having trouble with the cut on his head. Brother Pair was unconscious for a time and needs our prayers.

The work as a whole is in fine condition in Jamaica. We have nearly thirty churches and preaching places on the Island. Pray not only for here, but for all our missionaries, in all the world.

were baptized in Jesus Name, my question is: When did they get it? What did they have to do to get it? Some say all you have to do is believe and repent. If this be the case why did Ananias tell Paul that he had to be baptized in order that his sins might be washed away? Paul also received the Holy Ghost, but it was not the Holy Ghost that remitted his sins. He had to be buried in water. Of course, the water alone did not accomplish the purpose for which he was baptized, but it was accomplished through the Name of Jesus Christ into which he was baptized and his utmost faith in the shed blood of Jesus Christ.

I believe you will all agree with me that if a man does repent and is baptized in Jesus Name, the sin question is settled, and he is not a sinner any more. Some folks may look at him as a sinner because he hasn't talked in tongues, but I sincerely believe that his sins are gone because he has been washed in the blood of the Lamb. I, personally, had an experience with God before I received the Holy Ghost. Now, I am not saying I was born again, for I was not. I believe the new birth is the baptism of the Holy Ghost and baptism in Jesus Name. If a person lacks either one of the two he has not experienced John 3:5. However, I do believe there is an experience that precedes the baptism of the Holy Spirit. For I do not look upon those at my altar tarrying for the Holy Ghost as sinners but as people that have been made righteous through repentance and baptism in Jesus Name.

When a man is baptized in Jesus Name he has a right to look forward to something happening in his life. Something does happen. The Bible talks of having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience. I surely believe something happens to our conscience when we are baptized in Jesus Name for I believe

that primarily all the work that God does is an inward work. It is for the mind, soul, the heart, the spirit and salvation and redemption of the inward man. The blood of Jesus Christ does purge our conscience from dead works to serve the living God, not gods, but God. It has done something for me that makes me to know there is only one true and living God. This is the great difference between those who believe in the Oneness of God and those that believe in the Trinity of Gods, for with the baptism in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ there comes the revelation of the mighty God in Christ, who is One and His Name is One — Jesus. How happy we should be that this glorious name has been revealed that we might have our sins remitted (or blotted out) forever.
