

THE LATTER RAIN

In the Bible there are many Scriptures which apply very definitely to certain people in a certain age. The threat of Jerusalem's destruction hung as a sword over the hoary heads of the generation that rejected and crucified Christ.

I have found in the Bible a prophecy which applies to our generation just as surely as the prophecy of Jerusalem's destruction was directed at the generation of Christ's day.

God's message to our generation is found in the fifth chapter of James, verses 1-8. The first six verses are filled with woe because of this world's sins. The last two verses flash upon us a ray of hope from heaven.

"Go to now, ye rich men, weep and howl for your miseries that shall come upon you. Your riches are corrupted and your garments are moth eaten. Your gold and silver is cankered; and the rust of them shall be a witness against you, and shall eat your flesh as it were fire. Ye have heaped treasure together for the last days. Behold, the hire of the laborers who have reaped down your fields, which is of you kept back by fraud, crieth: and the cries of them which have reaped are entered into the ears of the Lord of sabaoth. Ye have lived in pleasure on the earth, and have been wanton; ye have nourished your hearts, as in the day of slaughter. Ye have condemned and killed the just; and he doth not resist you."

That is the dark, but true, picture of the trouble filled age in which we are living; but the next two verses are directed to those who trust in God and in them is a promise and a prophecy which shines as a star of the first magnitude in the sky of this darkened world.

"Be patient therefore, brethren, unto the coming of the Lord. Behold, the husbandman waiteth for the precious fruit of the earth, and hath long patience for it, until he receive the early and latter rain."

To those who ask: "What is God doing now?" this is the answer. He is waiting for the precious fruit of the earth, until it receives the early and the latter rain. Jesus said, "The harvest is the end of the world," or the end of the age.

In the parable of the sower, Jesus said, "The sower is the son of man. The seed is the Word of God. The field is the world." What then, is the harvest? The harvest is the resurrection, and the gathering into heaven of the fruits of that sowing.

The Apostle Paul prophesied of that harvest, saying,"

1 Cor. 15:51, "Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed."

It is for this that the Apostle James encourages the Christians to wait. God is waiting for this moment. We, too, should wait for the coming of His Son from heaven, and for our gathering unto Him.

But before the Lord shall come to gather the harvest of righteous souls, He is waiting, waiting, until the world receives the early and the latter rain.

In the excellent commentary on the whole Bible, produced by Jamieson, Fausset and Brown, we read this comment on James 5:7, "The receiving of the early and latter rains is not to be understood as the object of His hope, but the harvest for which these rains are necessary preliminary. The early rain fell at sowing time, about November or December; the latter rain about March or April, to mature the grain for the harvest. The latter rain that shall precede the coming spiritual harvest will probably be another Pentecost-like effusion of the Holy Ghost."

This commentary was a true forecast and in it they have given the exact meaning of this prophecy. The early rain fell in the days of the Apostles. The latter rain was a great outpouring of the Holy Spirit whereby many thousands of souls were baptized with the Holy Ghost.

These great Bible expositors knew that the latter rain must be of the same element, and must fall in the same manner as the early rain.

Well do I remember when I was a child of only seven years, in the Sabbatarian Church of which my family were members, I heard our minister state that just before the coming of Jesus Christ for His church there would be another outpouring of the Holy Ghost accompanied by the many miracles of healing that attended the early rain of the Apostolic days. The Latter Rain did come, but instead of coming upon our church it began to fall among the Holiness people, and among people of all denominations who, like the disciples of old, had given themselves to prayer and praise, waiting for the promise of the Father.

Just as rain may, and does fall at any season of the year, the Holy Spirit has been given at all seasons since Pentecost; but just as there are, at seed time and at harvest time, seasons of heavy rainfall, even so in God's great field of the world there is now a latter rain of blessing falling upon those who receive the Word of God and believe Him for its promises.

History bears record of many spiritual showers, but today we are living in the midst of a worldwide outpouring, that is indeed The Latter Rain.

Several hundred years ago there was a shower of heavenly rain that fell upon the Jensenites in Holland, and many of them spoke in other tongues as the Apostles and disciples did at Pentecost.

In the outpourings of the Holy Spirit, as in the falling of rain from heaven, we hear the patter as it falls upon the earth.

When the multitude at Pentecost questioned the Apostles about the "Speaking in other tongues," Peter said, "This is that which was

ENTANGLEMENTS THAT AFFECT THE HOME

"Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot;... the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimestone from heaven, and destroyed them all. Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed" (Luke 17:28-30).

Sodom is God's picture of an utterly godless world, a society which has neither time nor place for Him.

The detailed story behind our text is in Genesis 19. Lot is held up to us as the example of a man of God (cf. 2 Pet. 2:7,8) entangled in a wicked world, and unready for the call of God's mercy. He is set forth as a "righteous" man, a man justified by faith, but is trying to make the best of both worlds.

The Word clearly foretells the coming dissolution of the world, a time which will also be one of disillusion. The Lord says that many will find themselves unready for the day of His coming. We need to readjust our outlook and examine ourselves in the light of this coming greatest of all crices.

IT IS A PASSING WORLD

1. How insignificant it is.

Unreadiness to meet the Lord Jesus Christ is, first of all, a result of wrong views of this world. If only we were high enough up, we could see things in their right perspective. I looked down on the streets of New York from the top of the Woolworth Building. I was impressed with the smallness of things. On another occasion I visited Victoria Falls, Northern Rhodesia, South Africa. These are vaster than Niagara. We saw the Falls from beneath, from the sides, from the front, and were left speechless with their magnificence. Then we climbed aloft in a plane, and from thousands of feet in the air we looked down on what had held us in awe. But from that height, the immense cataract looked like a teacup of water flowing over a crack in the earth. It is good to see things from God's point of veiw. What the world considers so magnificent, its positions, politics, power, and prizes, must seem trifling when seen as God sees them.

These trifles have become so important to many who call themselves Christians, that their absorption in them renders them unready for that great Day and the appearing of the Lord Jesus Christ.

2. How unreal it all is.

The world does seem solid. Think of the prestige of its educational institutions; the surprises of its inventions; the honor of its positions; the whirl of its excitements; the comfort of its

wealth; the tragedy of its griefs; the shame of its crimes, and the acuteness of its poverty. We live so near these things. They fill our horizons and seem so real. We concentrate our thoughts upon them, and live our lives in their pursuit.

But how do they look to God? He is the all-wise One and sees all these things from the standpoint of His understanding. His thoughts are not our thoughts.

I visited an insane asylum in Tokyo on one occasion. A girl sat in a patch of sunlight, singing away without a care in the world. Sorrow did not exist for her; she was perfectly happy. One man complained to me of the jealousy of the royal family. He said they had placed him in that institution (he realized where he was) because of the marvelous discoveries he had made. He spoke perfect English and had climbed to education's highest heights. I met one who said he was a famous general, and who was proud of his military exploits although he actually had had no experience as a soldier. Another wept incessantly; life was one long and unbroken sorrow to him. I looked on them all pityingly, realizing that their various emotional reactions could be traced to a delusion.

The delusion viewed here is not the only form of misconception seen in the world today. When Christians display a lack of balance concerning the things of this passing world, this also is the product of a delusion. "For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God." (1 Cor. 3:19) "And the world passeth away and the lust thereof" (1 John 2:17); its joys, sorrows, education, exploits, and possessions are all doomed as the Sodom of old. Yet Christians cling to, concentrate on, and seek after these things as though they are the only realities in life.

3.. How impermanent it is.

This world is all passing away; it will not last. Men clutch a bubble, and find it as impermanent as the picture on the movie screen. The story flickers for a few brief moments and then is gone. And thus go the affairs of this impermanent world, its history, the rise and fall of empires. Some strong man grasps power for a brief decade, dictators come and go, the peoples are oppressed and men live and die. Wars, earthquakes, and famines interrupt for a time; movements—educational, political, commercial, religious—all enliven its tedium; then the curtain falls and all is over for that generation. The universe is spiraling its way at incredible speed into the unmeasured voids of eternity, but only man is unready for the finale!

And Christians? Many, just as unready as Lot, are clinging to these passing and rapidly dissolving elements of the world as though they were eternal. What fools men are!

IS LOT'S HOME TYPICAL?

God would have us look into that home. We may see much to remind us of our own. If so, it presents a call to repentance, a real house-cleaning and preparation for that great Day.

1. It was a religious home.

Peter tells us that Lot was "vexed with the ithy conversation of the wicked" (2 Pet. 2:7) mong whom he dwelt. Then why did he live (Page 7, Please)

THE GRACE OF GOD

Titus 2:11. "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men."

Grace means favor, and favor means to oblige, accommodate, lend, give help, bear, and such as is necessary to bless and do good to another and to extend.

Upon one occasion the Lord Jesus said to Paul, "My grace is sufficient for thee." In other words, the Holy Ghost would help and sustain Paul in his trials.

The Bible speaks of great grace (which means great favor, help and blessing) rested upon the early church even more than ordinarily.

To my mind there is included in grace (or the grace of God) every good and every precious element that goes to make God all that He is to us in Jesus Christ.

The love of God is diffused to us through grace, and is composed of such elements as to lend, extend mercy, forebear, wait patiently, bear, accommodate, etc, as well as many other avenues of blessings which become the result of God's grace.

A LONELY HIDING PLACE

Would you like to hear the story of how the heavenly Father took care of a man long ago? The man's name was Elijah. He was a strange looking man. He wore a coat of camel's hair and a leather belt about his waist. But if you could have heard his voice, you would have known how brave and strong he was. God loved Elijah very much. Do you know why? It was because he listened to God and was obedient. Even though God gave him hard things to do, he always obeyed. Wouldn't it be nice if that could be said about us?

One day Elijah heard something that made him both angry and sad. He heard that King Ahab was building temples, not to our God, but to images and to the sun and moon. Now Elijah knew that idols could not help the people. Only the heavenly Father could do that. He even heard that this king would kill anyone who wouldn't worship them. So Elijah went alone to talk with God God spoke to Elijah, "Go to King Ahab and tell him that there shall not be dew nor rain upon the earth for years until I tell thee to speak the word." there? No one was to blame but himself. Lot had a good upbringing. He had traveled for some years with his uncle Abram and had been taught in the things of God. But a prosperous world appealed to his carnal soul, and he turned aside and settled down in Sodom. He became one of its elders and judges, a politician in fact. He concentrated his attention on its prizes and positions. He was the Old Testament equivalent for modernday Christians.

Then when the crisis came, he found that his life had undermined his testimony. Warned by the angelic messengers of the approaching doom of Sodom, he hurried to the young men who were to marry his daughters, to urge them also to flee from this city of destruction. But they laughed. And rightly too. Lot talked to them of a day in which "the world will be destroyed." Some of us talk just as piously of the coming of the Lord Jesus. Lot talked in this way, as we do in ours, and with as little effect. They laughed.

Did it look as though Lot believed his own words? If he did, why busy himself accumulating its treasures, seeking its position, picking its rich eligibles as husbands for his daughters? Obviously he talked one way and acted another.

Do you believe the Lord Jesus Christ is coming soon? Do you act like it, or are you concentrating your interest in a world which you say is to be destroyed? Is this not inconsistent? Do you live as though you believe He is coming soon? The testimony to His near return is to be one of action, not merely words.

2. It was a worldly home.

I suspect Lot's wife was unsaved, perhaps a woman of Sodom. Her heart was in the world she loved, and her later fate of being turned into stone was the symbolic demonstration of the true condition of her heart. Lot's daughters were to marry Sodomites, who were, no doubt, men of good position in the city. Position meant more than piety to Lot and his wife, and this same motive sways many Christian parents today. They look for men of property, of good earthly prospects, rather than men of probity, and professing godliness. Many Christian parents fling their girls into the arms of ungodly men for the price of a good position. So planned Lot.

This home of his was uncongenial to the heavenly messengers. Though invited to enter, they declined, and finally only with great reluctance did they agree. Is your home one into which the Lord Jesus can enter with contentment? Would He feel at home as He looked at the books on its shelves, the magazines on its table, the pictures on the walls? Would He enjoy listening with you to your radio programs, and sitting in the group when your visitors make a social call? Even though you are a church member, is yours a worldly home where no prominence is given to Him?

3. It was a dangerous home.

On the night Lot entertained the two heavenly visitors, his home was besieged. Men of Sodom

attacked it, demanding that the visitors be thrown out to them. Lot, shocked at this suggested betrayal of Eastern hospitality, volunteered to sacrifice his daughters to the lusts of Sodom. It was a new thing to find Lot's door locked against Sodom. Hitherto any Sodomite had been welcome. Lot's motto was "peace at any price."

Today as the light of the glory of His coming begins to break through the clouds, we can see a remarkable similarity in Christian homes. They too, are besieged by men and women of the world who pound at the door yelling, "Bring them out." The calls of the world come over the radio, the telephone, through the mail, in its music and in its literature. The modern Sodom wants to drag out and prostitute the heavenly messengers to cur own souls. It wants to put an end to the daily prayer, the Word, the worship of God, our hope of heaven, and the salvation of our children. The children add their pleas, wanting to drink of this strange excitement which Sodom produces.

For the sake of the peace in the home, we fling out our girls, our boys, to the ungodly mob that besieges our home. Let them go into the arms of the Sodomites in fairly good positions! So long as our own religious life is not disturbed, we stupefy our consciences and try to forget the Day is at hand, and our children are adrift in the company of the men and women of Sodom.

A young girl of sixteen came into one of our meetings in Johannesburg, South Africa. She came with fear, for she had been forbidden to go to a religious service. The previous night she had come home too drunk to find the electric light switch. Her parents did not mind that, but they did object to the disturbing element, religion. They, of course, were of the world, but many a Christian home today is a home of sorrow, or ought to be, because the children are finding all the excitement they want in the arms of Sodom. They learned its ways in the home, read its literature there, were introduced to its ideas, tasted of its wines there, and so went to Sodom with all the eagerness they had, when father and mother let them go.

THE ESCAPE FOR LIFE

1. The certainty of destruction.

Death is inevitable and destruction foretold. "It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment" (Heb. 9:27). Paul, Peter, John, all combine in one similar note of warning. Sin's doom is unavoidable. God is not God, if there is no hell, for otherwise how can His holiness be demonstrated? Sin is sin, whether committed by a Christian or non-Christian. Salvation does not sanctify sin, nor does church membership sanctify a worldly home.

2. The call to abandon something.

God calls us to let go the prizes of this world. What if this leaves us a little poorer? Of what value will these things be when He comes? He calls us to abandon the heart which loves the things of Sodom.

3. Grace that saves from the coming wrath.

The voice of God is resounding today as never before, "Escape for thy life." Its equivalent in the New Testament for Christians today is, "Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him" Matt. 25:6). We must be in the way when He comes.

We had a terrible fire in Tokyo once. Some four thousand houses were completely destroyed. Our little world of that time went, and all our possessions. The first warning awakened me, but sleepily, thinking the fire was a mile away, I went back to bed. But the insistent clamor of the fire alarm finally stirred us and we escaped with our lives. So many today go back to sleep.

Our gracious Lord puts out His helping hand. He brings trouble, disturbance, sickness, poverty, disappointment into the home. These are His "hands," seeking to shake us into consciousness in readiness for the meeting with Him. Let us respond to His loving purposes and prepare for Him. He wants our children with us "when He cometh." Are your boys and girls on the way to heaven, or are they out in Sodom?

When I was a small boy of eleven years, I took four friends of the same age for a picnic. I knew the spot; I was the guide. We walked for miles. It was a place with a deep, swift river on the one hand, a high bank with a canal above it on the other—a grand place for boys. We ate our lunches and played for hours.

The time to return came. One boy, washing the mud off his feet, dropped his shoe in a pool on the edge of the river. In reaching for it, he fell in and was immediately swept into the center of the stream. A second boy grabbed for him, missed, became over-balanced, and was also carried out. I saw my last conscious sight of them, two little arms upstretched from the water. I remember nothing more until I found myself, a little boy of eleven, striped naked, crying on the river bank. What I had intended to do, or tried to do, I have no knowledge.

Three of us trudged home those weary miles not knowing what to say. A little time after our return, a young mother came in. "Where's my Jack?"

And I stood there with hanging head and said, "He's drowned."

I was taken back to the spot to identify two little corpses. I will never forget that mother's wail, "Where's my Jack?"

Is it possible that some who have trusted the grace of God for salvation may find themselves through that grace securely and eternally saved when He comes, and yet miss the boys and the girls? Will they wail, "Where's my boy? Where's

Dear Saints and Friends:

Greetings in the Name of the Lord from Bucaramanga, Colombia! We are very happy to send greetings from this land of spiritual darkness, where many perish not having ever heard of the way of life.

First we wish to thank you very much for your deep interest in the work here, for your spiritual and material support. We pray the Lord's richest blessings upon you all.

Since our last letter to you we have enjoyed the blessings of the Lord. The enemy of our souls also has been at work, trying to destroy that which the Lord has built up. We recently had the privilege of baptizing two more in the precious Name of the Lord. One of these has received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. She is very happy in the service of the Lord and has a great determination to go all the way. although it will mean much persecution for her. This sister is the sole support of three children and has a very hard time to make a living. Since she left the darkness of Romanism she has received many persecutions from her relatives. They have tried to cut off all her means of support, thinking by doing so she would turn back to the Roman Church.

Again this Easter season we witnessed the processions of the idols from the churhes, carried through the streets by men dressed in their long black robes, with hoods over their faces. Also we saw the midnight procession of men carrying heavy crosses through the streets. They were accompanied by the priest, saying prayers and asking the virgin to save them. These poor souls think by doing this they are repenting and will be able to find favor in the eyes of God and enter into eternal life. We were told that these men, before starting in the procession, enter into the church and beat one another with sticks, making the carrying of the cross more painful. Also some of the men had weights tied on their crosses to increase their sufferings. Martin Luther surely knew the truth when he said man could not be saved by dead works. To see these processions one would think they were in a land that taught nothing about Christ. It is easy to understand the darkness of Romanism, when one tries to sell Bibles to these people. (They say it is evil to read the Bibles and that it is only for the priest.)

Three days before Easter none of the church bells were allowed to ring, because they say all the world was in sorrow while Jesus was in the tomb. What a blessing it would be if people here would seek to worship the Lord in Spirit and in truth, with as much zeal as they seek to worship Him by the keeping of the church holidays. During this season we were molested more than usual by people urged on by the priest. In one part of the town we were compelled to close the meetings because of the commotion caused by young boys sent to disturb and prevent the Word from going forth. The owner of the house in which we had the meetings has forbidden us to have more there

spoken of by the prophet Joel, it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, that I will pour out of my spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and daughters shall prophesy."

From the writings of Stanley H. Frodsham, in his book, "With Signs Following," comes this most interesting record of showers of blessing.

Some years ago, V. P. Simmons of Frostproof, Florida, wrote a tract in which he told of many gracious manifestations of the Spirit that he had seen in New England. He stated, "In 1854, Elder S. G. Matthewson spoke in tongues and Elder Edwin Burnham interpreted the same. The writer knew both of these men of God well, and had often sat under their preaching. They were large men, physically, mentally, and spiritually." He witnessed a revival in New England in 1873, and stated, "The talking in tongues, accompanied largely with the gift of healing, was manifested."

In the year 1873, Dwight L. Moody and Ira Sankey went to England. The story of their visit is recorded in a book entitled, "Moody and Sankey in Great Britain," by Robert Boyd, published in 1875.

The two workers from America did not receive a very good reception in the beginning. They were invited to Sunderland, but their presence there aroused a good deal of opposition from unsympa-A delegation of young men thetic ministers. waited on Mr. Moody and asked him to speak at the Y. M. C. A. He consented. The Lord began to send a gracious awakening. Mr. Boyd described what he himself witnessed at one meeting. "When I got to the rooms of the Y. M. C. A. I found the meeting on fire. The young men were speaking in tongues, and prophesying. What did it all mean? Only that Moody had been addressing them that afternoon. Many of the clergy were so opposed to the movement that they turned their backs upon the innocent Y. M. C. A. But afterwards, when the floodgates of divine grace were opened, Sunderland was taken by storm....The people of Sunderland warmly supported the movement, in spite of their spiritual advisors. There was a tremendous work of grace." This same story was published in "Moody and His Work" by W. H. Daniels.

Thirty-four years later there was a similar visitation in Sunderland, not this time in the Y. M. C. A. but in an Episcopal Church. On this latter occasion Christian leaders made their way to Sunderland from all parts of England. They were filled with the Spirit as on the day of Pentecost with the similar evidence of speaking in tongues. As they returned to their own assemblies the fire spread, and many received a like experience.

In the Encyclopedia Brittanica, the 11th Edition, Volume 27, on pages 9 and 10, we read, concerning the Glossarial, that is, speaking in other tongues recurs in Christian revivals of every age, and it lists some of these: Among the mendicant friars of the thirteenth century, among the Jensenites and early Quakers, among the converts of Wesley and Whitfield, among the persecuted Protestants of Cevennes, and among the Irvinites.

Writing of the revivals among the Huguenots, Pastor A. A. Boddy states: "When Louis XIV of France, in 1685 revoked the edict of Nantes which had given religious liberty, he strove by dragonades to drive Protestants into the Roman Catholic church. The Huguenots were led by John Cavalier, a farmer, into inaccessible mountains. Among these persecuted people were those who spoke in tongues. There are records both by enemies and by friends as to their prophetic gifts."

It was stated by Elbert Hubbard, in Little Journeys to the Homes of the Great, "That only in inception and persecution is any religion pure."

At the time when Huguenots were suffering great persecutions in France, many of them were filled with the Spirit, and the gifts of the Spirit were in manifestation including the speaking in other tongues.

A book was issued in 1749 by the learned Dr. Middleton who discredited the miraculous powers, especially the speaking in other tongues. He said, "After the Apostolic times, there is not, in all history, one instance, either well attested, or even so much as mentioned, of any particular person who had ever exercised the gift of tongues, or pretended to exercise it in any age or country whatever."

It was left to John Wesley to make a protest against this statement. He wrote to Dr. Middleton, "Sir, your memory fails you again....It has been heard of more than once, no further off than the valleys of Dauphiny."

In the Diary of Thomas Walsh, one of Wesley's foremost preachers, on March 8, 1750, he entered this record, "This morning the Lord gave me language that I knew not of, raising my soul to Him in a wonderful manner."

What does all this mean? It is simply that God is doing that which He promised.

Isa. 28:11, "For with stammering lips and another tongue will he speak to this people. To whom he said, This is the rest wherewith ye may cause the weary to rest; and this is the refreshing: yet they would not hear."

The Apostle Paul quoted this Scripture in explaining the speaking in other tongues that was manifest in the New Testament church. I Cor. 14:21,22, "In the law it is written, With men of other tongues and other lips will I speak unto this people; and yet for all that they will not hear me, saith the Lord. Wherefore tongues are for a sign, not to them that believe, but to them that believe not."

When the Holy Spirit fell upon the disciples at Pentecost, and they all began to speak with other tongues Peter explained this manifestation of the Spirit by saying, "This is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel; And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out of my Spirit upon all flesh." Acts 2:16-17.

The latter rain of the Holy Spirit is now falling.

Jesus Christ from heaven is soon coming. His church shall rise to meet him in the air. Have you been filled with the Holy Spirit? Look up, and open your heart to the Lord. Let this Latter Rain Blessing fall on you.
