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CHRISTIAN NEGLIGENCE

"My sons, be not now negligent." —2nd Chron. 29:11; Hebrews 2: 1-5.

You are faithful to your job and for fear you might oversleep and miss being on time a day or two, you will thereafter set your alarm clock that it might alarm and arouse you from your sweet (and many times much needed) sleep so that you will neglect your job no more. Why? In most cases your honest living comes from your job, hence you tremblingly hold on to it.

You are still more faithful to your health. If a cold hangs on to you for awhile; if the pain does not diminish as quickly as you think it should; if prayers are not answered as soon as you anticipate they should be; if you are losing sleep; if your appetite is getting dull and you are losing weight, then you are frightened and become worried and alarmingly consult physicians and other help. You mean to be alert and neglect your health no more. Why? Because your life is valuable and sweet to you even though it may be filled with sorrow, labor and disappointments.

Then why not be equally, if not more careful and faithful, about your eternal welfare, about your undying soul, yea, about your Godgiven, blood-bought salvation? Why are you neglecting it by neglecting things pertaining to your great salvation? Do you think you can escape the consequences? Do you think Almighty God will let you keep on playing religion and overlook your neglected duties toward Him?

"My sons, be not now negligent," for the Lord hath chosen you to stand before Him, and that ye should minister unto Him."

How Do We Neglect Our Salvation?

To neglect salvation is to neglect the things that worked out our salvation, and those things are as follows:

1. Conviction

How you once saw nobody's faults but your own and that caused you so earnestly to seek God, hiding your own face in your hands, praying and pleading with God for forgiveness—but now you see others' faults, thereby neglecting your own repentance and confessions and prayers.

2. Appreciation

You once appreciated so much God's love, people's prayers, everybody and everything was so good in your sight, but now you murmur and complain against His people and against His own dealings with you, neglecting brotherly love and thankfulness.

3. Fellowship

Once you could hardly wait for service, you longed to pray, to hear the Word of God and have fellowship with God's saints, but now a little excuse keeps you away from all this and you don't feel bad about it, either.

4. Obedience

Once you could hardly do enough for God's servants and God's church and His people, you asked, what more can I do? But now you are grieved when told to pay tithes, to attend regular services, to tarry with seekers, to pass out tracts, et cetera. Now! You have come to the place that if you continue to neglect you will not escape the awful consequences, like those of Adam and Eve's disobedience. Saul's stubbornness, Moses' anger. If God spared them not because of the word they heard from Angels, how shall you escape if you continue neglecting divine conviction, appreciation, fellowship and obedience?

God's message to you is this, "Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling," for it is God that says to repent, to confess and to pray and also to obey. Let us not neglect our souls as we do not neglect our sleep, food, dressing and the other temporal things.

"My sons, be not now negligent."

This warning message is to you that once were saved; yea to you who are not saved. God's wrath and indignation is as strong as His love; therefore, fear God and hold fast on His free gift and do not neglect your salvation any more.

Imprisoning Our Own Fifth Column

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FROM DANIEL TO ARMAGEDDON

FOUR HUNDRED YEARS OF SILENCE Series No. 6

In series No. 3 of these prophetic studies entitled "From Daniel to Armageddon," we printed a chart (April issue of the Outlook) which brought us as far chronologically as we dare to journey in the Old Testament and still have Scriptural proof of our statements. That article refreshed our acquaintance with Zerubbabel, Ezra and Nehemiah and their activities under the second Gentile world power, the Medes and Persians. When we close the Book of Nehemiah we are finished with the Old Testament as far as time is concerned, i.e., no other book brings us closer to the New Testament than this record. All else is detail, although it is inspired and very important. We mention these facts that the reader will be able to have a clearer picture of events, their place and time of happenings.

In series No. 4 (June issue) the third world Gentile power was brought into view, but in order to get detail for an explanation of this part of Nebuchadnezzar's image as revealed to Daniel, we had to turn back as far as time is concerned from Nehemiah's time to the Book of Daniel, who looked out through the telescope of prophecy and shed light upon the period known to Bible students as the four hundred

YEARS OF SILENCE.

This period of approximately four hundred years is the time that elapsed from the close of the Old Testament to the coming of John the Baptist, who heralded the coming of Jesus Christ and brought in the New Covenant or New Testament. We have no inspired Scripture for this four hundred years of silence. Therefore, we must turn to history to fill up this gap in order to better understand the New Testament. New terms, such as "synagogue" come into view. New sects such as Pharisees and Saducees are mentioned freely in the New Testament which we never read of in the Old. The Herods have come into power. They are new to us in this journey from Daniel to Armageddon, because the

last national leaders we knew of

were Zerubbabel, Ezra, and Nehe-

miah, who played such important

parts in leading a large group of

the children of Israel who had been captive in Babylon back to the land of Judea. (Note: Southern Canaan, which we knew as Judah from the time of the division of the kingdom under Rehoboam and Jeroboam was changed to Judea after the Persian power gained control over the children of Israel.)

We will take up the fourth Gentile world power (Roman Empire) in the near future, but this month we would like to fill in with information concerning this four hundred years of silence so that the reader may bridge over from the Old to the New. Without this brief explanation it would be confusing as the conditions that meet us in the New Testament are surely changed from those in the days of Nehemiah.

Let's go back again to Nehemiah to pick up the thread of our study. After the Persian king granted him permission to return to rebuild the walls of the city of Jerusalem he plunged into this work under many hardships until his name is synonymous with the thought of revival in the midst of near impossibilities. His life should encourage especially every pastor that has found himself facing the problem of rebuilding assemblies and churches which were left in a crushed condition by the adversary. When the news of the completion of these walls reached the ears of the Tews in Babylon, more and more returned, not only from Babylon but also from Egypt and other countries where they had been scattered. These Jews that returned were in a far different mental frame than those who had been driven out. They returned to their homeland which had been tainted by the heel of the conquerors. New ideas of religion, society and commerce had been brought in. The returning Jews also brought with them new ideas acquired in the lands where they had taken refuge. We might say that Pales-tine became a sort of melting pot with no strong Jewish leadership after the death of Nehemiah, so that it is not surprising that we enter into this period of four hundred years of "silence" and confusion expecting almost anything to happen. And happen it did. These returning Jews might be likened to a son who has left home and travelled around the world. When he returns, he has many ideas acquired on foreign territory which conflict with the simple home life of boyhood days. Don't forget that God had stripped Israel of her political power in 588 B. C., and even though the Jews returned, their political power was not recognized by the Lord because He had given it over to the Gentile powers. The Jews, even to this day, are under the control of Gentile powers, and will be until Jesus comes at the Battle of Armageddon.

The true prophets were dead, the last cry of Malachi had been silenced, Nehemiah and Ezra no longer guided the civil and spiritual thought of their countrymen. The Jews who had been in foreign lands had seen sights that took root in their hearts; for example, the great temple worship at Babylon and Egypt. The power of the priests in these lands inoculated them with a desire to have their priests possess this power. They imitated these foreign religions although carrying out in principle their own law of Moses. Thus the priests, who were a very corrupt class, gained more and more power.

You can see the foundation of this power gaining momentum during this four hundred years of silence. Therefore, we need not be surprised at the authority of Caiaphas at the time of Jesus. The high priest was practically king of the land during the period following Nehemiah. It was a puppet rule to say the least. Nevertheless, the high priest possessed power that was never dreamed of in Moses' time. Foreign influences were strong in Palestine during this four hundred-year period, so strong that the language of the Jews changed step by step from Hebrew to Aramaic. After a few generations the Jews could not understand their own Scriptures. (The Old Testament was written in Hebrew.)

Synagogues

When they had been driven in exile, away from their beloved Solomon's temple, it was necessary for them to congregate together wherever possible each Sabbath in order to preserve their religion. These meeting places were called meeting-houses or synagogues. Therefore, when they returned, this practice of erecting synagogues which they had been forced to do

in foreign lands, became popular and many were erected over the land of Palestine. Thus, we see how these were started and how common they were in the New Testament, but these synagogues would have been strange sights, indeed, to David and others before the fall of Judah to the armies of Nebuchadnezzar.

The Grecian Influence

Alexander the Great, who conquered the Medes and Persians, stamped the Greek influence on the Jews. He gave the Jews freedom of worship but at the same time so surrounded the Jews with every possible Greek influence that the Greek language supplanted all others. So strong was this influence that even after the fall of the Grecian Empire to Rome, the language and customs were predominantly Greek. At the time of Jesus, the Romans were in power politically but the language was Grecian. That accounts for the fact that the New Testament was written in Greek and not in Hebrew.

The Maccabees

The ungodly leader of the Grecian armies following the death of Alexander the Great was named Antiochus Epiphanes (see July issue). His rule was so brutal that a God-fearing man, Mattathias, with his five sons led a rebellion. One of these sons was named Judas Maccabeus. He was a fearless military leader and took up the gauntlet against the Greeks after his father's death. His desire was purely of a religious nature for he and his followers fought for religious freedom which the ungodly Antiochus Epiphanes had denied them. Just remember that the Maccabees originated in power because of a desire to overthrow the "Brass Heel" of Greece in order that God might be worshipped in freedom. The succeeding generations of old Mattathias Maccabeus, however, became corrupt, but the desire for freedom smoldered in the hearts of the Jews and this led a new group to arise called the Pharisees.

Pharisees and Sadducees

The Pharisees were the Martin Luthers of their day. They protested against the corrupt state of affairs and the mingling of Jewish laws of worship with those of Greece and foreign powers. They were Nationalists—a party that were almost fanatical in their desire that the Law of Moses be preserved, and also that Israel be

maintained as a separate nation and not engulfed by foreigners. Their original purpose was of the highest ideals but like many other good movements in its inception, it became tainted with their own ideas and laws, which in some cases superseded the Laws of Moses. They were still very much in power, at least from a religious party's stand-point, at the time of Jesus. Jesus denounced the Pharisees for their hypocrisy because they had built up many religious ideas of their own and stumbled over these while forgetting the weightier matters of Moses' law. They had become cold in their experience and very proud. They opposed the teachings of Jesus and demanded his crucifixion. It is too bad that such a noble beginning should sink to the depths of blindness and hardness of heart that we find them in during the ministry of Jesus.

The Sadducees were another political party which supported the corrupt priests. They claimed to be descendants of the high priest Zadok. They were the rich upper class and for the most part hypocrites and far less spiritual than the Pharisees. Because they were in harmony with the priestly ruling class, they opposed Jesus with all of their force. They knew that if His Gospel was accepted, theirs would be overthrown. Caiaphas was a Sadducee. The Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection, life after death nor the existence of angels. They were bitter against Jesus and also demanded His Crucifixion.

The Herods

The little land of Judea was torn by internal strife and foreign conquerors all during the period of the four hundred years of silence. That explains the rise of the Maccabees, the Pharisees and Sadducees, etc. The ROMAN EMPIRE overthrew the Greeks about 160 B. C. and again Judea was overrun with trouble. Pompey was probably the first Roman conqueror to overthrow Palestine, but he, in turn, lost his power to Julius Cæsar, who succeeded him as leader of the Roman Empire. This Cæsar appointed Antipater, an Idumean half-breed Jew, as the procurator over Palestine because of his military assistance and sympathy with Cæsar during his struggle for leadership of the Roman Empire. His rule was shortlived, however, and at his death his power fell into the hands of his son Herod. This Herod, son of Antipater, the half-breed Idumean, became the king in Judea-the leader of God's people. He was one of the worst that ever lived. He it was that built the temple that the disciples showed to Jesus as mentioned in Matthew 24. He caused it to be built, not for the love of God or the people, but simply as a monument to himself and a desire to be great in the world. It was a political desire and not a religious one that caused him to construct it. He was a mighty despot among the Jews, cruel and hated by them all. You will remember how insanely iealous he became in the closing years of age, hoping in this slaughter of the innocents to snuff out the life of Jesus, who had just been born in Bethlehem. Thus we find Herod, the half-breed, on the throne as king in Jerusalem when we emerge from the four hundred years of silence and open the pages of the New Testament. Herod was a true type of the people he ruled over for they were for the most part backslidden in heart and foreigncontrolled both by political power and religious influence. speech was Grecian, their king a puppet of Rome, not even a true Jew, their priesthood corrupt, their temple spacious but devoid of the power of God that existed in Solomon's day, and their everyday life so intermingled with foreign elements that true nationalism was almost buried. No true prophet had spoken for four hundred yearshope was almost gone-into such a scene do we find John the Baptist stepping that he might introduce their true Messiah—Tesus of Nazareth. No wonder our Saviour was a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief!

Jesus' Problem

Just remember when you face a task that is very discouraging and a situation that seems impossible, the conditions that Jesus faced after this four hundred years of "dark ages." Our Lord and Saviour chose a period that looked hopeless to present His Gospel. It had to be real to triumph in such an atmosphere and even though He lost his life on Calvary, His Gospel has outlasted all the Pharisees, Sadducees, the Herods, the Cæsars and world powers and will yet rule over all the earth. Look up, brother, the Lord our God has never asked us to tackle a situation that He would not go before. He is our Shield and Buckler and exceeding great Reward.

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HOW GOD LED ME ON

"Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that He cannot hear." Isa. 59:1. Oh! How glad I am today, that I know for myself, and not another, that He heard mewhen I cried unto Him, and cast my sins away, to be remembered against me no more. Praise our God forever!

My father was a Roman Catholic. When my mother married him she went into the church, also, and we children were taught to believe that no other church was right. We were never allowed to enter any other church; we dared not disobey, as my father ruled his house with an iron rod, even my mother dared not cross him. Suffice it to say our home was miserable. Then when I was about ten years old, God spoke to me. Had I known then that Jesus saves, these intervening years would not have been wasted. You that have been reared in a Christian home should be so thankful. But let me stop here and pay honor to my father and mother for good moral training, which is so lacking in many homes today. As I grew up I made up my mind I was going to be a great orator, having won several prizes in contests, but again I was defeated as my father said, "No!" I could not go on to school or take lessons in elocution, either. Only God alone knows the heart-breaking days that followed. My pillow was soaked with tears at night. I believe I can truthfully say that was the bitterest disappointment of my life. When I was sixteen years old my grandfather (my mother's father) sent for me to come to Illinois and stay with him. Oh! now as I write I can see the hand of God leading me on, Hallelujah! It was there I heard for the first time that Jesus died for me-that I, even I, might live a holy life. God was striving with my heart and I went to the altar and repented, yet the fear of my father's wrath (although he was several hundred miles away) was so grounded in me I never went on with God. It was here I met and married my husband. I will pass over the next four years of my life, for it was far from happy. I tried to find pleasure in the picture shows, in the card table and other places of amusements-yet I was miserable. I cried myself to sleep

many nights wanting something that would satisfy my hungry soul. Then one day God came upon the scene again. My husband lost his job. In the meantime my family had moved to Oklahoma, so I decided to go home. In August, 1914, I arrived in Collinsville, Okla. Í found the town in much excitement, as there was a man who had put up a tabernacle and was preaching that "Jesus was coming soon"; and that we must receive the baptism of the Holy Ghost with speaking in other tongues—as in Acts 2:4. Never had such things been heard and people were stirred, especially as this preacher was telling the people how the Catholics were going to play such a part in the closing of this age. Mother had lost some of her fear of my father and we decided we'd go and see. From the first sermon I heard, God began to talk to me and I know the preaching was right. After going just a few times, one night God let me see hell in all its fury. With the scream, "I'm lost, I'm lost" I made my way to that altar and there in the sawdust I wept my way to Calvary.

Not long after, I received the blessed baptism of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in other tongues. Then followed five years, when I scarcely knew where I was; I was carried away in the Spirit, I was walking and talking with God. Then one day God said, "It's time you are walking alone." I came down to earth, and got such a jolt that the very foundation was crumbling beneath me. Then came about three years of such trials as I never thought could be. I found out that everything that glitters is not gold. I was so shaken had I not built upon the Rock I could not have stood. God, in His great love and tender mercy, never once let loose of me. Then God began to let me see how His people were drifting with the world; they were beginning to do the very things they had preached against. Our women no longer dressed as becometh holiness, they cut their hair, their dresses were so short they were an abomination. They began to go to the beauty parlors, and to send their daughters into them to learn the trade. How my soul was stirred within me when I saw these things. I began to call upon God.

Then one morning as I was reading the Word I heard a voice call me by my name. I listened thinking my husband might have come home and called; then the voice came again, this time I went into the lobby of the hotel where we were living, thinking it might be my landlady, but she said she had not called, so I went back and lo, I heard the voice again. This time I knew it was the voice of God. I answered, "Here I am, Lord." Then came back the answer, "I've called you, I've called you." This is what He said to me. Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice like a trumpet, and show my people their transgressions (Isa. 58:1) lest their blood be required at your hands."

Not many days after that I was called upon to speak in the assembly, where I belonged. I began to call on God for a message, and He gave me my text, which was Jer. 2:11-13. I began to pray and ask God to change it, but He would not, so I delivered the message. So my first message was to my own people. In 1935, we moved to Kansas, where my husband had a position. There was an assembly there and they were building a new church. Of course I could scarcely wait to go to church. So Sunday morning I went to Sunday School. Imagine my horror when a woman in decidedly immodest dress got up to teach the Bible Class! I never went back very many times. I soon found out they indorsed lodges and had a deacon in the church who was a member of two popular lodges. He died while we were there and these lodges had charge of the funeral in the Pentecostal Church. I found out that scattered around over the country were several fire-baptized Holiness people, also some Church of God folks; neither had a place of worship. Some way they heard of me and called on me, asked if I would preach for them if they got a building where we could at least preach holiness. They got the building. God sent us an evangelist and several were saved and filled with the Holy Ghost. I was overseer of the church for two years, then we returned to Collinsville, Okla. Of course I went back to the church where I belonged and found it



SHALL HE FIND FAITH?

When the Son of man cometh, shall He find faith? (Luke 18:86). Now faith is the substance (assurance) of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. (Heb. 11: 1). In the remainder of the chapter we read some wonderful examples of faith in God. Other hopes may fail us, but let us "have faith in God" as Jesus told Peter. (Mark 11:22) "For the Lord is faithful, who shall stablish you and keep you from evil (2 Thess. 3:3). He it is who laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the works of His hands (Heb. 1:10; Psa. 19:1). Why should we not trust fully in the God of all creation? "The foundation of God standeth SURE, having this seal The Lord knoweth them that are His, and let everyone that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity."

Since it seems that there are so few of the younger generation who have laid aside the love of the world we need to encourage one another to be steadfast in the faith and build on the firm foundation (Eph. 2:20). day. In John's writing (1 John 5:14, 15) he says "And this is the confidence that we have in Him. that, if we ask anything according to His will He heareth us: And if we know that He hears us, whatsoever we ask we know that we have the petitions that we desired of Him."

The Apostle Paul was a wonderful example of faith. We read of His sincerity, faithfulness, troubles and persecutions (2 Cor. 4), yet He said (verses 17, 18) "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; while we look not at the things which are seen, for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.

Is this hope not worth fighting for? "Blessed are they that have not seen and yet have believed." Is that FAITH pressed into your heart today? "For without faith it is impossible to please God." Let us hold fast our faith and a good conscience; which some having put away concerning faith have made shipwreck. 

more worldly than ever. I was discouraged and utterly disgusted.

Then I began to hear of the "Oneness" Church (so-called). Bro. Voar Shoemake was pastor. They began to tell me how he preached holiness, so I went to hear and see for myself. How my heart rejoiced when the wonderful messages would come on holiness, but when they would preach on the Oneness of the Godhead or baptism in Jesus' Name, well I just couldn't see that way. People who have always believed in the Oneness of the Godhead do not know what a battle those have who have come out of the Trinity doctrine; I had years of it instilled into me. We were warned not to go about them; told they were Anti-Christ and that we would be deceived if we hung around them. Truly, sometimes I would have such a fear I would say to myself "I'm not going back," nevertheless I always went back. Then I would pray and say, "Lord, don't let me be deceived." How I praise God for an honest heart. Three years I went and mingled with the Oneness people. Little by little my eyes began to open. saw they had the power of God among them, yet I thought the way I was baptized was sufficient, i.e., in the name of the Father, and of the Son and Holy Ghost. I quit fighting. Then God sent his servant and minister, Bro. Wilbur King from Salem, Oregon, that I might see and know the truth; Satan and all his hosts turned loose on me. My husband, who had never uttered a word against me as to where I went to church or how I worshipped, forbade my going to the Oneness church. He said I should not take our little boy there. They did not know it, but they were helping me to see that it was

the right way. How the Devil tried to keep me from hearing Bro. King. Satan whispered in my ear and said, "Don't go and hear him, he won't preach anything but his doctrine anyway. I never went the first night, for which I shall always be sorry, but I went the next night, and truly Brother King was not half through his message before I was convinced that if I wanted to be in the rapture I, too, must be buried in the Name of Jesus. And let me say here I never missed another service. Two weeks from then I went to Siatook, Okla., and was buried in His name, Bro. Horace Wilburn officiating.

The condition of the Foreign Missionary work reflects the terrific spiritual battle that is going on in the world, and should move any real saint of God to do his part to help our faithful missionaries.

In the midst of the trials, however, there are some very definite notes of encouragement. nearly all stations come reports of revivals. Our faithful missionaries in China, Bro. Bullock, Sister Iry, Sister Stieglitz and others report quite a move of the Spirit of God resulting in the salvation of souls. One great hindering cause mentioned by Sister Iry especially, is a great revival in the opium industry, which means many wrecked in body, soul and spirit.

Food prices are rising in nearly all the foreign countries, and yet our missionary offerings are not keeping pace with this additional Bro. and Sister Davis expense. from Africa report success in their This young couple work there. have been severely tested with sickness and should be taken care of well.

We received news from the Canadian Organization that Brother and Sister Hull and Sister Dickson left their stations suddenly, due doubtless to conditions which they had not been able so far to explain. We presume there is a very strict censure on mail. They expect to arrive in New York about the middle of September. Offerings, therefore, should not be sent direct to their former addresses. We will advise you later as to their arrange-

We are without fresh news from Estonia, and are wondering what the saints there are doing. thing sure, they need our help very badly. Let us not fail them.

Our dear Sister McCarty is still carrying on a very aggressive work in spite of the rise in food prices.

In closing, what are you doing for our missionaries? It is now or never.

Conditions in China

The poverty here is so severe this year—so much suffering. Beggars got so thick on the streets and would not move on nor even wash or go to the free clinic to have their sores dressed (most of them are opium smokers) that the authorities buried several of the baser sort alive. They spread disease as sure as impure water does, but conditions make one's heart ache

Three opium smoking womer have been in to our mission for deliverance lately and have been se free. A case of tuberculosis is here now and seems much improved Another woman was in for healing but so far not even a touch for the body or soul as far as we can see and she desperately needs both Two women have lately been filled with the Spirit. God also continue to bless in two of our out stations One station sorely needs a reviving please make it a special subject or prayer.

"God Working with Them"

The story of the growth of the Calvary Tabernacle Church is another demonstration of God working with men. The Apostle Paul said that we are laborers together with Christ.

In the year of nineteen hundred and thirty-four a small group of Christians purchased the "Church of the Holy Innocents" at the corner of Fletcher Ave. and Cedar St. It was their purpose to maintain a church on the principles of the New Testament teachings of the Lord Jesus and his apostles.

In the year of nineteen hundred and thirty-six Rev. Raymond G. Hoekstra came to lead the church, and in the Spring of the next year became the permanent pastor of the congregation.

In the Spring of that same year the church building was remodeled and enlarged to accommodate the increasing numbers who came to hear the Word of God and to find salvation in the old Bible way.

For a period of six months, a weekly radio broadcast was conducted on station WIRE. Through this broadcast many listeners became acquainted with the truth and power of the Apostolic Gospel.

The last four years has seen the congregation and Sunday School grow until it is now four times its original size. A number of Sunday School rooms were built to accommodate this department of the church.

When in the year of nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, a new radio station, WIBC, came to Indianapolis, the Calvary Tabernacle program was the first to contract time on the new station.

The Lord's business is the most important thing in this world, and we should always and ever keep it first. Through this weekly broadcast, many thousands of persons have been blessed, the local congregation has greatly increased, and the work of God throughout the state has been benefited.

"The Lord is my Shepherd; I shall not want." Psalm 23:1.

I am wondering as I write this story "How many of you boys and girls like to sing?" Do you enjoy singing songs about Jesus? I hope all of you like to sing because Jesus loves for us to praise Him in song. Our story is going to be about a boy that loved to sing and also to play. This boy that we will read about played on a harp. Have you ever heard a harp? It makes very beautiful music. Listen to different musical instruments as they are being played and you will hear them singing songs, too.

Long ago there lived a boy who loved to sing. I'm sure you have heard stories about him before. His name was David. Remember? He helped his father take care of sheep and as he watched over them he sang songs. Often in the evening as David was bringing the sheep home his father would hear his song long before he saw him. In the morning the sun was so bright and the air smelled so good that David couldn't help but sing praises to God all the way to the pasture. When midday came and the sun grew hot David would lie down in the cool grass and watch the soft white clouds overhead. He would listen as the bees hummed a little tune. He would look across the pasture at the tall distant hills whose tops were often hidden in the clouds, and would think how wonderful and how good God was. Then, beautiful songs would come into his heart. Sometimes the songs would be about hills, sometimes about flowers, often about the sheep in the pasture, and always in his songs he would thank God.

When night time came and all was still and quiet, David would get out his harp and sing and play. He would look up into the sky and sing about the moon and the stars. Then he would think of all the wonders of the day—flowers, birds, trees and rivers, and he would make up songs about them. His father, after working hard all day, would grow rested listening to David.

One day a very wonderful thing happened to David. A messenger boy came hurrying to the home of the little singer. David's father answered the door. The messenger said, "The king is sick and sad. It seems no one can help him. He has heard of the beautiful songs which your son sings, and he wishes him to come to the palace at once." Now, nobody ever refused the king. so Jesse, the father of David, quickly prepared a gift for David to take as he went to the king. I imagine David must have prayed as he went to meet the king. A little shepherd boy going before a great and mighty

When David entered the king's room the king did not speak to him; he did not even seem to see him. The King's head was bowed and he appeared so sad and lonely. I am very sure that David must have asked God to help him sing sweeter and better than he ever had before. He began to touch the strings on his harp, and as he played, he began to sing softly about the hills where the king used to play when he was a little boy. He sang about God's love for the stars. the sun and the moon. He sang about the birds and flowers and how God takes care of them. He probably sang about his sheep and the green pastures.

Very likely the strange, sad look left the king's face, as he listened enchantedly to the shepherd borsing and play. He forgot all about the things that were troubling him. He began to smile and seem relieved. The king turned and

watched David, and a great love came into his heart for him. (You know boys' and girls' singing makes people happy. It makes them forget how hard they must work, or how tired they are.) He loved him so much that he sent a letter to Jesse, David's father, saying, "Let David, I pray thee, stand before me, for he hath found favor in my sight."

Now, Jesse loved his son very dearly, but he was so glad that David could bring joy and happiness to others, that he allowed him to go. Sometimes when the king was well and happy David would go back to his sheep. David loved the great outdoors and the green pastures, and being with his sheep. He would lie again on the soft green grass and rest, and as he rested God would send more beautiful songs into his heart. David always sang his songs first of all to his father, who enjoyed them so much. I believe that David's father must have thanked God too for those beautiful songs, don't you?

I wonder if you know that you can read these beautiful songs God gave to David. They are found in the book of Psalms in the Bible. Maybe you can't write beautiful songs like David, but you can sing songs that somebody else has written, can't you? See if you can find someone to sing to. Mother is tired at night; Daddy comes home sometimes troubled and discouraged, then you be a little David and try singing.

How Big Is Gibraltar, and Why Is It So Named?

Great Britain's mighty fortress, located at the gateway to the Mediterranean off Spain, is about three miles long from north to south and varies in width from 1/4 to 3/4 of a mile. At its highest point, the Rock stands 1,408 feet above sea level. As a word, Gibraltar is a corruption of the Arabian "Jab-al-Tariq," which may be translated to read "Rock of Tariq." Tariq is the name of the Moslem general who seized the Rock in 711 and invaded Spain. Gibraltar, which was held by the Moslems for some 600 years, has been Britain's since 1704, when a Spanish garrison yielded it to a British fleet after two days of mediocre resistance. Britain's ownership of the Rock was formally confirmed in the Peace of Utrecht in 1713.

The Bible in Germany

That interest in the Bible in Germany is undiminished is evident from a leaflet of the German Faith Movement, which states that "in more than 2,000 parishes in Germany there was organized a Bible Week designed to strengthen the hearts of the parishioners." It is further stated that a missionary magazine called *Thy Kingdom Come* has a circulation up to 150,000 copies an issue.—Signs of the Times.

Moslem Marriages

"The Moslems have very strict rules as to marriage of relatives. The prohibitive degrees with regard to marriages are as follows: Mother, daughter, paternal aunt, maternal aunt, brother's or sister's daughter, grandmother, granddaughter, mother-in-law, stepmother, daughter-in-law, and granddaughter-in-law. The marriage of two sisters at the same time is forbidden, but the marriage of a deceased wife's sister is allowed. Marriage with a deceased brother's wife is very common in moslem countries, such marriage being held to be a very honorable means of providing for a brother's widow. The marriage of cousins is also desirable, as being a means of keeping families and tribes together."— HUGHES, Affinity, p. 11.

Home Missionaries?

Our people need to see the open field at our door. I know there are twenty-seven millions of child widows in India. But what about the 36,000,000 unchurched youths at our door? What about 70,000,000 unchurched people in our nation? about sixty thousand churches without a convert or an addition last year? There are 21,-000,000 people in our country on some kind of relief. What about ten millions out of work? What about 90,000 people in a city of 115,000, who did not enter a church door last year? While wringing your hands over the heathen abroad, what about your next door neighbor who never enters a church door? Have you said anything to him about Christ?—HERALD OF HOLINESS.

Briefs

After submitting a questionnaire to 1,200 Protestant Episcopal clergymen and 1,200 Episcopal laymen, the Layman's Magazine, a national Episcopal monthly, declares this to be the Episcopal attitude toward the European war: "Though the aims of neither side in the war can properly be termed Christian, there is a moral balance clearly in favor of Britain. The United States should therefore extend wide material aid and credit to Britain, but not military aid; and at the same time this country should prepare."

Nazi-ism in France

Already the hand of Nazi-ism is taking a strangle hold upon the economic, social and religious life of the French people. With a change in constitutional government, replacing the Republican form with a totalitarian state, the French government is tightening its reins and allowing its official news agencies release adverse propaganda against French Jews. Already a Nazi newspaper in the French language, Lex Paris, has made its appearance; its program proclaimed in its first editorial announced that the war and its disastrous consequences for France were due entirely to the Jewish propaganda against Germany. The paper went on to say that there was no real reason for war between Germany and France but the Jewish capitalists in conjunction with England brought it about. The popular prediction is that with the elimination of all Jewish government office holders, it will not be long until they will be forced to leave French soil-where to! Nobody knows.

Tobacco Business

Since the 1911 order, tobacco consumption in the United States has zoomed upward by about 136 per cent. Last year, buying through 600,000 retailers, tobacco-conscious Americans smoked 172 billion cigarettes, 5,311,000,000 cigars, and pinched up 38 million pounds of snuff. The lion's share of this huge volume of business has gone to the "Big Four," and their combined annual income has usually exceeded the entire farm value of the American tobacco crop.
