GENERAL CHAIRMAN'S TRAVELS

On March 9th we left Columbus for Gladewater, Texas, to attend a convention being held at the church there being pastored by our young Brother E. E. Lewis, President of our P. Y. P. A.

The convention opened on March 12th and closed on the 19th. There was a fine turnout of ministers numbering perhaps 40 or more, including Presbyters Blankenship, Williams, and Fauss; also our good District Elder Bro. Hosch, and many other of our aggressive ministers. The convention was owned of God from the start, and practically the entire program was enjoyed by those present. Each day, except Saturday, there was a half-hour broadcast program from Longview, Texas, some 12 miles from Gladewater.

Our Bro. Lewis is doing a very notable work in Gladewater, and we feel that his church received a real spiritual uplift from the visiting ministers.

On March 13th, we left Gladewater for San Antonio, Texas, as we had been announced to preach the anniversary sermon for the Missionary Bible Training School, being conducted by L. W. Coote. The missionary training part of this work is somewhat a part of a new venture, but certainly has big possibilities. Bro. Coote is conducting a very business-like program, including short term Bible courses, and other helpful studies. The atmosphere of this school is deeply spiritual. Bro. Coote has a downtown church, and is working in fellowship with some other churches in San Antonio, and we were kept very busy. Our Bro. Wm. A. Mulford and his

family are very able assistants to Bro. Coote. It would be interesting to our readers to know that Bro. Coote purposes the incorporation of the San Antonio work, and the placing of the property, including the properties in Japan, under a Board of Trustees. This will insure donors to this work a definite interest and that the properties will not be in the name of any individual.

The meetings in San Antonio seemed to be blessed of the Lord to the edification of the saints and to the encouragement of the workers.

We left San Antonio on the 20th of March for a two-nights' meeting with our good Bro. O. F. Fauss in Houston, Texas. We certainly enjoyed ourselves ministering to his people, as well as the good old Southern hospitality of the Fauss home. Bro. Fauss' traditional saying that he would "treat us all kinds of ways and we're bound to like some of them" was not literally true, as we enjoyed all of our treatment there. Houston has one of our finest churches and one of our best pastors. The week following our visit, they were to have a mortgage-burning, which speaks well for their business management a fine church paid for in a short time.

On the whole, we could say that "good old Texas" is making progress. On our way home we stopped for a few hours at Tulsa and visited with Bro. and Sister Williams and Kathryn Hendricks. They are really going through. We had the privilege of speaking briefly to their student body. Preaching three times a day is not so hard when your audience is really hungry.



The Women's Page

WOMEN OF THE BIBLE Eve

Paul wrote to the Corinthians that "all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come." He had reference to the lives and experiences of the Hebrew forefathers. With this in mind, let us study together the lives of some of the women of the Word of God. Surely there will be profitable lessons in each one.

Eve was a glorious creation, wrought by the hand of God from the side of the man. Her creation was typical of the Church even before the fall necessitated the atonement. Remember that on the cross the side of Christ was pierced, and forthwith came blood and water, two essentials of entry into the Bride of Christ.

When we think of Eve, we do not associate her with the glory of creation or redemption. She is synonymous with temptation in the minds of humanity. Church women of today are sometimes inclined to think of her as perhaps of inferior intelligence and weak in moral strength. As we study her life, let's make mental comparisons with ourselves and see what kind of person she was.

We read of her conflict with Satan in Genesis 3. Think of the power of her adversary. He came to her, perhaps as she was gathering fruit for a meal, and said, "Hasn't God said you shouldn't eat from any of these trees?" His first statement insinuated doubt of God. Eve, alarmed at this challenge, answered, "Oh, no, we can eat from any of them except one, and we can't even touch that, lest we die." Under the influence of this arch enemy of her soul, the woman was already slipping. She added to the Word of God. God had not told them to refrain from touching the tree. She exaggerated, but did this mean she was stupid? Exaggeration is still a feminine characteristic in this year of 1944, even among church women. We hear it frequently. Harmless? It may mean that Satan is closing in on us. It's a good idea to watch our conversation for this fault.

Then Satan lied to her. "Ye shall not surely die." Can't you just hear the tone of his voice as he tried to convince her? Like a parent, trying to get a silly notion out of the head of a child. "How silly to believe that you would die if you ate from the tree! Listen, God just wants you to believe you will die because He knows that if you eat of this fruit, you would be as gods, knowing all things." So he talked, deceiving her with words.

Eve looked at the tree with a new realization of its possibilities. "It was good for food." This was a practical conclusion, one to which any of

us might agree. The fact that she was considering food was no sin. In Proverbs 31, where we have God's portrait of an ideal woman, we see that she is concerned about food. "She bringeth her food from afar. She riseth also while it is yet night, and giveth meat to her household, and a portion to her maidens."

"It was pleasant to her eyes." Was her love of beautiful things sinful? Not in itself. Again in Proverbs God's ideal woman "maketh herself coverings of tapestry; her clothing is silk and purple."

"It was to be desired to make one wise." Was her desire for wisdom a sinful desire? No, the unchanging God has always rewarded a true desire for wisdom. The woman of Proverbs "openeth her mouth in wisdom; and in her tongue is the law of kindness."

The sin of Eve was not in the desires which were a part of her personality, and which are a part of every normal woman today. Her sin was in allowing these desires to become a channel of temptation through which she was led to disobedience. Satan, that master psychologist of Eden, and of the world today, knows the fundamental characteristics of every woman, and how to use them to his advantage. If he was so successful in plotting the downfall of the first woman, how much more successful is he now?

Another phase of the temptation was Eve's influence on her husband. "She took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her, and he did eat." What a terrible result of her temptation and sin! Her influence turned God's noblest handiwork into a miserable individual who whined—"....She gave it to me,I was afraid, and hid myself." How Satan must have laughed. But the fact that Eve influenced Adam isn't nearly so sad to contemplate as the fact that women today are still leading men away from God through means which are just as simple as the desires of the heart of Eve. Little everyday things are turned into stumbling-blocks when placed at the disposal of Satan.

Some wise person has said "Woman was taken from man; not from the head of man, to rule over him; not from his feet, to be trampled upon; but from his side, to share the joys, sorrows and triumphs of life together." What a privilege God bestowed upon woman! Let us search our hearts and lives in the sight of God and His plan for Woman, and see if we are living beneath our priv-What of the husband of the Ideal ilege in Him. "The heart of her husband doth safely Woman? trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil. She will do him good and not evil all the days of Her husband is known in the gates, when he sitteth among the elders of the land.... and he praiseth her." How do we fit in God's pattern? Let's take measurements! How do we fit in with

THE LAW and GRACE

Prayer

O, Almighty God, of all perfect laws, harmonies and order, be Thou most gracious unto the writer and readers of this article. Cause Thy Holy law to push us into the very heart of Thy great love and grace, May Thy grace keep us and forbid our doing any wrong that will bring reproach upon Thy law and Thy hallowed Name. We ask this in Jesus, our Lord's Name, Amen.

Introduction

Dear Ones: The following subject, "The Law and Grace," is so great that the writer makes no attempt to exhaust it but merely to write on the subject in the hope that it will be a great blessing to all who read it. We ask your prayers and forgiveness if you think we are wrong.

The Crying Grace

"Then he answered and spake unto me, saying, This is the word of the Lord unto Zerubbabel, saying Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, saith the Lord of Hosts. Who art thou, O great mountain? before Zerubbabel, thou shalt become a plain: and he shall bring forth the headstone thereof with shoutings, crying, Grace, Grace unto it." Zechariah 4:6,7.

God loves mankind. He was pleased of His own self to create us, and He created all nature to serve us. He has not only provided us with good things for our bodies, but He has also graciously given us two great Documents, namely "Law and Grace."

"Law" is not "Grace" just as "Spirit" is not "flesh." There is a vast difference between grace and law. The difference is as great as the difference between the sun and moon. As it is impossible to have moonlight at sunny noon-day, even so is it impossible to live under law and grace at the same time. If you are not living in Grace, you are under the Law. If you are filled with the Spirit and life of Grace, you need not serve the Law.

The Law is not given to the holy, righteous, blessed, gracious, loving, submissive and meek people, but to the unjust, immoral, rebellious, cruel and lawless persons (1 Tim. 1:9,10). Thus, since both of these characters of people are in existence, there was a need of these two divine documents. The good person has grace that makes him good. The bad person has laws to constrain him and punish him for his bad deeds, teaching him a valuable lesson and also saving society from his dangerous acts.

Man was not made for the Law. The Law was made for man to teach him and serve him for his own ultimate good after being deceived by the mystery of iniquity (Mark 2:24-27).

The Great Contrast

There is a great contrast between these two blessed gifts from God to man, and Grace will be much more appreciated by knowing this contrast. In order that you may know better what the Grace of God really is, we will now prayerfully endeavor to explain the difference between the Law and the Grace of God. May the gracious God open the eyes of our understanding to grasp the true meaning of His Grace, and begin to rest in His love and praise Him for it.

The following practical statements are based mainly on Romans 3rd to 10th Chapters; Galatians 2nd to 5th chapters; Hebrews 4th, 7th and 10th chapters, and other Scriptures. If you will prayerfully read all of these chapters and their connecting references in other New Testament Books, you will say, "Amen!" to each of these statements.

The Law And Grace

- 1. The Law reveals that we are sold to Satan and are slaves to sin.

 Grace reveals that Christ has redeemed us to make us sons of God. (Heb. 2:9-15.)
- 2. The Law rebukes the weak sinners. Grace strengthens and blesses the confessing soul. (Psalms 39:11.)
- 3. The Law severely condemns the guilty man. Grace sweetly and freely justifies him that believes.
- 4. The Law brings the wrath of God upon the sinner.
 Grace. through Christ, our Lord, saves him from it. (Romans 4:15-5:9.)
- 5. The Law opens man's infirmities, exposes and unmasks his sin, putting him in a open shame. Grace covers all his iniquities when confessed, as love that covers a multitude of sins.
- 6. The Law, when broken or disobeyed, brings us into God's hatefulness and judgments.
 Grace brings us into God's mercy and goodwill.
- 7. The Law says, Do, and do it all, and live. Grace says, Believe that it is done for you, and that Jesus paid it all. (John 6:28,29.)
- 8. The Law rules with an iron rod. Grace rules with the compassion of God.
- 9. The Law means no favor to the undeserved. Grace means the divine gift to the undeserved or the unworthy believer.
- 10. The Law commands us to seek after God Who hides Himself from the ungodly.
 Grace says the Lord left His glory and came down to seek that which was lost, and died for the ungodly. (Luke 19:10.)

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THE LAW and GRACE -contd.

- 11. The Law says the world must labor hard to earn life eternal.

 Grace says, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should have everlasting life."
- 12. The Law says, "You must die, because you have sinned."
 Grace says, "Jesus died for you, believe and pass from judgment into life eternal."
- 13. The Law demands many lambs and sacrifices. Grace says, "Behold the Lamb of God."
- 14. The Law says, "You must be perfect in holiness and righteousness, or else you are doomed."

 Grace says, "Christ is made unto us who truly believe, righteousness, sanctification, wisdom and redemption." (1 Corinthians 1:23-31.)
- 15. The Law separates God from sinful man. Grace brings the repenting and hungry soul into His very presence.
- 16. The Law makes God our Judge and Monarch. Grace, in Jesus, makes Him our Father, Elder Brother and Comforter. (Isaiah 12.)
- 17. The Law causes anxiety and despair. Grace causes peace and satisfaction. (Rom. 7.)
- 18. The Law causes discouragement and doubt. Grace creates courage and faith.
- 19. The Law is the doorway to tears, sadness and shame. Grace is the doorway to gladness and glory.
- 20. The Law, like the blood of Abel, cries out vengeance. Grace offers the blood of Jesus which speaks better things than that of Abel.
- 21. The Law says, "Go thy way and do well, then come and expect favors."

 Grace says, "Come first and get the favors, then go thy way to tell it and show it to others everywhere."
- 22. The Law furnishes a high priest, who was a sinner himself and who had to offer a sacrifice for himself first—and even with that the priest would die, and another take his place. Grace has given us a High Priest Who is Holy, unchangeable and Who once gave His own life for us and by one sacrifice that perfects all who come to God by Him; and He ever lives to make intercession for us. The old law's high priest had always to stand up, serving God and praying for others, making sacrifices, but of Jesus it is said: "He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of Majesty on high." The word "sat" means completion of redemption, or the finished work of Christ on the Cross for us. (Heb. 1:1-5.)
- 23. The Law torments and appoints us to the eternal torment in hell.

 Grace gives peace, and points out to the believing and trusting soul the eternal bliss of heaven. (John 14:1,2.)
- 24. The Law is our schoolmaster.

- Grace makes them that accept Christ Jesus the sons of the Lord and Master.
- 25. God could save no one by His holy Law. By His Grace many are saved through faith—and even that is a gift of God to us. (Romans 1:16; Acts 15:10,11.)
- 26. The Law was given by Moses, a servant in and for God's household.

 Grace came by Jesus Christ the owner of His own house, yea, He is also the Lord God of Moses.
- 27. The Law killed Moses and all those who came out of Egypt with him, save two.

 Grace made our Lord give His own life for us voluntarily and to take it up again and become our very life in the Holy Spirit and neither He nor any of His true followers shall ever die.
- 28. The Law brought all of those in the wilderness to the banks of Jordan to face the swelling river of death and die there.
 Grace furnished Joshua (a type of Jesus) who took Israel (God's people) across the river Jordan and led them into Canaan land in Grace. Jesus (or Jehovah God) has become our salvation. (Isaiah 12th chapter).
- 29. The Law had a beginning and it ended in Christ.

 Grace began with Christ and is the endless life of bliss and glory. (Acts 15:24, 28:23, Col. 2:14 etc.)
- 30. The Law saps out man's life while he endlessly struggles but finally fails and is sadly defeated. Grace began to flow in and through God's Son unto a more abundant life.
- 31. The Law gives us heavy unbearable yokes and burdens which crush the one under them. Grace says, "His yoke is easy and His burden is light", when we are yoked with Christ. (Acts 15:10)
- 32. The Law means Old Testament orders and rules or Divine arrangements that must be obeyed (the Ten Commandments, etc), a thing that has and always will cause confusion, fears and shame, making the poor and conscientious man a wretched thing until he cries out, "O wretched man that I am, who shall deliver me from this body of death." Grace comes to his rescue and saves, even through Jesus Christ our Lord. The Law brought man into a state which is likened to a bruised reed and a smoking flax, while Grace brought God into manhood not to break but to heal the bruised reed, and to quench not, but to ablaze the smoking flax. (Matt. 12:20,21)
- 33. Under the Law, sin has dominion over men. Under Grace sin shall have no dominion over him, because the sin question is settled by Christ and in Christ for those who come to God by Him and believe in His grace. (Rom. 6th chapter)

WISDOM

"Happy is the man that findeth wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding. She is a tree of life to them that lay hold upon her: and happy is everyone that retaineth her."

Today, as never before, there is a wave of youth delinquency sweeping this great nation. Certainly many of our leaders, both judical and religious, are becoming vitally concerned and are seeking methods to slow down and if possible completely eradicate this junior crime wave.

While many are seeking ways and means to combat this, many, yes, the great majority, are saying this, "Let the young people have a chance to learn about sin, let them sow their wild oats. How else will they ever be able to learn about the evils of sin?"

There are parents in even Christian homes that are at a loss as to what to say to that son or daughter just budding into manhood or womanhood. They realize that many of the ideas and traditions handed down from grandmother or grandfather are hardly usable in the fast modern age of today. These parents are honest. (God bless them.) AT EASE IN ZION Amos 6:1

"Woe to them that are at ease in Zion." Israel was in the zenith of her power under the reign of Jeroboam II. Pleasure and riches were plentiful. Everyone was busily engaged with his own affairs, and the house of God and His work were almost forgotten.

Into a setting such as this, came Amos with his message of coming woes. God was weary of repenting, tired of pleading with a nation whose eyes were blinded with worldliness whose ears were stopped to the mighty voice of their God.

They must have laughed at Amos, - this carefree, luxury-filled people. They probably considered him a pessimist; one of those gloomy fellows who was always trying to cast a blight on someone's happiness. But he was a prophet of God with God's Word burning in his heart and he could not be still. "Woe to them that are at ease in Zion."

Coming down to 1944, to a church bought by His blood, and saved by His grace, I seem to hear the voice of Jesus repeating the words of the old prophet, "Woe to them that are at ease in Zion."

have not laid up.....shouting over an eternal home we have not worked for.....preaching about stars in our crowns that we have not sent on ahead—such, I fear, is the position many of us are in today. Where do you stand?

Here and there are scattered men and women who have caught the vision, and who are going forth with the Word of God hid in their hearts; taking it to others wo have never heard.



WHAT GOOD IS A GRUDGE?—CONTD.

The presence of a grudge prevents the development of real assurance. It is a constant reminder of an experience that once undermined your self-confidence and faith in others, and as long as you keep it alive you'll find that you never grow away from it.

THE LAW and GRACE -contd.

- 34. To be under the Law is to have a life-time struggle to do God's will. Under Grace, one is in God's good and perfect will. (Col. 2:8-10)
- 35. God wrote the old Law on two hard stone tables. Grace caused the same God to write His new Law, the law of liberty, into our broken hearts to live it with God-given new life. (Heb. 8:7-13)

36. The Law, first Divine Document, is a law unto bondage or a law of bondage. Grace, the second Divine Document, is a law unto liberty, or "The Law of liberty", and it declares, "If the Son shall set you free, ye are free indeed." (John 8:31-36) Grace is the law of liberty to free those condemned by the law of bondage. Thus, after all, we who are saved and live under the Grace of God, are not left to be lawless, but are brought to a place where righteousness of the old law is proved in us who live not after the flesh but after the sweet and Holy Spirit of Jesus. Yea, we are, or should be, a living monument of the law of liberty which shows the way of a joyful life to dying souls and by the Grace of God we are enabled to live a life that causes us daily to love our enemies, to bless them that curse us and to pray for them that de-spitefully use us. Yea, we are to be gracious through the love of God. We are to be merciful to our victims because God had mercy on us, the victims of His broken Law. Such is, or should be, the life-conduct of those who are saved, that all men might see the good works of God being manifested in us and which will cause them to see and glorify our Father which is in Heaven and Who also dwells and lives in us. (James 1:22-25)

Warning! Warning!

Beware therefore, of those who turn God's grace into lasciviousness, who are acting godly for gain, who profess God's grace, mercy, love and goodness to them, yet at the same time act mean and live selfish lives, causing sorrow and confusion to others. Such "professors" are false prophets and "by their fruits ye shall know them." Let us heed the exhortation of the apostles given to the saved ones in Hebrews 10:21-27:

"And having an high priest over the house of God; let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering (for he is faithful that promised); And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching. For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins, but a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries."

Also, in Romans 13:11-14:
"And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying, but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof."

Again the Apostle says: (Titus 2:11-15)

"For the grace of God that bringeth salvation, hath appeared to all men, teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts: we should live soberly, righteously and Godly in this present world, looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and Saviour Jesus Christ. Who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto Himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. These things speak and exhort and rebuke with all authority, let no man despise thee.'

The rebuke of the old Law came from the wrath of God and contained punishment. The rebuke of our text here comes from a heart of love to save us from bad consequences of our wilful sinning after being saved, and to make us wise unto sal-

Oh, my reader, where are you living today? Under the Law or under Grace? Are you still living in the flesh and fear, or in the Spirit of Grace and in peace? Are you still under types and shadows of the old letter that kills, or, are you in Christ who is the fulfillment of all law and its shadows, precepts and types? Are you living in the Spirit? If so, you are not fulfilling the lust of the eye and the lusts of the flesh. Are you in Christ Jesus, a new creation? If so, then the old habits, old ungodly companions and worldly amusements are gone - and behold all things are new as the New Testament is teaching. Read the following references and think: Romans 8: 1-14; 2 Cor. 6:14-18; Eph. 6:10-18; Phil. 3:17-20; Col. 4:5,6.

Law causes the honest unregenerated man to see his absolute failure and when the good news of the Gospel of Grace is preached to him, he is ready to run for his life and thus he heartily accepts the Grace of God. The Law draws him to Grace and Grace saves him. Question:

What is repentance? Where and when does repentance come in the matter of Law and Grace?

Repentance is turning from the bad self to God; also it is turning from the law, or so-called good works of men, to God's work done for us in Christ Jesus. Neither good works (the keeping of the law) can save, nor bad works can damn the believing and repenting soul. So, to repent means to turn away entirely from both man's goodness and badness to God and His Grace. This is very essential. On the day of Pentecost, the good and devout men were told to repent and be baptized in the Name of Jesus Christ, for the remission of their sins (see Acts 2:5, 37-39; 22:12-16).

Question:

Does Grace furnish life eternal in Christ to the believer and he will never die? God's best men have died, and are still dying.

Answer:

A saint in Christ, although dead, is still alive. His death is called "sleep," until he awakens to enter his waiting and blessed eternal reward. Jesus, our Lord, said about Lazarus that he "sleepeth," although he was dead and buried four days in the grave. Our Lord called Jairus' daughter "asleep," when she was really dead (Mark 5:39). The Apostle Paul says, concerning them which are asleep, that they shall "arise to meet the Lord in the air," etc., so, as a sleeping man is taking his much needed rest, so also the dead saint is resting in God's care while awaiting the resurrection morning. He that is born only once will die twice, while we who are born twice will never die.

Question:

Has the sinner anything to do to be saved?

Answer:

Yes. He has four things to do:

- 1. He should listen attentively to the preaching of the Gospel (Romans 10:14).
- 2. He must believe in the Name of Jesus (John 20:31).
- 3. He must repent, as explained in the first question.
- 4. He must obey the Gospel, be baptized in the Name of the Lord Jesus (Acts 2:38; 2 Thessalonians 1:8; 1 Peter 1:22).

By doing all these four things, he is simply yielding to the spirit of the law of liberty, and not practicing the old Law. All these four things are in the will and power of every man to do them if he so desires.

Question:

Is a man saved by hearing, repenting, believing and obeying?

Answer:

No! A thousand times no! We are saved by Grace through faith only, even that is a gift of God. These four acts (hearing, repenting, believing and obeying) bring him to the place where God calls him to come meet Him there, that He may save him freely because of His Grace in Jesus Christ, our Lord. Jesus' Name both saves and keeps us (Acts 4:12; Proverbs 18:10).

Question:

You said the Law causes fear and sorrow, etc. Doesn't the New Testament say that under Grace we should work out our own salvation with fear and trembling? I also know of many born-again Christians who have much sorrow, sadness and fear. Why has not Grace delivered them from all these miseries?

Answer:

The fear and trembling of a saint is a reverence and an earnestness to obey God's commands, which he enjoys to do. There is a difference between trembling because of being His enemies, and trembling with joy under the power of God earnestly waiting to do whatsoever God bids him to do.

As to the question why some Christians are miserable instead of being joyous, it is because such believers begin in the Spirit and end in the flesh. They step out from under the Grace of God and throw themselves into the mire of worldliness, sin and shame, bringing themselves again under the Law, which has and is, still in force to punish the rebellious, the wilful and deliberate sinner. Yet others cater to their feelings, going by feelings instead of walking by faith and counting on Divine facts.

Question:

Does the Grace of God provide and promise the saved ones an eternal security, or a lasting assurance, or an eternal security?

Answer:

Yes, BUT—only to those who will hear the voice of the Good Shepherd, and follow Him, CONTINUALLY (John 10:27-30).

To those who are engrafted into Christ, or Christ engrafted into them, when these continue to abide in His Word, and bear fruit unto holiness, these are safe also (John 15:1-10; 2 Peter 1:1-9).

To those who will go on with God and grow in His Grace, who also will not turn to look back, like Lot's wife, nor draw back like those mentioned in Hebrews 10:35-39, these are safe.

To those who will maintain the rights of their spiritual birth, and will not sell it for the love of the world, like Esau did (Hebrews 12:12-17), shall be safe.

To those who manifest Christ's Grace and goodness in their lives and testimonies continually and will never denounce their true faith by saying it is false, and never trample the blood of the Lord under their feet (Heb-

rews 10:22-31), will be safe. To those who will steadfastly continue in the Apostolic doctrine, and fellowship: Apostolic breaking of bread and prayers, yea, to those who continue or endure to the end, loving God, His people, His Word and His Cause - to these, and these only such security is promised. Read all of the above references and Matt. 7:13-24; Matt. 24:9-14; Gal. 5:22-26 and Rev. 22:18,19 and you will agree with me.

Turning back to the subject of Grace, let me pour out my own heart's exclamations in the following God-given poems:

POST WAR PLANNING

We are hearing much these days about postwar planning. All phases of society and all kinds of organizations are planning a "post-war world." This "global war" is giving every one a "global vision." The ends of the earth are being brought together through this war as never before.

The prophet Daniel said that "in the time of the end knowledge shall be increased and many shall run to and fro." Dan. 12:4. Our world is shrinking in size through the annihilation of time and space by modern inventions which have produced facilities for "running," hurrying swiftly China, which used to seem so infinitely far away, has become a next-door neighbor to be reached in only a few hours by plane. fore the war, passenger airliners were arriving in Hong Kong on schedule each week from San Francisco. Their schedule was seven days from San Francisco to Hong Kong China, with stops at Honorulu, Midway, Wake, Guam, Manila and Macau. But such giant airliners are being planned now that after the war this time will be cut down a great deal.

Technicians and supplies are flown to the war fronts on the other side of the earth in a few hours, and hospital planes bring the seriously wounded back, thus saving many lives. Statesmen and presidents fly around the world to conference and back again in a few days. In all the preceding generations since Adam and Eve such a thing was never done nor heard of before. Truly we are living in the "time of the end," for many are "running to and fro." And we are told by those who are in a position to know that after the war air travel will be increased many fold. I flew across the American continent, from New York to Portland, Oregon, in a 27 passenger airliner in a few hours, but after the war perhaps the Lord will allow us to fly back to China in a little more time than that.

Truly the world is becoming a small community, and world leaders are planning on how to preserve peace and safety in this community after the war. But God says, "When they shall say 'peace and safety' then sudden destruction cometh upon them." 1 Thess. 5:3.

After Mr. Wendell Wilkie's recent meteoric tour of the world in 49 days, he came back and wrote "One World," and this book expresses the thoughts and ambitions of the vast majority of earth's inhabitants today, judging from what we read in the current newspapers and magazines.

In one paragraph of his book Mr. Wilkie says: "When you fly around the world in 49 days, you learn that the world has become small not only on the map, but also in minds of men. All around the world, there are some ideas which millions and millions of men hold in common, almost as much as if they lived in the same town..... Our thinking in the future must be world-wide."

The world is surely heading swiftly toward that final universal amalgamation of nations spoken of in Daniel and Revelation, and we Bible students who have had our eyes "anointed with eye salve—illumination of God's Spirit—know that it will finally be headed by the "beast" and antichrist. They will be deceived by the temporary peace which shall follow this present war, when the "peace and safety" cry shall go forth, and then "sudden destruction cometh upon them" by the final world-war, climaxed by "Armageddon."

The political world has this world-wide vision, and so has the industrial and scientific world. We are living in the days of chain stores, and great corporations amalgamizing under fewer and fewer heads, until finally they will all be brought under one supreme head, the "beast" of Revelation 13. Then no one will be able to buy or sell unless he worships the beast and receives his mark in his forehead or in his hand. Even today the whole world is on rations and it is impossible to buy many of the necessities of life unless you present your coupon. Of course this is not a fulfillment of that prophecy yet, for no religious issue is attached to it now. Nevertheless, people are getting used to having the details of their life governed by a central control system.

Religious World Also Planning

The great religions of the world also have their visions and plans for a post-war world. There has been a great revival of occultism, both in Europe and America, since the war started. Spiritualist mediums, clairvoyants and fortune tellers have multiplied greatly since the war began and are doing a thriving business among the multitudes of fearful, superstitious people who are trying to penetrate the future or locate missing friends or relatives. It is reported that the Spiritualists have increased by a million during the past year alone.

These demon-possessed occultists expect to dominate the religious world after the war, and not only the religious world, but the political world as well. In fact, they have been controlling Hitler and other Axis leaders for some time. It is common knowledge now that Hitler and Mussolini often consult spiritualist mediums.

These occulists, as well as Christian Scientists. Theosophists, and other religions who are against blood atonement, are expecting a super-man to arise soon who will be the embodiment of, and will demonstrate perfectly, their doctrines.

A missionary in North Africa recently received this startling announcement from a Mohammedan: "These are the last days. The Man of the Hour, who is a Moslem, may appear at any time now, and when he comes he will complete this slaughter of Christianity now proceed-

ing among yourselves and make Islam a world religion and Moslems its rulers."

God's Word tells us that the expectations of all the anti-Christian religions shall be realized, temporarily, for finally there shall arise one "whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders and with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: that they might all be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness." 2 Thess. 2:8-12; Rev. 13:11-15. So we see how dangerous it is to reject truth or indulge in unrighteous pleasures.

Other branches of the religious world, such as Catholicism, Protestantism and Jewry, are all laying their plans for an aggressive forward move as soon as this war is over. They are training an army of priests, nuns and missionaries to send out to the now closed foreign countries as soon as they are opened up again. Some are already going to South America and other countries that are not yet closed to the Gospel.

These organizations are not only training many workers to step into post war open doors, but they are raising vast sums of money with which to send them and establish them in their new fields. And most of these do not believe in the present day miracle working power of the resurrected Christ. Others believe in the first century Apostolic power but do not believe in all the truths and ordinances of the first century Church as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles.

Paul says, "Now I praise you, brethern, that ye remember me in all things, and keep the ordinances, as I delivered them to you." And again, "See, saith He, that thou make all things according to the pattern." I Cor. 11:2; Heb. 8:5. The first century Church of the Acts of The Apostles is our pattern church. Hence God's full approval rested upon it in such a glorious, miraculous way. Therefore His command in Jude 3 cannot be disobeyed with impunity: "Ye should earnestly contend for the faith once (for all, mg.) delivered unto the saints."

Wherefore, since the subnormal churches are so zealous and so willing to sacrifice for the propagation of their doctrines, what should we be doing who represent the original Apostolic Gospel in all its fulness and power and blessing? Should not we who have received the most from God be willing to sacrifice the most for Him? Some people who have been gloriously converted and delivered from costly habits, and their bodies healed of incurable diseases and afflictions free of charge by the Lord Jesus are more timid in witnessing and less willing to sacrifice for Him and the furtherance of His Gospel than some who have merely been converted to Christianity by mechanically joining some church!

What a shame! But we remember that when Jesus healed ten lepers at one time only one re-
