

THOU SHALT NOT COMPROMISE!

★ Shall we compromise or mutually agree with Satan that he is perhaps, half right? Shall we join hands with our common foe and concede that right and wrong, or that light and darkness can blend, or that dead formal church worship can walk side by side with the Church of the living god? Is there anywhere on Satan's territory where there might be a blending of righteous and evil ideas sufficient to dull our righteous enthusiasm for this glorious gospel? No Never!

The Last Days Are Upon Us

Bible Christians are being assailed as never before by the forces of darkness to compromise. The adversary has learned that Holy Ghost-filled people can no longer be crushed by sheer force. Therefore, he has turned, and is using cunning craftiness and subtilty upon those who are ignorant of his devices. Satan cares little for our Christian profession when it does not contain an earnest contention for apostolic church worship and apostolic church results. How he loves to steal along the religious pathway and rob an acknowledged saint of their prayer life, until they cool off and are not in living, vital touch with their Saviour. Then how he mocks at their lowered standard and their failure of being saintly!

Apostolic Worship

1 Corinthians 14:26 . . . tells us how the HOLY GHOST operates in and through the members of an assembly which worships God in Spirit and in truth. This standard is for a Church that has not COMPROMISED, but holds fast to her first love. Please note carefully:

". . . brethren, when ye come together EVERY ONE OF you hath a psalm" (song). Not just a few are expected to sing according to the Scriptures, but ALL the congregation. When even people of the world turn to music and singing to drive away their troubles, HOW MUCH MORE should we, as children of God receive the wonderful benefits of song? You say, "I would not think of compromising on the Apostolic message BUT you ARE compromising if you fail to sing, when it is time to sing, God's praises in the church. One of the first signs of "cooling off" is to lose an interest in this part of the service. Some might say "I can't sing" but the Lord knew we would not all have good voices, so he instructs—"Make a joyful noise unto the Lord" (Psalms 95:1). The strength that comes from worshipping the Lord in song is unlimited. Whether the song is fast or slow, whether it is started spontaneously or a called number from the song book, makes little difference. It is the HEART BACK OF IT. The JOY of the LORD is the strength of HIS PEOPLE. We are expected to get this JOY from Worshipping HIM, not by Compromising with the pleasures of the WORLD. Thousands have been drawn to God through the songs of the saints.

The Minister's Part

"... Hath a DOCTRINE." That is the minister's portion. A man of God must study to show himself approved, seek God for His will in order to give an in-

spired message to the people. He must shun pride and keep humble before the Lord. This kind of ministry, backed up by an assembly that will hold up his hands and refuse to COMPROMISE in the other phases of Church worship, is bound to cause that Church to go forward and to grow.

Gift of Tongues and Interpretation

"... Hath a tongue, hath an interpretation." There is no doubt that there are several in every holy ghost-filled Church that have one or both of these gifts. Those that have them and quench the spirit (by refusing to walk close enough the Lord that these powers might be manifested in the assembly) ... are ... compromising. Paul included a message in tongues and its interpretation in the service of a Holy Ghost-filled assembly. Stir up whatever gift God has given you. Seek the Lord and don't give place to discouragement. Every member is needed to push the battle to the gate.

Prophecy

1 Cor. 14:1 "... but rather that we may prophecy." ... Rev. 19:10 ... Worship god, "for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy. This is one of the most abused phases of modern worship because of its lack of proper use. Joel wrote (2:38) "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophecy" . . . What does this mean? God's word tell us plainly (1 Cor. 14:3) . . . he that prophesieth speaketh unto men to (1) edifi-CATION; (2) EXHORTATION; (3) COMFORT." It means testifying to something that will edify the Church, an exhortation to praise God "while going through the valley" or to trust him for healing; or a testimony of comfort, something that will encourage others and comfort them. Soxe are given this (Prophecy) as a special GIFT after they have received the HOLY GHOST according to Acts 2:4. Prophecy is one of the Nine GIFTS promised to believers in 1 Cor. 12:8-10. Those possessing this gift can be used as a mighty power in the Church. We all, however, can testify up to the ability God has given us, even if we do not possess PROPHECY as a SUPER-POWER or GIFT. In the same manner, God gives some the GIFT of FAITH OR WISDOM. We may or may not receive any of these GIFTS after receiving the Holy Ghost, but we all have some faith, wisdom and prophecy (testimony), and must use it for his glory. You perhaps would never go back on the wonderful apostolic message but when you know you should testify and DON'T, you are COM-PROMISING. The very next time you feel a force trying to keep you from rising to give God the glory, recognize that power as none other than the Devil, trying to steal your touch of God and rob others of the good of your testimony.

Prayer Time

1 Cor. 11:4 ". . . EVERY MAN PRAYING" (not just the minister). If the Devil can get us to COMPROMISE at PRAYER TIME he is almost sure to "tie up" the (Page 20, please)



FORGIVING ONE ANOTHER

"Forbearing one another and forgiving one another if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye." Col. 3:13

What a timely Apostolic exhortation for the people of God in these last days! What a challenge to the followers of Jesus Christ! "Even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye." In the believer's life of grace, forgiveness is one of the first blessings we receive from God. With it, we receive a promise for

many spiritual blessings and gifts prepared for us in Jesus Christ. Forgiveness opens doors from the prison life of sin and bondage, and leads to the new abundant life in Christ Jesus. It is a source of inspiration to the redeemed saint who can never forget that he is a forgiven sinner, and daily gives praise to God from within accompanied with an exhortation to his soul, "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: Who forgiveth all thine iniquities. . . . " Psalms 103:3.

How marvelous is God's forgiving love! What a blessing and an unspeakable joy for the one that has been forgiven. When forgiveness is received it is not only to deliver us from punishment and selfishness, but to work in us and through us—from Christ to receive forgiveness, and like Christ—to bestow it on others.

Forgiveness does not stand among people commanding attention and demanding to be ministered unto, nor to humble the offender and exalt self. Forgiveness seeks to give, to minister, to be of use, of help, to remove obstacles that hinder the Word of the Lord, to liberate burdened souls, to do good to others. To forgive as Christ forgave—nothing less will do in His sight. How simple it is, and yet often times it is difficult to accomplish. But what do the lives of experienced Christians sometimes say? Do they say, "Forgiven, yet I cannot forgive?"

We need daily forgiveness. The daily bread of our souls is daily forgiveness, this being manifested in our forgiving others. "But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses." St. Math. 6:15. The object of God's showing mercy to us is not that we may be only forgiven, but that we might be willing to forgive others. Forgiving love must be a ruling principle in the believer's heart and life. Love is a depth which never can be altogether measured, and so is forgiveness.

In Luke 17:3-5, the Lord Jesus impressed upon His

disciples a plain practical duty—that of forgiving each other their offences, and the apostles, feeling how hard it would be for human nature to fulfill this command, said unto the Lord, "Increase our faith." On another occasion, Peter was very anxious to know the limit of forgiving others, and came to Jesus with this question, "Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times?" You know the Lord's answer. What a lesson! We cherish the thought that there is constant forgiveness in God for His people. "But there is forgiveness with Thee." Psalms 130:4. But we limit ourselves to our fellowmen. A sinful and unregenerated heart finds no pleasure in forgiveness, but a surrendered life to the Lord Jesus Christ delights in this joy of forgiving, and discovers that this is Christ's own joy, the joy of angels, also, and of heaven. Brother, have you found this joy? Let us examine ourselves whether or not we stand in the light of Jesus' words concerning forgive-

But how grievously is the law of forgiving love trespassed by professing Christians! How often in our assemblies we may witness zeal for the Apostolic doctrine, both in the pulpit and in the pew; nevertheless, the fruit of the unforgiving spirit is being manifested; the thought of forgiving others even as Christ forgave has never yet taken possession of mind and heart, "as though it were not plain, that not what the offender would do to me, but what Christ has done, must be the rule of my conduct."

Saints! God forgives to manifest His glory in the salvation of sinners. You are called to manifest the same love to those around you. A man who does not forgive others cannot be forgiven himself. We need not to deceive ourselves by thinking we can obtain pardon from God so long as there remains an injury unforgiven by us. If we approach Almighty God with prayer on our lips and have an unforgiving spirit in our hearts we shall only receive the portion of the hypocrite. Blessing given ought to have some return.

How wonderful the Lord Jesus is in His forgiveness to you and to me and to all that call upon His Name. Have you noticed how often and how expressly He has spoken of it?

There is a story of one whose prayer was that he might be permitted to do good so habitually that he would not be conscious of it. Forgiveness which flows out of the heart and life as naturally as fragrance comes from a flower fulfills this timely exhortation, "Even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye."

"I ought not to pronounce judgment on a fellow creature until I know all that enters into his life; until I can measure all the forces of temptation and resistance; until I can give full weight to all the facts in the case. In other words, I am never in a position to judge another."

Oh, what sadness, how much of sorrow, and what awful heavy burdens have been laid upon the once just and happy hearts, because of yielding to this cruel enemy.

MESSAGE OF ISRAEL

EDITOR'S NOTE: The sincere orthodox Jew is without a doubt being persecuted in some foreign lands for his belief in the one true God of the Old Testament. Many of his fellow Jews who are not sincere are also caught in that same net. Even though blinded to the true identity of that one true God and Saviour, Jesus Christ, yet this is a ringing radio appeal for faithfulness. Please read it carefully.

Tonight, I shall address myself to my fellow Jews, and more particularly to the American Jew. This message, like any aspect of Jewish life or the Jewish religion, can most appropriately be given in this public manner within the hearing of all people who desire to listen in. Despite all the sinister efforts of the defamers of Judaism, from time immemorial, to make it appear that there are things coveted and hidden regarding the Jew and his religion, there is nothing that we could or would want to say which cannot be heralded before the entire world. If I, as a rabbi, at any time or in any place desire to speak on Jewish problems to my people, any man or woman of any religion or race may freely hear all that I may have to say. What reaches you over this program, my friends, is not something especially prepared for broadcast and public consumption in that it differs to the slightest degree from what we might speak of in less conspicuous moments. To those of you not of the Jewish group, I extend a hearty invitation to listen, even though my remarks tonight are primarily addressed to the American Iew.

I know full well that Jewish life at this time exists in a frightfully perturbed state. There is no great need to rehearse the reasons for that perturbation. They are all too obvious. The collapse of German and Austrian Jewry, despite their high standards of Germanic patriotism and culture; the abysmal economic and social depths into which Polish Jewry has been thrust; the onward march of Naziism to Czechoslovakia and the spread of Nazi anti-Semitism to Italy; the turmoil in Palestine; the dreadful refugee problems which have arisen as a result of the Central and Eastern European persecutions; and, above all, the alarming increase of anti-Semitic propaganda in democratic countries like America and Canada—these are enough to shake the morale of any group, no matter how accustomed to prejudice and bigotry.

The noteworthy aspect of the entire situation is not how many but comparatively how few Jews have become panic-stricken. Yet, let us be frank to admit that our plight has far from left us untouched among ourselves. Many a Jew is asking himself today worried questions born of our contemporary sufferings. I have had several young couples inquire earnestly whether they ought to bring Jewish children into such a world as now exists, to face the ordeal of sadistic hate. And I know that each and every one of my colleagues has had similar questions hurled at him. Only a few days ago, a Jew who is not by any means a disloyal craven inquired earnestly of me whether it would not have been better for us to have given up the fight long ago and to have accepted assimilation and disintegration when it was offered to us during the centuries past. "Just what is the use of bearing this load of ignominy?" he cried out. "What's the use of being distinctive as a people or a faith if the only result of that distinctiveness is reproach and hate?"

Have I not perhaps unearthed the tenor of questions such as many of you who hear my voice tonight have felt arise of late within your own minds and hearts? I do not blame or censure you. I can well understand your emotional reactions. After all, it is not quite enough to repeat the time-honored cry of defiance, "I'm proud to be a Jew." Amid the tortures of the present, the rehearsal of the glories of our past is not always a sufficient stimulus for us to endure with equanimity the savage attacks of a Hitler or the frustration which our young people must face as they strive in vain to enter certain professional schools or even to get the simplest of clerical or manual positions. It is only natural that some individuals among us should feel despair. It is only natural that they should question the inherent value of those things which, making them different, at the same time seem to make them despised by many other races or creeds.

My answer to you in your perplexity is so simple that it cannot possibly at once disarm your fears. Yet more and more, as you ponder over it, you will see its truth and its significance. The Jew as a people and a faith believes in the moral value of life and civilization. He feels that underlying all the recurrent evils of history, there are a sound and sure meaning and purpose. Otherwise, there is no significance whatsoever to life. The history of the Jew is an affirmation that physical force must ultimately give way to moral courage, and that the triumph of wickedness is but for a day. And even though that day be long, it is in the sight of God but as yesterday when it is past. The spirit of Jewish history, as expressed in the life of the Jewish people and in the faith of the Jewish religion, is that whatever hope exists in the world for true civilization depends on the resistance to physical force and to the hysterical drive toward regimentation, by moral courage and the unvielding will to withstand totalitarianism.

Let us make it all far more specific. Let us suppose there were no Jews in the world today to represent the most crucial challenge to Hitlerism. Would it be a better or a worse world? I am inclined to believe that each and every Jew, realizing that for all his suffering he represents the chief obstacle to a madman's barbarous effort to crush out all individuality, all moral courage, can understand a little more clearly the rôle which we Jews play as servants of God. To those Jews who ask if it were not better that we had assimilated, I ask, "And what would you have it that you or your children would have been? Would you have wanted to be one of the crowd that cheers for a Hitler or would you not rather, for all the suffering it entails, be one of the small but stalwart band who represent the antithesis of Hitlerism? And if Christianity is the avenue of escape you would have adopted, would you be among the Christians who violate their faith by accepting Naziism, or a Christian like Cardinals Faulhaber and

I listened; I read the Bible; I prayed to Jesus to let me be sure. I fought against conviction. I was so miserable, but even with all that, I did not go to the altar for a long time. I continued to pray for guidance, as I had been guilty of doubting. I also had made fun, and all the remarks I had made came back to me. Finally I was convinced that this was the only way.

The saints prayed faithfully for me without any request on my part. They could perceive my condition and the deep anguish of my soul. I thanked God for them. Finally I went to the altar, and I found there a place for repentance and tears. I went again the next night, and there I found Jesus and received the blessed Holy Ghost. THE GOSPELS—THE ACTS—THE EPISTLES

By S. G. Norris

The Church was first established, and the Door of Salvation opened in the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. This fact no one can truthfully deny. The New Testament Church was founded on the day of Pentecost, Acts 2. We follow that original plan of Salvation, therefore we are called Pentecostal. Please remember that the New Testament Church was not founded in the four Gospels. Important as they are,

yet we must go to the Book of Acts to locate the door into the Kingdom of God. Neither can you find the beginning of one single church in the Epistles. These are letters written to churches or individuals who had already experienced the Pentecostal "Born Again" Salvation. If this simple truth will be remembered, no one need ever be confused as to the correct plan of Salvation.

THE GOSPELS

If you are interested in the ministry of Jesus and his wonderful works in laying the foundation for the New Testament Church which was established on the day of Pentecost, then please read the Gospels. Please remember that the Holy Ghost was not yet given; because that Jesus was not yet glorified. The calling of the Gospel Writers is found here and their individual manner in presenting Christ. Some method or form of baptism is suggested by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, and all carry the same weight of authority, but none were ever used, because the Church was not established until after Jesus was crucified, rose from the dead, ascended on high and baptized his followers with the Holy Ghost. Acts 2:4. Don't forget that neither the Gospels nor the Epistles opened the door of salvation. If you are hungry for God's way, you will find it in the book of Acts.

THE BOOK OF ACTS

Matthew, Mark, Luke and John were all present on the day of Pentecost when the Holy Ghost was given. Acts 2. They were all witnesses to Peter's marvelous sermon as he opened the door of salvation. He alone could do this as Christ had given him the "keys." Matt. 16:19. None disputed his plan or authority as their understanding was then opened to the identity of Jesus, i.e. that He was the Mighty God manifest in the flesh. They then realized that He alone was the embodiment of the Holy Spirit which he called His Father. Therefore, there was no argument when Peter demanded that water baptism should be administered in the Name of Jesus Christ. Acts 2:38. Peter also opened the same door of salvation to the Gentiles in Acts 10. The city of Samaria received the plan of salvation by being baptized in the Name of the Lord Jesus and Paul re-baptized the disciples of John the Baptist in that wonderful Name. Acts 19. If you are hungry for God's plan of salvation you will find it in the Book of Acts.

THE EPISTLES

If you wish to read the instructions given to various churches, such as Corinthians and Ephesians, and also to individuals such as Timothy and Titus, then please turn to the Epistles. These were written AFTER they had entered the door of salva-The Churches had been founded in the Book of Acts. Opposers of this Pentecostal truth will attempt to lead their followers astray by referring them to the Epistles instead of holding steadfast to Acts, where the door of salvation is found. Clever clergy, knowing the limited Bible knowledge of the average lay member, can easily keep them from the Pentecostal experience, especially if there is only a luke warm interest on the part of the enquirer. Such Scriptures as "we know we have passed from death unto life because we love the brethren," "Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God" are substituted for Acts 2:38.

The Gift of Tongues mentioned in Paul's EPISTLE to the Corinthian Church (saints) is one of the NINE GIFTS that a saint (not a sinner) ALREADY possessing the Holy Spirit, may or may never receive. No one could possibly receive the Gift of Tongues or any of the nine gifts who had not previously received the Holy Ghost, speaking in other tongues as the Spirit gave utterance. Acts 2:4.

THE conclusion of the matter is this: The Gospels point to the way of Salvation and the Epistles confirm it, but the door of Salvation is found in the Book of Acts. This "Born Again" plan of Salvation, consisting of water immersion in The Name of Jesus Christ and the infilling of The Holy Ghost as evidenced by the

heavenly witness of speaking in other tongues (Acts 2:4, 38), has never been changed since the day of Pentecost. No man dare change it, no, not even an Angel from heaven. The gates of Hell shall not prevail against it. This experience is imperative if you are to be ready for the soon coming of the Lord.

Fear

The age-old theory that the serpent has power to charm birds and small animals has been disproved in recent months by science.

The instinctive fear that birds and small animals have for snakes paralyzes their muscles and prevents their escape.

Thus, we catch a glimpse of what fear will not only do to the animal kingdom but also to the human race. There is but one fear in all the world that proves profitable to man and that is the fear of God.

It is this fear that we have the least of today, but we need it the most, for "the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom." Within the soul of every man there is an instinctive fear of God for which we should be thankful and give vent. All other fear should be suppressed and subdued. It is the serpent's business to fill the human heart with the wrong kind of fear, leaving no place for the fear of God to remain. However, perfect *Love* will cast all such fear from the heart! This is the one and only way in which man can rid himself of the bondage of fear.

Let us, therefore, thank God for this mighty gift of gifts and take advantage of it for the glory of God and for our own lasting benefit both in this world and in the world which is to come. The fear that the natives of Africa have for witch doctors often results in their death; and not what the doctors do. Enchantments are used to produce fear; and fear is used to produce death.

The Master teaches us to only fear the one who retains the power over both the soul and the body.

The fearful soul seldom accomplishes but little in life. The fearless soul seldom suffers defeat.

Let us, therefore, rid ourselves of instinctive fear of evil by a baptism of the Perfect Love of God. Charity never faileth!

Modern Theology

In Danbury, Conn., July 29, a "pray-for-rain" church service in that drouth-stricken area drew the fire of a youthful Baptist clergyman who asserted "let us not confuse religion with magic." The Rev. Jack Matheson, twenty-seven-year-old Yale Divinity School graduate, protested that, "Such action is not consonant with common scientific knowledge." However, twenty-five people gathered in the church to pray for rain; but Rev. Matheson did not attend the service. Instead, he said: "This is a law-abiding universe and rain comes or is withheld due to certain atmospheric conditions. Prayer is not an attempt to control the universe, but a means of living victoriously within its laws. I, therefore, voice my protest in the cause of high, intellectual religion."

Can it be possible that this Yale graduate never read the story of Elijah in his studies at divinity school? The Scriptures declares that: "Elijah was a man subject to like passions as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it might not rain; and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months. And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth brought forth her fruit."

Would we dare discredit this wonderful story in the interest of a higher and more intellectual religion? Could it be that modern theology so misleads us in the matter of prayer? If so, let us therefore pray once more as men did in days gone by, "Lord teach us to pray." Prayer is possibly the most neglected gift in the church today.

God intended that it should be among the greatest and most useful. What are you and I going to do about it, dear brother? My suggestion would be: Let us pray to pray; and then pray that our prayers be not hindered.

It is a privilege to both live and die among a people who know how to pray.

World-Wide Church Union

I was deeply affected by reading the following news from the daily press. I am giving it to you just as I found it in the newspaper. Truly a world-wide move is on foot to bring about a world-wide revival. I believe it will be truly apostolic when it comes. The article is titled "World-Wide Church Union Proposed by Protestants."

"Three hundred and fifty million constituents throughout the world today laid the foundation of a great fellowship of churches, an organization for world-wide church coöperation exceeding, in scope, anything ever before effected.

"Shunning political storms buffeting the world, delegates representing one hundred and thirty denominations from a score of nations drew up the constitution for a world council of churches, a body which would be the most sweeping union of Christian Churches since the Reformation. The constitution draft will go to all participating churches for ratification, accompanied by a letter asking them to join in the organization for the fellowship of churches which accept our Lord Jesus Christ as *God* and *Saviour*; and to send delegates to a proposed council meeting."

May the Lord prepare our hearts and minds for this and other great events, for we are now living in far greater days than the Reformation.

Let us be true to the Truth of the Apostolic faith and God will bless and use us in due time.

India

We have just received the shocking news of the sudden, unexpected death of Sister Peterson. We have no details, but we are sure the loss is keenly felt, and a heavier burden must fall upon the shoulders of our faithful Sister McCarty. It is too late now to help Sister Peterson, but it might be well to ask ourselves the question, "Were we true to her as she went forth and gave her life for the Gospel?" In case of a World War, India will be, of course, involved on the side of England.

Japan

The ill health of two of Brother Coote's children, and his wife's need of a rest, has compelled her to come to the States, bringing the children. We do not know her address, but Brother Coote would be forbidden to send her support if he was able. She should be looked after at once. It is too bad that national prejudice and slanderous stories (which we are convinced are untrue) have cut down the offerings to this needy field.

China

God only knows what has happened, or what may happen any moment to this war-ridden country. It is rumored that Americans are ordered out of Hong-Kong. Cathryn Hendricks has had to come home on account of illness. We rejoice over the report that she has been healed. One thing sure, we should give quick and liberally to the help of our missionaries in China. Some of the best missionaries in the world are there working for this Truth. Space forbids our mentioning each one and their wonderful work. We want to say right here that there is no missionary from China (except Sister Hendricks) who is now in the States who has any connection with the P.A. of J.C. Please write or wire this office before you take up a missionary offering for anyone who is not on our list of missionaries. In this connection, we wish to except Brother and Sister Mc-Cune, if they are yet in the States. We believe they are real servants of God.

Africa

As the Saints perhaps know, Brother and Sister Holmes are in the homeland. They are now in New York. Brother Holmes writes that as soon as Sister Holmes has recovered her health, they will return to their field of labor.

Palestine and Syria

This door, repentance, baptism in Jesus' Name, and the reception of the Holy Ghost was the foundation upon which Paul established the churches to whom many of the "church epistles" were written. The general epistles were all written either to saints everywhere or to a certain person as, Titus, Philemon or John, but in every case, to those who were already in the kingdom of God. Acts, not the epistles, presents the door of salvation.

Innitzer or Pastor Neimoeller who defy the Nazi godlessness and savagery? If you would be the courageous Christian, remember that Pastor Niemoeller languishes today in a Nazi concentration camp, waging in his own heroic manner and with similar suffering the same battle which we Jews wage as an entire people, the battle of a moral and spiritual ideal against bestiality and brute force." My friends, for the true idealist in a world of benightedness and reaction, there is no escape, no matter into what group he might desire to assimilate himself.

Thousands of years ago, the children of Israel had an excellent chance to disappear as a people and a religion. They were taken captive by Babylon. Their Temple had been destroyed, their land laid waste. This had happened to other nations, and those other nations had succumbed to the onward rush of brute force. They disappeared completely. Their names are even less than a vague memory. But fanned by the blasts of prophetic exhortation, the Jew of that era came to the realization that he had to live in order to prove to the world that not the brute strength of a Babylon but the moral force of the Word of God was ultimately to triumph in the world. Many there were, undoubtedly, who would rather have given up the struggle. Many undoubtedly did give up and their names and characters are lost. We Jews are here today as the visible symbols of a moral force in the world, as witnesses of God, to show that not Babylon but Judea held the answer to the values that endure. It has not been an easy course. It is a record of incalculable suffering. But as one views the story of humankind, searching for some ray of hope in the present darkness, it is the moral triumph of spiritual Judea over saber-rattling Babylon which furnishes the only light.

Once more it is our job to live as a witness to God. I can imagine no more horrible thing than that the Jew should succumb to a Hitler. I am sure that I echo the hope of every loyal Christian, of every man and woman who is determined that though darkness envelop the entire world, some spark of the Spirit must be kept alive, that the Jew of today may have the moral courage of his ancestors and live to triumph over the present dire savagery. Not merely that the Jew might live, but that soul of freedom and culture and spiritual ideals might live!

That, my fellow Jews, is our solemn rôle. That is our destiny to which we dare not be faithless. We have been trained for it as though by divine purpose. We, outstandingly among the groups who represent God and moral culture, have been tested for centuries in the fiery furnace of oppression. Perhaps, indeed, it is the act of a divine destiny that we have been tempered as fine steel for the very trial that the world of the spirit must now meet.

Dare we crack under the strain? Dare we be faithless to every value of decency and justice and love which must be preserved through this age of blackness? Yes, the cries of human agony may escape our lips. The pains of mortal travail may lead us in our extremity to ask whether God has forsaken us. But the sense of our significance for that world which will arise

from the present chaos must lead us to grit our teeth and live true to ourselves.

Some day, our children's children and the children's children of all men will enjoy freedom from tyranny and will find mutual love amid honest difference because of what we now endure. You, my brethren, are the symbols of the ultimate defeat of bigotry and hate; of the ultimate triumph of righteousness and peace. Servants are ye, my brethren, of the Lord your God.

than the fire in the woods. Adam and Eve thought SIN was a small matter, so they touched and ate the forbidden fruit. 

A MESSAGE TO SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHERS

Have you been placd in the care of a group of Sunday School children—a class? Do you feel the responsibility of their souls weighing upon you? Are you praying for the salvation of every member of your class? How are you fulfilling your stewardship over this class?

God has required that a steward be faithful. The Sunday School lesson that is given out each week must, of necessity, be alive with spiritual facts and the power of God. While the day school teacher has five days a week, several hours a day, to impress upon the student's mind the studies deemed so necessary—the Sunday School teacher rarely has over half an hour to train the child in the most important study in the wide world—the Word of God.

This, of necessity, requires preparation—daily preparation—days in advance of the lesson. The first step is to read the Bible text of the lesson. The next step is the looking up of references in the Word of God concurrent with the lesson. Next, choose from your carefully planned thoughts on the lesson the truth which seems most essential to your class. Each teacher is alive to the individual needs of each student—whether it be of salvation, encouragement, or the development of a love for the Word of God in order to make it applicable to the child's life. Develop the lesson with such aims in mind; furnish food for every student.

As the teacher gives herself (or himself) to the study of the lesson early in the week, in spite of a life already filled with many duties, he or she will find that the lesson will be bound to develop and grow within the teacher's mind from day to day. Suggestions such as illustrations, chalk talks, drawings, maps, or object

lessons will present themselves to the teacher for use in the lesson.

Let each student have a part in the lesson. Do not try to "do it all." It is said that we remember a small portion of what we hear, a little more of what we see, and practically all of what we po. Let some draw maps, let some speak, let another ask questions. See, then, with what willingness and cheerfulness the students arrive—on time—ready for the lesson.

Do not worry lest you will not be able to use all of the material you have prepared. The more material prepared, the more confidence the teacher has in presenting the lesson. The better prepared the teacher for the lesson—the less likely any stray question from the student will cause an indefinite answer from the teacher to create loss of confidence.

Need we write of the benefit to be obtained from this method of preparing the lesson? If you have obeyed that command, "Study to shew thyself approved," and you are approved, then the effect of daily study, knowing that God's approved must be on your life when each day you are striving to more effectively work at the stewardship he has given you in His kingdom, will mean that your life, too, will breathe forth the message that you are portraying to your students. This gives a double import to the lesson. Unless we can prove by our lives that the Sunday School lessons that we teach each Sunday are of infinite value, they will avail little.

May we give a word of warning? Give ample time to properly conclude or bring to a climax each lesson. Take a few minutes to review the lesson; stress the points that you know your class needs, never forgetting that salvation should be the main theme of every lesson.



THE NAMES OF JOSEPH'S CHILDREN

We have been telling you of Joseph's work and of his wisdom. Now, we will tell you about his life at home.

Joseph was now thirty years old. He was not called Joseph any more because Pharaoh changed his name and gave him a long Egyptian one which meant "a revealer of secrets." People often changed their names when they went to a new country, and do yet today.

Joseph was married to a daughter of one of the Egyptian priests whose name was Asenath. They had two children, both of them boys.

Should we tell you about the names they gave those two boys? They called the oldest one "Manasseh," which meant "forgetful" and the second one "Ephraim" which meant "fruitful." Those are queer names, and you don't meet boys with those names today.

In those days they gave their children names that meant something. The names of their children told about their happiness or their sorrows and troubles at the time the children were born.

The first boy was called Manassch which meant "forgetful." Joseph called him this because God was helping him to forget the trouble of his early life. He had been in slavery and prison and suffered much, but now he was happy.

He called the other boy "Ephraim" meaning "fruitful" because God was blessing him in this strange land. He had work to do that helped everybody in Egypt. He and his wife had a fine home and two good baby boys, so why shouldn't they have been happy?

There were many of the prophets that gave their children names which had a meaning. You might ask your folks to tell you about the boy Ichabod and how he got his name.

We want to tell you of another one who had a name which meant something. Surely, you know Whom we mean; He is Jesus. When the angel gave the glad news about Him, he said, "Thou shalt call His name Jesus for He shall save his people from their sins." A long time before this, the prophet Isaiah had told of another name he should have. It was "Emmanuel" and it meant "God with us." Just as Joseph gave his boys names that told how he had forgotten his troubles and become happy, Mary gave her Child the names that told who He was and what He should do. He was God with us, and He was going to save His people from their sins.

God had always had names like that. We read of many of them in the Old Testament. When He provided for the people they called Him by a name which meant "the Lord will provide." When He healed them they called him "Jehovah, the healer." When He saved them from their enemies, they called Him "the Lord our peace."

They didn't call Him Jesus in the Old Testament be-

cause that means "God our Saviour." But when He came to save He was called Jesus. He wasn't called Emmanuel before, because that meant "God with us," and He had never been with them until Jesus came.

It is wonderful to know about the name of Jesus. Peter told the people that they couldn't be saved by any other name.

You remember that Joseph received a new name in the land where he was a stranger. So it was with God. When he left His home in heaven to come and be with His people, He was a stranger here. When He came, they called Him "Jesus," a name He had never had before.

Some day, we will go to heaven. That will be a new place to us. The Book of Revelation tells us that we will have a new name, too. What name do you think we will have then? Of course, it will be "Jesus," for the Bible tells us that all His children are called by His name and that all the big family of God in the heaven and earth is called by that Name.
