

LET'S GET Acquainted

In starting the "Let's Get Acquainted" page this month, we present the photo, and a short sketch of the life of our newly elected General Chairman, Elder W. T. Witherspoon, Pastor of the Apostolic Gospel Church of Columbus, Ohio. He also has held the offices of Presbyter, and Chairman of our Foreign Missionary Board since the forming of the Pentecostal Assemblies of Iesus Christ.

Elder Witherspoon turned to God in a Methodist Episcopal Church in Pittsburgh, Pa., thirty-seven years ago, and from that experience, he followed God into the Christian and Missionary Alliance, and from there into the Pentecostal Church, receiving the Baptism of the Holy Ghost in 1912. His business connections brought him to Columbus, Ohio, in 1914, and the following year he received the revelation of the oneness of the God-

head and was baptized in Jesus' Name. At that time he was definitely called to the ministry. In the year 1917, he founded the church of which he is now Pastor. The church has grown from about fifteen members to approximately 500 at the headquarters in Colum-

bus, with five branches in surrounding towns. Elder Witherspoon refuses to take any credit for this work, but says that anyone who is really called into the ministry can be successful if he will put his whole life into his work, and walk by the Word. He continued in his commercial position for seven years after he founded the church, refusing to receive offerings until such could be given without burdening the people. The activities of the church include regular Bible Readings, Saints' Meetings, Evangelistic Services, editing a paper (The Apostolic Messenger), printing hundreds of thousands of tracts, and broadcasting each Sunday for about six years. If Elder Witherspoon has a "hobby" in God's work, it is Church Order. He contends that the disordered condition of this blessed movement is largely because we have given little or no

attention to setting our churches in order according to the Word. Therefore, God has blessed in many places, but has built in very few.

Our new General Chairman begs the prayers of all our Outlook readers.

★ ABOVE ALL HOLIDAYS, seasons, or birthdays, Christmas thrills us most. It should, rightfully, as it represents the birthday of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Now, after nineteen hundred years from that blessed event in Bethlehem, we still feel that influence upon us, not only individually, but nationally. People seem to forget their grudges; smiles break through where frowns have prevailed, the spirit of good-will overshadows the desire for personal gain, and even business loses its cold "dollar-and-cents" attitude as shoppers go about buying presents for the joy and satisfaction of doing something for others.

The joy of Christmas is not in receiving, but in giv-That principle was confirmed by the Lord, Himself, when He so loved that He came to this earth that men might be saved from sin. THE Latter Rain

By Eld. W. T. Witherspoon

"THEREFORE, ALSO, NOW, saith the Lord, turn ye even to me with all your heart, and with fasting, and with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repenteth Him of the evil. Who knoweth if He will return and repent and leave a blessing behind Him; even a meat offering and a drink offering unto the Lord your God? . . . Be glad, then, ye children of Zion, and rejoice in the Lord your God; for He hath given you the former rain moderately, and He will cause to come down for you the rain, the former rain, and the latter rain in the first month. . . . And \boldsymbol{I} will restore to you the years that the locusts hath eaten, the cankerworm, and the caterpillar, and the palmerworm, my great army which I sent among you. And we shall eat in plenty, and be satisfied, and praise the name of the Lord your God, that hath dealt wondrously with you; and my people shall never be ashamed. And ye shall know that I am in the midst of Israel, and that I am the Lord your God, and none else; and my people shall never be ashamed. And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out My Spirit upon all flesh. . . . And I will show wonders in the heavens and in the earth, blood, and fire, and pillars of smoke. . . . And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the Name of the Lord shall be delivered; for in Mount Zion and in Jerusalem shall be deliverance, as the Lord hath said, and in the remnant whom the Lord shall call."



★ Some time ago I was led to read Peter's sermon on the day of Pentecost, and to note that he quoted the 2nd chapter of Joel to prove that this strange thing that happened on the day of Pentecost, namely, an outpouring of God's Spirit, was Scriptural. We were much interested, and somewhat surprised to note how little of this chapter Peter quoted. He picked out a very small portion of it, sufficient to prove that it was God's will in the last days to give His Spirit to all His true children, and make them prophets, instead of just to certain chosen prophets. I have quoted just enough of the chapter to prove the point I wish to bring out, but the matter will be made more clear if you read the entire chapter. It is quite evident that there was a good reason for Peter quoting only a small portion of the chapter. In the first place, the portion he quoted was quite sufficient to prove that the manifestation was of God; and in the second place, the balance of the chapter could not possibly have applied to the day of Pentecost. Notice carefully that the Word says "that it shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out My Spirit upon all flesh." If you want to know what the final fulfillment of this great promise is to follow, you will have to read the entire 1st and 2nd chapters of Joel; and if you want to know what is to immediately follow the fulfillment of the outpouring promise, please read the 3rd chapter.

The 1st chapter, whether we like it or not, pictures accurately the condition of the Holy Ghost church today, with no reference whatever to the denominational churches, who are not addressed in God's Word at all, but are finally judged "according to truth." Notice how the OLD men are admonished to hear, and we older

men and women in this movement must wake up. Next. comes a list of things which have spoiled God's vineyard. I am sure if time and space permitted, that we would get great help from a study of the characteristics of cankerworms, palmerworms, locusts, and caterpillars. Doubtless, the characteristics of these destroyers would give us an accurate picture of the things that have destroyed God's vineyard. The bitterness, division, enmity, backbiting, pride, jealousy, preeminence-seeking, prejudice, secret sin, worldliness, etc., etc. Notice the 8th verse: "Lament like a virgin for the husband of her youth," i.e., that sweet, close relationship we had with Him. And then on down to the 14th verse, he continues to show that the children of God are starving to death for the rich meat of God's Word, mingled with the drink offering, i.e., the wine, which is the anointing of the Spirit. From the 14th verse to the end of the chapter, he commands that a fast be called, and a solemn assembly—those who are under a burden for the seriousness of the situation. He mentions especially that the elders should be called to the house of the Lord, and there they are to be reminded that "the day of the Lord is at hand, and as a destruction from the Almighty shall it come; also, that joy and gladness are cut off from the house of the Lord." I never saw so much sadness among God's people, and so little joy. I grant you there is a great deal of shallow expression, which ofttimes is just an attempt to prove our victory, but it is a poor substitute for the real. "The seed is rotten under their clods." Thousands of both saints and sinners have heard the Word and know it, but it lies dormant in their minds, and is waiting the rain from heaven.

In the 2nd chapter, Joel commands that a trumpet be blown in Zion (the church). The trumpet blown in Zion will make the inhabitants of the land tremble, and will remind them that the terrible day of the Lord is at hand. Then, down to the 12th verse, this terrible day is pictured, when it will be too late for the church to arouse herself, for it is the tribulation period.

Beginning with the 12th verse of the 2nd chapter. down to the 18th verse, he instructs the church what she shall do to stop the heathen saying, "Where is thy God?" Beginning with the 18th verse, the Lord shows what He will do if we obey His instructions. He will even restore the years that the destructive worms have spoiled, telling us that the FORMER RAIN was given us MODERATELY, and that He will cause the LATTER RAIN to come down. And after our restoration to the favor and power of God, notice the result in the 26th verse: "And ye shall eat in plenty, and be satisfied, and praise the NAME OF THE LORD YOUR GOD, that hath dealt wondrously with you, and My people shall never be ashamed." As individuals, we are not ashamed of our experience; but as a body, as a church, as a movement, are we not ashamed? Is the world not saying, "Where is your God"? Is there the difference between us and those who do not have the Holy Ghost, that there should be? In many cases, have we anything more to show forth to the world than the denominational church, except tongues? I am a one hundred per cent Jesus Name-Pentecostal—New Birth minister, and believe we should continue to tell our doctrine to the world, but acknowledge our condition to God.

The Invasion From Mars

Explanatory announcements during the one-hour program were for some cause overlooked by multiplied thousands of listeners, as the simulated news bulletins, which accompanied the CBS dramatization of H. In Dayton, Ohio, a woman rushed into a neighbor's house and reported the end of the world according to the radio, and the whole neighborhood was excited. In Toledo, Ohio, a number of persons fainted at the telephone while trying to call police. In Indianapolis, Indiana, a woman ran into a Methodist Church, screaming hysterically, "New York destroyed! It's the end of the world! You might as well go home and die! I just heard it on the radio." Services were dismissed immediately. In Asheville, N. C., five boys fainted as pandemonium reigned on the campus for half-an-hour as students believed the world was coming to an end.

THEY SHALL Recover

★ IN THE BOOK OF JUDE we read these words, "Beloved, When I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should EARNESTLY CONTEND for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." Without a doubt, divine healing was a part of the faith once delivered to the saints. This important matter of being healed by the power of God has been crowded out of many lives for various reasons, but nevertheless the Bible still stands with this wonderful promise in it, beckoning us, may I say, challenging us, that "these signs shall follow them that believe." The last sign of the group of five, recorded in Mark 16:18 is that, "they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover." So, as long as there are those on earth that believe God, and in and through His Name, count the promises, "yea and amen," then God will still answer prayer in the matter of DIVINE HEALING. We are not setting ourselves up as perfect examples by any means; as a matter of fact, there have been more cases of sickness in our church than usual. Some have been healed by prayer, but many have not. It seems as though a challenge has been laid at our door, either to believe God and preach and practice divine healing, stronger than ever, or acknowledge defeat and cease mentioning this wonderful promise of God. The number of sick in our midst is most assuredly multiplied many times throughout the land. This much is certain-far too many of God's people are afflicted without apparent healing. We believe it to be more than just a "happenstance." It is a direct challenge from the enemy to the Church of the Living God, whether we are willing to pay the price by suffering and consecration until God restores the touch of healing in our ranks to a much larger degree than at present, or whether we will retreat from the Bible strongholds and concede that the modern way for healing is through the "arm of flesh." Hundreds of God's people are on beds of sickness, many have been forced to go under the surgeon's knife, and others are in hospitals without the slightest touch of healing from heaven.

A BETTER WAY

This is not written in a spirit of controversy with medical science. We are certainly not opposed to the medical profession; on the contrary, we need to pray for them, because of their unselfish acts of mercy. people of the world would certainly be faced with a major calamity if these institutions were suddenly abolished, or rendered useless. We do not have any idea that such a multitude will turn to God for deliverance from sickness that there would be any noticeable competition with the medical profession. Their institutions are already overtaxed and no doubt, with sin and disease on the increase, they will continue to be so. Our conviction is that there is a BETTER WAY for the child of God. But that BETTER WAY will not be made available to the hundreds in our ranks, until there are enough of us aroused to the seriousness of this condition, and are willing to suffer for one another. Awakened to this, we will "earnestly contend for the faith" that brought health and happiness to thousands in days gone by. We are not unmindful that many are being healed and we rejoice with them, but looking at our Pentecostal picture as a whole, those cases of unusual healing are rather remote and isolated. From reports reaching our desk, it seems that many places are struggling under the load of sickness and very little concentrated effort is being put forth to reëstablish the power of Divine Healing in our movement.

MUST THE LORD TURN TO ANOTHER PEOPLE?

We talked to a brother a few days ago along the lines of Divine Healing. He had been afflicted for many years. Recently, when he was baptized in Jesus' Name and prayed for, God gave him a definite touch in his body, so that he now can walk around and enjoy life much more. He is certainly of greater service in God's kingdom than he previously was. Although Divine Healing was preached in the church he formerly attended, the power of God was so lacking that he lost all desire to be prayed for. Needless to say there were few, if any, being healed. That particular church had, until recent years, witnessed a multitude of healings.

May God help us in this Apostolic Pentecostal movement to seek the Lord so that He will not remove His Healing Hand from our churches and be forced to gather out another group of people for His Name's sake! The many cases of sickness in our churches without definite healing is a direct challenge to this movement.

"Contending for the faith" entails much more than just offering a fervent prayer while anointing the sick with oil. As a matter of fact, the power that comes with Divine Healing is based, not so much on what is said while praying for the sick, but the sacrificial suffering and life lived by the church as well as the Elders, BEFORE the sick are prayed for. The same applies to those seeking for the baptism of the Holy Ghost. It is the preparation before they come to the altar to seek God, both on the part of the one seeking to be filled, and the mother church. Friends, it is going to take a willingness to suffer, through consecrated prayer and fasting in a much larger scale than is being practiced at the present time, to obtain God's best in our lives. A few, here and there, are willing to deny themselves, but our movement, as a whole, does not have a real burden for the sick. One of the Devil's most subtle ways of driving a wedge into our churches is to lull us to sleep with the statement that we are far ahead of other movements, or that Jesus is coming so soon, that we do not need to go down on our faces before God for the sick, or to further deepen our consecration in this matter, for the time is too short. There are also many who pray half-heartedly for they suspicion that if the ill person is not healed, there must be something wrong in his life, and it is God's punishment on him for disobedience. We get stirred if someone is about to die, but should they pass the crisis, we relax in prayer, and while we are doing so, many times the enemy's forces again attack the weakened body of our brother or sister and snuff out their lives.

We willingly spend time and money to attend the funeral and show our Christian respects, but I am wondering how many LESS funerals we would have if a goodly percentage of those who attended the funeral service, would have previously come to church and earnestly poured out their hearts to God for a restoring of the old time power. That power that caused people

to leap from their beds, throw away their crutches and canes, see for the first time the light of day through eyes which had been sightless, and hear for the first time, voices and music. Friends, God is the same, yesterday, today, and forever! However, He works only when we are willing to take up our cross and help the sick bear their burden. We Jesus' Name Pentecostal people, as we are so-called, should of all people benefit from the experiences of God's move in other churches during days gone by. There is no doubt that if we neglect these precious promises of God and allow ourselves to be rocked to sleep in the cradle of indifference, we will receive the most severe judgment of all. We are without excuse. We have both the Old and New Testaments. We also have a historical record of God's dealing with church movements from the time of Pentecost until now. We know why the numerous churches suceeded and failed, why they rose and fell, why the power of God was once with them, and why today they are either gone entirely from the religious picture, or, at best, are a shell of their former spiritual power.

It is easy for a church, a group, or an individual to "let down" in these last days. It is much easier to go through a form of prayer than to exert any real effort until you feel definitely that you have prayed through. Growing careless in our regard for the reality there is in Divine Healing, is just one more sign that the last days are upon us—days of indifference, and lack of enthusiasm for the house of God and the promises of God. It takes real effort to pray. Jesus spent entire nights in prayer. In the garden He prayed until great beads of perspiration stood out on His brow like drops of blood. Friends, that prayer was more than a few mumbled sentences in repetition. How long has it been since you went to God with a burden for some sick one?

Here is something to remember: there is an ironclad law in this earth, and it is this: in order to accomplish what you plan to do, it is necessary to have a sustained determination, whether the circumstances be favorable to its accomplishment or not. That law applies to the farmer because no matter how thoroughly his garden or field is cultivated, a constant warfare must be waged against weeds, or the harvest will surely be small and perhaps a total failure. It also applies to a builder in the same manner. He must continually make repairs on his house, or it will deteriorate rapidly in a few years and be in ruins. And so on in life, the rule is that you lose unless you constantly strive for the goal. The things of God offer no exception. saved, always saved" is soothing ointment, but will not stand the thorough test of God's Word, for the Bible states clearly that "he that shall endure to the end, the same shall be saved" and again, "if any man draw back my soul will have no pleasure in him." This same rule applies to Divine Healing. We must be continually seeking God, and be willing to fast and pray for others that this wonderful promise might be kept in our midst.

WITH HIS STRIPES, WE ARE HEALED

Isaiah 53:3: "He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed." His stripes were accompanied by cruel criticisms, mockings and scoffings, slaps in the face, cursings, lashings, the burden of the sins of others, self-imposed fasting, and long hours of prayer. These things He suffered before He was crucified in order that we might be healed. The stripes were for our healing. His death on the cross and the final shedding of His precious blood was for our redemption. However, if

we expect to partake of that redemption or salvation, we must be born again, which means to us, old-fashioned repentance, water immersion in the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the infilling of the Holy Ghost, with the evidence of speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance. Acts 2:4. We would not think of claiming salvation without doing our part in obedience to His Word. Then we should not, on the other hand, be surprised at the lack of Divine Healing unless we are willing to suffer with him. If we expect to see people healed by the power of God in any marked degree then we must be willing to share some of His stripes.

PRAYER AND FASTING

It is surprising how little fasting and prayer is taking place in our ranks. The reason is, of course, that these mean self-denial and humbling our flesh. through the New Testament and see how many were healed through fasting. How much more God could do with us if we were willing to deny ourselves and suffer a few stripes for His Name's Sake that others might be healed! Let us pray and fast one for another, instead of saying that sickness is always a direct judgment of God upon the afflicted one. This cannot be true as some of the BEST of God's people are ill. If that were God's only method of dealing with us for our shortcomings, we would all be sick, for "if the Lord should mark iniquity who would stand?" us also pray and fast one for another instead of assuming that a sickness is his or her "thorn in the flesh," or quoting indifferently "many are the afflictions of the righteous" and that "it is a normal condition to have a certain amount of sickness." It may be that there will always be some afflictions in our midst, but we have far too many. Lack of Divine Healing is a direct challenge, friends, to this movement. Many are afflicted and some are passing away that surely would not need to go at this time, if enough of us get thoroughly aroused about this matter. Would it not be unfair for God to pour out His gifts on a church that was not hungering for them? Would not Divine Healing be taken lightly, and receive little appreciation if it were given lavishly to a church that could not be touched by the infirmities of others? The challenge is laid at our door. Will we do our part? If so, THEY SHALL RECOVER!

Fresh News From The Field

★ WE ARE SORRY that a misunderstanding of the time the last issue of the OUTLOOK was to come out caused us to miss our Bulletin. We do not know that there ever was a time when our missionaries needed help so much as now.

JAPAN: We are presenting this field first this month, as distressing conditions, due to war, have put a very heavy burden on our already over-worked missionary, Bro. Coote. The people of many countries are sympathizing with China, and we are very sorry to learn that prejudice against Japan has evidently gotten among the saints, to the extent of their withholding offerings to help Bro. Coote. Whatever might be said for or against the warring nations, we must remember that Jesus said "Go ye into ALL the world." Bro. Coote is working desperately to make his depleted support cover his territory, and is trying to keep from retrenching. We should come to his rescue and send larger offerings to Japan, regardless of political questions.

CHINA: We surely have some real warriors in this war-ridden country. Bro. Bullock and his co-laborers are fighting valiantly against the usual opposition the missionary encounters, plus the very unusual hardships of war. It appears, also, that they are having unusual fruit, both as to quantity and quality. They are coöperating with the other efficient missionaries, Bro. Hensley, and Bro. and Sister Sheets. What could such workers as these do if the saints at home would discharge their obligation to the mission fields!

We are also getting good reports from those valiant warriors, dear Sister Iry, and dear Sister Stieglitz. It takes more than war to stop these consecrated handmaidens of the Lord. Sister Iry is very desirous of having a Bible School in her station, and is calling for efficient helpers. Who will go?

AFRICA: Bro. and Sister Holmes report some very good revival meetings in Monrovia and in the Zordee Station. You will remember that they are looking to the home organizations to raise money to come home on a much needed furlough. Thus far, the amount sent in is not encouraging. It is just as necessary to bring tired missionaries home as it is to send new ones out.

INDIA: Our aged Sister McCarty, who has given so much of her life to the work of God in this dark country, recently sent a special appeal for emergency funds, made necessary by terrible floods, which have caused much suffering and loss of life. When we think of this precious woman sleeping outside, and suffering privations, it stirs us to ask you to double your missionary offering.

HILO: Bro. Stiles is continuing his aggressive work and his letters are always refreshing. Bro. Stiles makes an appeal for workers to help him. He needs a man and wife able to sing and play and do street work. He



is ill in body and is putting up a hard fight for the truth. Pray for Bro. Stiles and help in any way you can.

JERUSALEM: Bro. T. D. Urshan writes us from Beyrouth, where he had gone recently for a missionary trip. Bro. Urshan has no place of worship now on account of lack of funds, but is doing street and personal work. Surely God would be pleased to save many in the City of David, if we could better support our missionaries there.

Letters from Bro. W. L. Hull tell of his determined effort to present to Jerusalem the Christ which she rejected. We knew Bro. Hull in Capada, and know something of the great sacrifice he and his family made to get to the fields. Saints with the ability and consecration of the Hull family should have the wholehearted support of the saints in the homeland.

ESTHONIA: We feel that the small offerings we are able to send to dear Bro. and Sister Sikora are well spent, indeed. These faithful saints are surely pressing the battle on behalf of the present truth. Their letters breathe such a spirit of consecration and faith as should shame us in the homeland, who have such favorable surroundings.

IRAQ: We have two letters from our young missionary in Bagdad, Bro. Youkhanan. His persistent efforts for the truth are attracting hungry hearts and stirring the devil. He is receiving many calls to take the good news to outlying districts, but is hindered on account of lack of funds and help. The intense heat of the last summer caused many deaths there, and many thousands left for cooler places, but our faithful missionary kept right on. The least we could do for such workers is to double their support and pray earnestly for them.

SYRIA: Our hearts have been very much stirred by a number of letters from our very aggressive Syrian missionary, Bro. Peter Isaac. He has had to endure some old time Bible persecution for the truth, being driven out of town, and even beaten, because of preaching Jesus. He has a vision of organizing his territory for more efficient work. He is very anxious to start a Bible School, and to take much territory for this truth, which is now open, but may not remain so long. Here is one of the best opportunities we know of for an investment for the work of the Lord; but what we do, we must do quickly!

IDENTITY WITH CHRIST

★ "For in that He died, He died unto sin once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God . . . Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord."

We are nearing the end time and prophecy is being fulfilled before our eyes with amazing rapidity. The days of the apostasy are upon us. We are truly hastening on to the final consummation and the conflict of the ages which was spoken by the holy prophets of old.

the ages which was spoken by the holy prophets of old. We hear many of God's saints today say, "It is so hard to pray. It seems that the powers of darkness are so strong!" Because of this, many are becoming discouraged and downhearted, and are fainting and falling by the wayside. It is true that sin is abounding on every hand, "and because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold." These are undeniable facts, yet Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today, and forever. On the other hand, even though sin is abounding on every hand, we read, "where sin abounded, grace did much more abound, that as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord." This is truly wonderful, for if I understand this verse correctly, I believe the Apostle is endeavoring to convey to our minds that to the extent that sin reigned and had power, authority, dominion and rulership under the law, even so to that extent grace reigns through righteousness under this present dispensation. In other words, sin has been dethroned and grace takes the place of sin upon the throne.

Some one has said, "A good definition for grace is, 'the love of God in action." "For by grace are ye saved through faith, and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should

boast." Eph. 2:8, 9.

We see then, that under the law, sin reigned. Paul says the law was holy, just, good and spiritual, but—"I am carnal, sold under sin." The law could not deliver from sin. The law said, "po!" but gave not the

power to do. The law was to show us the exceeding sinfullness of sin, but we were powerless to help or deliver ourselves from sin in the least degree. "Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in His sight . . ." Rom. 3:20. Paul also says that, ". . . for if there had been a law given which could have given life, verily righteousness should have been by the law. But the scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe. Wherefore the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster. For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ." Gal. 3:21-28.

Let us hear then the conclusion of the matter. Christ Jesus is the solution to the sin problem. The sinless One has conquered sin. We read, "For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh: That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit." Rom. 8:3, 4. At Calvary, the sinless One identified Himself with the sinful ones. Isaiah 53:12. He died the shameful and ignominious death of the cross, not as a martyr, but as a transgressor. He won the victory. Thank God! He won the victory, not for Himself, but for you, my friend. He spoiled principalities and powers and made a show of them openly, triumphing over them in it. He identified Himself with you in your sin, that you might be identified with Him in His victory. Do you see it? These are days when we fully need to know the basis of our victory and how to intelligently by faith take our position in Christ, in order to make that victory an everyday experience.

Please note that it was after the great call to repentance, and the restoration of the worm-eaten years, and the joy of the Lord, that God said He would pour out His Spirit. This could not possibly mean the day of Pentecost 2000 years ago. That was the beginning,—not a restoration. A few thousand Israelites were born again, but Israel as a nation sank into greater darkness than ever.

Notice, also, that after the promise of the outpouring in the 28th verse of the 2nd chapter, terrible signs were to follow in the heavens and in the earth,—"before the great and terrible day of the Lord." History records a partial fulfillment of this prophecy, just as sacred history records a partial fulfillment of the promise of the great outpouring, but it could not possibly be construed as the complete fulfillment. It would also seem to be misleading if the outpouring 2000 years ago was spoken of as being before the great and terrible day of the Lord. The language would seem to indicate IMMEDIATELY before. Some may argue that the present out-

pouring, which has been for the last 35 years, is here meant, but I verily believe that this has been just the droppings before a great universal shower. This outpouring has been wonderful, and thousands have received the real baptism of the Holy Ghost and the revelation of His name, but we must admit that it has largely been done in a corner, because we have as yet manifested but very little of the real Apostolic power and gifts. We will have to admit that Peter's shadow had more power than most of our entire conventions, or ministerial gatherings. In saying this, I am in no sense criticizing my brethren, but I am acknowledging our weakness before God, and trying to arouse the brethren of like precious faith to see that God is really speaking, and we must call a solemn assembly quickly.

Brethren, I feel that God has truly spoken to us and that He will arouse you to do your part in every way possible to bring about in the church a great revival of repentance, confession, and restitution, so that God will be pleased with us, and will heal our backslidings and allow us to have a part in the final glorious triumph of the Gospel, when He shall gather out a

Many fought for telephones to inform parents to come and get them. In Atlanta, Georgia, people gathered in groups praying. In Boston, Massachusetts, many left home saying, "We are getting out of here." One woman declared she could see the fire. In Providence, R. I., weeping and hysterical women swamped the switchboard of the Providence *fournal*, and the city electric officials received numerous calls from people asking them to turn off the city lights so as to be safe from attack. In New York City apartment houses were emptied hurriedly, and groups gathered praying for salvation. In Concrete, Washington, a town of a thousand people, the town lights went out, at a high point in the program, and many thought the invasion had reached the west coast. Women fainted and were prepared to take their families to the mountains.

Telegraph companies reported that they were delivering telegrams from as far distant places as California, inquiring of the fate of relatives. The telephone company reported that rarely had it handled so many calls in such a short time. In fact, this sort of atmosphere was general all over the country. Why? Because of the spirit of unrest and extreme sinfulness that the world is in today. Things are happening over night in these last days and "men's hearts are failing them for fear." Depressions and war have wrought perilous times upon the earth. Such things are last day indications, and men the world over will do well to make preparation for the Second Coming of Christ Jesus. Having heard the broadcast, I was not alarmed because of the "Deep Settled Peace in my Soul." May these things help God's people to be ready; "for in such an hour as ye think not, the Son of Man cometh." Amen.

"Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6.

★ CHILDREN, it will not be long now till Christmas comes. Christmas is celebrated as the birthday of our dear Lord Jesus. Your parents and Sunday School teachers will tell you about how he was born in a manger in the village of Bethlehem. His father and mother had to sleep in the stable because there was no room for them in the inn. You children that have warm homes and soft, little beds to sleep in can scarcely know what it would be like to keep a baby in a manger. If the people had known who Jesus was, no doubt they would have taken him to the very best place in the village, but Jesus slept in the stable where they kept the oxen and the sheep. Only a few people there knew that He was Jesus, the Saviour of the world. Among them, were some shepherds who were watching their flocks by night out on the Judean hills. In the book of Luke we read how the angel of the Lord appeared to the shepherds and said, "Fear not; for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord." Everybody remembers Bethlehem because it was the place where Christ was born.

But in this story, we want to tell you about another man who lived in Bethlehem. He was David, the shepherd boy, who became king of Israel. He had kept his sheep on these same hills, long, long before. It was because he lived here, that Bethlehem was called the City of David.

David was not born to be a king. Today, only a boy that is born in a king's family can ever be a king. In David's time, God picked the man that he wanted to

be king. At this time Saul was king. God had shown Samuel, the prophet, that he had chosen Saul to be the first king of Israel. He was very humble at first and did what Samuel told him that God wanted him to do. But when he grew older, he disobeyed God and became a very, very bad king. God then told Samuel that he was sorry that he had made Saul king, and that he should go to Bethlehem and anoint David to be king.

One day, David's father and all his brothers were at a great feast in Bethlehem. They were glad to go because Samuel, the great prophet, was there. David was the youngest boy and was left at home to care for the sheep. He was out on the beautiful, green hills with his flock. He wasn't very busy for the sheep had plenty of grass and lay down when they had enough to eat. While the sheep were resting, David played on his harp and sang songs. 
