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# No Saloon Fighting

A few weeks ago I attended a business meeting at Brother Ruline's church in Eau Claire. Wisconsin. The next day one of the brethren drove me over to Chippewa Falls, to catch a train in order to make better connections back to Saint Paul. We drove very slowly as the roads were icy, the wind was playing pranks with the snow and the flakes were swirling in from the west. It was a typical northern Wisconsin day. I was glad when the ticket agent informed me that the train was on time.

It was then that I began to notice the other folks waiting in the depot. This station is not a large one, but very commodious and warm as toast. side of the waiting room seemed to be entirely taken over by one family group. The father was holding a baby, and the mother, another which seemed to be almost a twin, and besides these, there were four more "stairsteps" up to the age of about eight years. All were husky and full of life. They had evidently been waiting quite a while for the train. The boys especially were romping back and forth across "their" end of the waiting room, throwing their caps in the air and having the time of their lives. All were dressed poorly, but all very, very happy.

Then I looked at the other side of the waiting room, to my right. There were ten or fifteen people also waiting for the train, but all very much bored and uneasy with the actions of the happy family on their left. I could not help but notice that this "elite" group were for the greater part, sour faced and cheerless. They were dressed well, fed well, and perhaps well educated, but they had no joy. There was a look of scorn on their faces.

God taught me a lesson right there, or rather burned the truth of the most important lesson of life, again into my mind,—that charity covers a multitude of sins, and that love is the greatest force in the world for true happiness, whether it be manifest in a family or church.

About that time I heard a sudden thump. Down went two of those little fellows, in an oldfashioned wrestling match, right on the station floor. I watched the father, and thought surely he would step in and stop it, but no, he was leaning over toward them, thoroughly enjoying it. Even the baby seemed to "goo" in glee at her "heroic" brothers. I glanced over to the "elite" group at my right and many eyebrows were raised in horror, but the wrestling match continued until one was thoroughly downed. No one "got a licking," not even a scolding; their faces were smeared with dirt, but they put their arms around one another and the happiness in that family flowed on. The father dusted them off a bit and the mother beamed at them. She didn't have to worry much about their clothes because they were quite shabby at best. About that time the train arrived and they all scrambled on and my object lesson from the Lord was finished. God gave me a sermon, on the way back to St. Paul.

Who was the better? The stiff, starchy folks who withdrew themselves to the other end of the station and who sat there with scorn and bitterness, or the family I have just described? The mother and dad with their six "kids" of course. Why? Because they had love in that family. Solomon evidently witnessed some similar scene when he wrote, "Better is little with the fear of the



Lord, than great treasure and trouble."..."Better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a stalled ox and hatred therewith." Better is a church where love and unity prevail, than a large congregation where strife and bitterness reign. Better is a Sunday School where charity and harmony prevails among the superintendent, teachers and members, than to double the attendance with trouble.

#### God Is Love

If you were only permitted to use one word to explain God, that word would have to be LOVE. Anything is possible with the love of God in your heart. Most everything is IM-POSSIBLE without it. This also applies to the family and church. 1 John 3:1, "Behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God." The foundation of salvation is divine forgiveness. You can understand how a righteous God could condemn and damn a sinner to hell, but it is impossible to understand how a righteous and Holy God can forgive a sinner, wash him clean, fill him with His Spirit and take him home to glory, only on the basis of divine forgiveness, through divine love.

So also in a church. There must be divine forgiveness in the hearts of the members. Every detail of the church may not be in order (neither was the happy family in the station) but there must be forgiveness and the love of God one toward another. If so, there will be happiness and contentment. No other plan is workable. Works alone are not sufficient, it is faith which worketh by love.

## THE ONE WAY OF THE LORD

As we read God's Word, we come to the ultimate conclusion that there is only one way to be saved, regardless of the various doctrines being taught by the many different "so called" church organizations throughout the world. We do not wish to cast reflection or to criticize, but only refer to the plain unadulterated Word of God.

The great trouble with many of our professed Christians is that they have only been spoiled instead of being saved. said, "Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ. For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily."Col.2:8,9 This is one of the greatest hinderances to the progress of the true Church of God-being wrapped in a cloak of self-righteousness, and accepting traditions of men, instead of receiving the real Christ in their lives as one definite experience with God. Col. 1:27.

God has spoken through the prophet Jeremiah to Israel that He would gather them out of all countries whither He had driven them in His anger and fary, and be their God and they should be His people, and He would give them one heart and one way. Jer. 32:37-39. Some will say, "That was for the Jews." Well, let us trace this one way on through God's Word and see if it is not just the same for the Gentiles as well. God spoke to the prophet Amos and said that He was going to set a plumbline in the midst of His people, Israel, and that He would not pass by them again any more. Amos 7:8. This means that God has made His final plan of redemption for both Jew and Gentile. What could be straighter than a plumbline? God, still speaking to the Jews, said: "Yet I am the Lord thy God from the land of Egypt, and thou shalt know no God but me: for there is no saviour beside me." Hosea 13:4. They were definitely told that they would know no God but Him.

In Matthew 1:21, we read, "And she shall bring forth a

son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save His people from their sins." This makes Jesus of the New Testament, the one and only God and Saviour of the Old Testament. Thanks be to His matchless Name!

Jesus cried on the cross of Calvary, "It is finished." John 19:30; Matt. 27:50. The great plan of redemption was finished. once for all time to come. God's promise to Israel that He would give them one heart and one way was finished. Not only was Israel's plan of redemption made, but thanks be to Jesus. He made a way for the Gentile race as well. Remember that the Gentile race until this time was "having no hope and without God in the world, But now in Christ Jesus ye who some-time were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For He is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us....and that He might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby; And came and preached peace to you who were afar off and to them that were nigh. For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father." Eph. 2:11-18. We both, meaning the Jew and Gentile, have access by one Spirit unto the Father. Thus, we have again God's one way which was spoken of by the prophets, and it is a definite experience for both Jew and Gentile. In 1 Cor. 12:13, Paul tells us, "For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been made to drink into one Spirit." Again Paul says, "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God." Eph. 2:19. Since we are all, both Jew and Gentile, baptized into one body by the one Spirit; we still just have God's one and only way. Praise His Name! Eph. 4:4-6: "There is one body, and one Spirit, even as ye are called in one hope of

your calling; One Lord, one faith, one baptism, One God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." One! One! Yes, just one way, praise His Name!

Let us look into the ministry of Paul. First, we notice, Paul assured the Galatian Church that there was only one Gospel, and pronounced a curse upon any one, though it be an angel from heaven, who preached another. Gal. 1:6-9. Again, we hear Paul telling Timothy, his son in the faith, in Tim. 1:3; "As I besought thee to abide still at Ephesus, when I went Macedonia, that mightest charge some that they teach no other doctrine." Also in 1 Tim. 4:16: "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee." This doctrine, preached under God's anointing, still has the same saving power. Notice to abide at Ephesus, and to not allow any other doctrine to be preached, other than that he (Paul) had preached. Now Paul preached baptism of the Holy Ghost, baptism in water in Jesus' Name, and speaking in tongues at Ephesus. Acts 19:1-6. This is the message or doctrine that Paul was so concerned about. He, also, told the elders of the church at Ephesus, that he had not shunned to declare unto them the whole counsel of God. Acts 20:27. Holy Ghost baptism is the experience Paul was speaking of in 1 Cor. 12:13; and what they received at Ephesus, Acts 19: 1-6; at Pentecost, Acts 2:1-4; at Caesarea (Cornelius' household) Acts 10:43-48; at Samaria, Acts 8:5-18. Paul also received the Holy Ghost, and spake with tongues, Acts 9:17, 18; 1 Cor. 14:18; preached salvation only in Jesus' Name. There is salvation in no other Name. Acts 4:12.

All we do in word or deed must be done in the name of the Lord Jesus. Col. 3:17. Jesus is the Way, He is the Builder of the church, Matt. 16:18; the Door to the church, John 10:7.

God alone knows where we came from, where He found us, our terrible fate, the pit out of which we've been digged, and whether or not you are a diamond from the rough. We hear people say they are saved, not once comprehending what they are saved from, how it all came about, who made it possible, what it cost, and who was able to pay the price that we might be saved.

God knew best of our lost condition. He spoke to Ezekiel about it, telling him to explain to the people and see if he could cause them to understand; for as you know it is natural that we understand the spiritual. So Ezekiel took for an example an infant. By a wretched infant he shewed the original state of any man or woman that is saved. If you are saved now he tries to tell you what you were before you were saved, and how the Lord loved you when He found you in that deplorable and unsaved condition.

I think God must have spoken to Ezekiel many times to advise the people to remember the pit from whence they were digged, for Ezekiel said again, Word of the Lord came unto me saying, Cause the people, make them to know, have them to understand their abominations! It was their abomination that God delivered them from and they were not to forget the pit from whence they were digged. God said to Ezekiel, "Remind the people that they have come from a land of idol worshipers." He said, "Thy birth and thy nativity were of the land of Canaan; thy father was an Amorite, and thy mother an Hittite." Idolaters serving the false gods (ites). That's all your parents were; what do you have to boast of? In Ex. 23:32,33, we read that you can't have any fellowship with them (your own father and mother by your first birth) and no covenant, and they cannot come where you are lest they cause you to sin against God. You cannot be a partaker with them if they are unsaved.

Moses and told him to come up unto the Lord and not to bring his people with him. We have to leave our own by first birth. As for thy nativity or when you were born the first time, your mother being an ite (if we may call her a mother), that wasn't a real mother, only from the the fact that she gave birth to you. A mother has love, but she was just a poor woman—cold, frigid, and isolated from God. Let's call her the old world for that's what she was. Ps. 51:5 says, "In sin did my mother conceive me." She was the one that brought me to this world of sin to get along the best I could--without help and doomed to die, bound and couldn't get loose from her by my own strength. It took someone else to help. Ezekiel said, "Thy navel was not cut," and this connection meant death as my mother was already dead. "Neither wast thou washed in water" for there was not as yet any water provided to wash you in, and no way to make you supple and take away your stiffness. You were not salted at all--no neighbors, nobody to clothe you. If there had been someone to clothe you, there was no clothing to be had. No one ever thought that far; no one ever cared that much; none eye pitied thee to do any of these things unto you to have compassion upon you, but thou was cast out in the open field of sin to the loathing of thy person, naked and without, alone in the cold. Let me repeat "in an open field, naked, cold, without hope." You! Naked! Exposed--to all who might pass by. Luke 10:31. By chance there came down a certain priest that way, and when he saw you, he passed by on the other side. Oh, yes, when he saw you, he had made no provision for such cases; he hadn't anything with him to make you clean, and no clothes with which to dress you, so he passed by on the other side. Likewise, a Levite, when he was at the place, came and looked on you; he saw he could not do anything for you. You were a hopeless case as far as he

was concerned and he felt just a little too good to look down on you. Anyhow, he felt pretty well dressed and he would have to come down to pick you up. You, one that never had been washed since you were born and not even dressed! Think of your terrible, pitiful, degraded condition, only to be looked on by those who pass by. Plenty of remarks, but no help; many to see your needs, but no remedy. Can you see what your condition was by your first birth? Naked in an open field, open sin exposed to the whole world and to all who pass by but they did not and could not help.

But one time a young man of about thirty-three years, a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed to find a bride and to seek and save that which was lost, came where you were and He had compassion on you and went to you. He saw you poluted in your own blood, and when He saw you polluted in your own blood, your own sin, He saw your degradation and had compassion. He had love; He saw you in death, and wanted you for His very own. He saw you and loved you, and came down where you were. He cried, "LIVE! When thou wast in thine own blood, live! Come, be my own; I am able to help you, and I'll promise you and cause you to multiply as the bud of the field, and you will wax great and you will come to excellent ornaments and great things in God. 

It takes far more of the grace of God in your life to ask forgiveness, than to perform a multitude of duties around the House of God. God loved you when He saved you. You also loved the Lord and all those around you. Now then, as ve have received Christ Jesus the Lord. so walk ye in HIM.

Fools Fight Prov. 18:6

Is there someone in your church, always grumbling, finding fault, picking little fights and trouble? Well, the Bible calls such a one a FOOL! When Jim Jefferies, the heavyweight champion of the world was in his prime, he would only fight in the ring where the crown was at stake. No one was his master. Yet the story is told that Jack Johnson, who was irked on by his manager, tried to pick several fights with Jefferies in various saloons. He followed Jefferies to several of these rough and tumble places and Jefferies simply ignored him. He was champion and wanted no saloon fight or street brawl. But finally he got tired of Johnson's tantalizing, and said, "All right, Jack, if you want to fight, here's what we will do. You and I will go down alone into the cellar of this saloon (he knew he was trying to show off before a crowd), and we will lock the door and fight it out. The one that is able will pick up the key and unlock the door. He will be the winner." Johnson's bluff was called and he quickly said, "Mistah Jefferies, I really don' wont no fight wiff you."

Why didn't Jefferies fight at every opportunity— in the saloons, in the alleys or on the street? Because he was the When champions champion! fight, they go in the ring and receive thousands of dollars for their skill—they want nothing to do with cheap penny brawls. Dempsey, Tunney, and other champions have absolutely walked away from some little half-drunk "smarty" that wanted to start a tavern fight, when they could have crushed their would-be challenger with one blow. Why? Because they were champions!

Why can't God's people be at least as wise as a prize fighter? If you have a "little person" in your assembly, the "bantam rooster" type of Christian that is always looking for trouble and penny fights, remember that he does that to show his importance. He would not fight in the open against the real issues that oppose the church such as sin, the works of the devil, robbing God, etc. But what he really wants is to impress someone with his importance. He hasn't enough character to be a real spiritual companion for God and so he goes about trying to keep the church in turmoil with his dark alley challenges. It's time to fight, all right, but fight in prayer against the powers of hell. Fight the selfishness that lingers deep in your heart. Fight the stinginess that keeps your pocketbook locked. Fight some poor person's sickness by going to his bedside to pray through for him. When you fight, fight as a champion! Don't fight for the kingdom of darkness, but come out in the open and fight for God! Contention is saloon fighting. Let's be champions and fight against sin!

This made them terribly angry, so they were very happy to watch Jesus nailed to the cross. Each time the hammer hit the big nails, they probably thought, "Well, this is the end of this man. Soon we will be rid of Him. The entrance to the tomb will be closed by a great stone, and Roman soldiers will guard it day and night."

The friends of Jesus didn't feel about His death like the enemies did. They were sad. "Our dear Friend is dead," they cried. "We thought that He was the promised Savior, the Son of God. We loved Him very much. We did not think that

His enemies would be able to kill Him, but now they have killed Jesus and we are left alone. We have no one to heal our sick, and no one to help us in trouble. All we had hoped and planned for is gone."

But, boys and girls, both Jesus' enemies and His friends were wrong! Jesus did not stay dead at all! Let me tell you what happened.

### A PLEA FROM A SOLDIER

#### PRAYERS BACK HOME BRING SUPERNATURAL HELP FOR US

Due to the spiritual darkness that has covered the eyes of the American people, their vision has been dimmed to the fact that the Supreme Being Who gave us a land of freedom, and has always helped us to keep it, is more than willing to lend a helping hand in this war. God has become angry with the nations, because of their wickedness and has "hissed" them on to one another, as you would "hiss" a bunch of dogs, but He is willing to give shelter from the terror of war to those who will set their faces toward Him for protection, and for protection for our boys on the battle front.

To strengthen your faith, so you will pray in faith believing, let me recall to your memory some things that most of you know about in the first world war. When the Germans were about to use poison gas for the first time, the weather observers assured the German army that the wind was blowing just right and that it would continue blowing in the same direction for thirty-six hours to come. So the gas was released and it was carried toward the allied lines, but just before it reached the Allies, the wind suddenly changed directions and carried the poison gas directly back over the German army, killing thousands of German soldiers. The head of the German meteorological department in his official report said that in forty years of meteorological records of the German Government the wind never acted so peculiarly before. Did this just happen? No. The Almighty God Who rules the wind (Psalms 147:18.) heard some mother crying out for the protection of her boy. God is the same God always.

In the year of 1940 the outlook was dark for the British Empire. France had fallen, and it looked as though the B. E. F. would be annihilated and Britain would be invaded. Had Hitler invaded Britain at that time he might have been successful. But what actually hap-

pened? King George called for a day of prayer throughout the British Empire on Sunday, May 26. Although the hope was little that the 335,000 British troops in France would survive, still the King knew that there was a Supreme Being, and that He would hear and answer prayer. Two days after the day of prayer a miracle took placethe miracle of Dunkirk. God had heard their cry for help, and spoke those words again, "Peace be still," and the old English Channel (ordinarily it is a choppy body of water) became calm, so that even row boats were used to get troops across the channel to safety, for the British were faced with the problem of getting the soldiers across in a hurry. When



the channel became calm every kind of craft available was used. Practically the whole force was saved. The Germans tried to bomb and machine gun them on the beaches and on the channel. Thank God for seeing to that too, for He caused a fog to cover the place round about, so that not even the ships could be seen. This just didn't happen; God did it. He heard some one praying, and calling for help.

Why not do your part in keeping freedom, by spending fifteen or twenty minutes a day on your knees? That time may keep a lot of our boys from the sting of war. People really got down to business in the first world war. The United States could really say then, "In God we trust."

When Moses' hands were held high by his fellowmen, the Israelites marched on to victory. But when his hands were let down, they lost ground in the battle. Pray for our leaders; hold their hands up in prayer. It is not the will of God that you pray for all the Japanese and Germans to be wiped out, but it is His will for you to pray for your country's freedom and peace for the nations along with protection for our boys. God will hear such a prayer as this.

I believe with all my heart, that the Lord will hold the pastors of the churches responsible if they sit back and listen to the radio and read the papers of the slaughtering of mothers' boys, and fail to call a solemn assembly and prayer hours. Not only our boys are falling by the wayside, but thousands of women and children also. Everybody is talking about America getting back to God, while usually those who are talking about it are themselves far from God. Why not start with yourself, and get back to God? If the people back home knew what it would mean, if we would fail to do the job, they would not only pray a few minutes a day, but would hum-ble themselves before God, and fast and pray until God heard and answered. It is not hidden from you what is going on in Africa now. Hundreds of our boys have passed on, because of the lack of prayer back home. When mothers and fathers should have been at church, or somewhere on their knees, they were at the places of amusement having a big time. If the United States falls, they will have a big time, a big time that they never had before. Stop and think when you are about to spend idle time in pleasure. That time would mean much to us, if you would spend it on your knees. There isn't a doubt in my mind about you people praying, but it may be too late by the time you wake up. So "make hay while there is sunshine" for there is a dark cloud coming your way. Remember, we soldiers appreciate your prayers.

# FIGHTERS WHO LIVE CHEEK BY JOWL WITH DEATH TURN TO GOD

"When men are living cheek by jowl with death, they rapidly get down to essentials."

Navy Chaplain Merritt F. Williams, who was aboard the aircraft carrier Wasp when she went down in the Solomons, might have been speaking for all American fighting men when he said this.

From every part of the world where Americans face the realities of war, reports come in to show they turn to reassurances in religious faith.

Shipwrecked sailors, aviators afloat on rubber rafts, soldiers in slit-trenches and in jungle bivouacs later recount how they prayed for deliverance, and sometimes for other things.

Religious conviction—reaffirmed or newly found—is reported all the way through the ranks from ordinary privates and seamen up to the gold braid at the top.

Yank army sergeants have frequently attracted notice for qualities other than religious feeling, yet one recently wrote:

"The chaplain brings the Christian message with an added meaning, because God knows there is comfort and strength in his message."

Religious expression among our fighting men appears often to cut across denominational boundaries in its quest for a reassurance that seems common to all faiths.

Catholics, Protestants and Jews got together on one southern Pacific island to build an army chapel out of native lumber and coral collected on the spot.

A navy dive bomber pilot from the Wasp was reading from his GI Testament after she went down. A Jewish boy near him spoke up: "What does it say of times like these? Read it to us."

More than one fighting man attributes his deeds to divine guidance. A pilot who got his By James D. White

crew out of his cracked-up bomber under hazardous circumstances later said:

"I know some power greater than mine guided my every action. I am glad I was able to do the job but do not want any false glory to be sent my way over it."

Navy Chaplain W. Wyeth at services aboard naval units approaching North Africa grew perceptibly just before battle; were even larger after active engagements.

Soldiers at isolated posts are reported walking miles to attend services. Chaplains baptize fighting men on the spot in the nearest creek, river, or ocean if it is that kind of baptism that's required.

Navy Chaplain W. Wyeth Willard baptised Corp. Arthur S. Tripp in the Lunga river on Guadalcanal along with 17 other leathernecks last December. Tripp's mother, when informed of this, recalled "he never wanted to go to Sunday School or church."

An army chaplain tells how he has ridden with American fliers on jeeps, "racing at breakneck speed," to hear their confessions as they rushed to their planes with the alert howling over the post.

Perhaps the most classic example of religion on the battle front is provided by the oft-told incident in Bataan.

Lieutenant Colonel Warren J. Clear reports how he slipped into a foxhole during a Jap bombardment. There was a sergeant in the foxhole, and "he prayed almost as loud as I did," says Clear, who spoke to him about it.

"Sir," replied the sergeant "there are no atheists in foxholes.


# Bible Stops Bullet!
