

—REPORT OF SISTER MAE IRY'S SAFETY—

The many friends of our dear Sister Mae Iry will be very much interested in a letter from Mrs. Grace K. Chang, sent to our Sis. Elizabeth Stieglitz, who forwarded a copy to me, which copy I quote herewith:

"I had the privilege of being room mate and also sleeping in the bed next to your mother, Mrs. Mae Iry, for six months in a concentration camp. I was one of the fortunate ones that returned on the Gripsholm, landing December 1, 1943. I left your mother in camp September 15, 1943. She was in good health when I left.

"Your mother was very firm in her decision to stay on until she was put out of the country. She never applied or signed any papers for repatriation for the U.S. If she had signed up she would have been on the Gripsholm because of her age, but she did not want to come. She came to camp from Tiayo Shansi on March 22 or 23, 1943. Up to that time she had not been allowed to stay in the mission station, and was not allowed to go to any meetings. When she was taken to the concentration camp she lost all her belongings except what she was able to bring in two trunks and her suitcases. She sent some things over to the Swedish missionaries who lived in the same city. think Johnson was their name. The property and buildings were also taken over by the Japs. That is why she is so eager to stay in China because she says she is the only one who knows about the mission property in detail and she wants to be there when the war is over. Of course the loss of this world's goods does not mean much anyway. She was able to bring to camp plenty of bedding and clothing so you have nothing to worry about as far as that is concerned. She did not bring a bed but was given an iron one with springs by the missionaries. When we left she was given a lovely fur Chinese garment by one of the missionaries who was leaving and also she bought a winter coat from another, so she is all fixed now. The coat she brought with her was not heavy enough and she wanted two anyway, one to wear everyday and one for best.

Of course our camp was for civilians and not for war prisoners, and so we did not have any of the harsh treatment that the prisoners of war in the Philippines had. There were 2,500 in our camp, 17 nationalities, and only 250 came home. We left about 250 Americans there. The camp is on the premises of a Presbyterian Mission Compound and so the compound is nice and buildings are good. At first I was with your mother in what used to be a classroom, but was turned into a dormitory, 14 of us in a room. When we left, your mother was transferred to a small room with only one person she liked very much. The small rooms were the rooms built for the Chinese students who attended college there. The Japs painted the rooms and put in wooden floors before we went there. I understand that you have been in China, so you will know more what these rooms are like. Each room has two small windows, one in front and one in back. It also has a door and a coal stove in

winter. You have to look after your own stove.

Everyone in camp does some work, but all the details are worked out and governed by the internes and their committees and not the Japs. The whole camp has been organized and it is really wonderful what work they have done and what comparative comfort has been wrought out of chaos. It surely was a mess when we went there, now it has been cleaned up, gardens planted in front of the little rooms, and everything possible done to make things as comfortable as possible. We could have our religious services, including a Pentecostal prayer meeting every Friday. We also had entertainments twice a week as we had musicians in camp, also a choral. You can understand by this that everyone did his part to make the other fellow happy, and there was a wonderful spirit of cheerfulness and helpfulness in the whole camp.

Your mother is in the aged group and does not have to do any work. She just helps when she feels like it by peeling vegetables. wonderful American and British doctors and nurses as there is a hospital on the compound. They have cleaned it up and made it into a wonderful place. They had even performed about 20 operations before we left. Only three deaths in the six months we were in camp, and they were not caused by camp life. We surely had wonderdoctors and dietitians, and they did all in their power to keep us well. During the summer we had no epidemic as the doctor kept a firm hand on all. Anyone with any stomach trouble at all had to go to bed for three days, and if there were any signs of dysentery they were taken to the hospital at once. Your mother was in the hospital for eleven days last summer, but only because she had a touch of dysentery and could get better care there. Of course, being in a room with fourteen others, it could not be pleasant to be sick. In the hospitals the trained nurses took care of the sick, and that was their camp job. Your mother was very glad to get in the hospital because I guess you know her well enough, she is independent enough that she would not want anyone in the room getting up and waiting on her. I stayed with her the first night and had all I could do to keep her in bed next morning and not up looking after herself. I have known your mother for years even before camp, but have not seen her very often. You may have heard her tell the story. I am the young lady that went down from Tuntsin to Taku, when martial law was on in Tuntsin to meet the new missionary. The name was Grace Kemming then. That would make it much nicer for us to be room mates at camp and I could help her a little.

Now you will like to know about the food. Well, it is very plain, to say the least, but your mother is not losing weight. She lost some weight the first month, as we all did, but after that she remained the same. We were given lots of good wheat flour and made our own white bread in

WORLD CONDITIONS

Acts 1:10,11. "And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold two men stood by them in white apparel; Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into heaven."

That was the promise given to the disciples as they eagerly looked into the heavens, and watched the ascension of their beloved Companion and never-failing Friend. It seems as though the testimony of the two men in "white apparel" was a challenge to remember, and also a never-to-be-forgotten impression. "This same Jesus which is taken up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into heav-This impression was never forgotten by these men who were the recipients of the Holy Spirit inundation at Pentecost. Through the severe trials and days of opposition that lay ahead of them, these staunch believers proved their faith in this promise by boldly proclaiming this doctrine in the very face of certain martyrdom. It has become increasingly apparent that scoffers and ridiculers of which the Apostle Peter warned in his epistle, have arisen to dispute this real and literal claim of the second coming of Jesus Christ to this sin-tossed world. The words of the two men in white apparel ring out with greater and more weightier effect when backed by Bible truths, and the Bible argument against all agnostics in the religious realm, concerning the literal second-coming of Jesus, is a master-piece of certainty. "This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner" is a promise that shouts to a doubting world the salient fact of a literal and corporeal return. He ascended corporeally, He shall return corporeally. His ascension was real, literal and actual; and His return will be just as real, just as literal and just as actual.

Acts 1:9 declares "A cloud received Him out of their sight, and Rev. 1:7 emphatically upholds this promise for it says "Behold He cometh with cloulds." This second-coming involves the Old Testament prophets. If Jesus fails to return, then our Old Testament Scriptures have misrepresented the truth. There are many, many more Scriptures that speak of His coming to reign than there are scriptural evidences that refer to His coming to die upon Calvary's cross. Not only is it true that the whole Bible is at stake, but the very words of Jesus are at stake, for He said, "Behold I come quickly and my reward is with me." All the Messianic Promises of the Word of God are at stake if Jesus does not come again. The very hope of the Jews is in jeopardy if Jesus doesn't return. I say to you this literal return of our Saviour is the hope of the world and if He does not come, the world has lost its greatest hope. You can take communism, socialism and all the rest of the isms and put them together in one basket, but you'll never solve the problems

of this world until you have Jesus coming in reality. This catastrophic war will never end in a lasting peace until the coming of Jesus. There will be wars and rumors of wars, and butcherings of one another until this wonderful Personage, the Prince of Peace comes to insert and effect His methods of peace. One of these days He is coming. One of these days He'll drive back all of the darkness of night that's covering and enshrouding this world and He'll come with His brilliance and brightness of glory to this earth. We are warned of the conditions that will surround this world in the day of His coming. In the first place the Bible describes

when Jesus comes. The seventeenth chapter of the book of Revelation reads: "And there came one of the seven angels which had the seven vials, and talked with me, saying unto me, Come hither; I will shew unto thee the judgment of the great whore that sitteth upon many waters: With whom the Kings of the earth have committed fornication, and the inhabitants of the earth have been made drunk with the wine of her fornication. So he carried me away in the spirit into the wilderness: and I saw a woman sit upon a scarlet colored beast, full of names of blasphemy, having seven heads and ten horns. And the woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet colour, and decked with gold and precious stones and pearls, having a golden cup in her hand full of abominations and filthiness of her fornication:" and here we find out who she is. Listen, "And upon her forehead was a name written, Mystery, Babylon the Great, the Mother of Harlots and Abominations of the Earth." Introduction

What some people seem to expect of that household would be a burden, extremely grievous to be borne. The pastor, his good wife, or his son and daughter, are continually the subject of many discussions. At high school a minister's child, most generally seems to be a target for the jeers of those in the class room. Many are they who have attempted to "outline" just what a pastor and his family should measure up to, yet if that same measurement was turned on those who offer it so freely, immediately we would have to "call the Elders," and anoint them with oil.

It has been said, "Why, the pastor has nothing to worry about. He shouldn't be discouraged or feel blue as do other folks. All he has to do is go to church and enjoy life," while still another stands at a distance and looks on, making this remark, "If I were only the pastor," or "If my husband were only a minister, I could sing all day long." Still another replies, "Well, he doesn't have to work, all he has to do is just let others bring him his living, he should always have a good sermon. He doesn't have discouragements like other people, therefore he should meet everybody with a smile." These are a few of the many remarks that make up the pastor's lot, week by week, month by month and year by year.

The Pastor—A Help in Trouble

Most everybody goes to the pastor when he or she gets in trouble. He must have a good word of comfort and cheer to offer under all circumstances. People will unfold to the pastor their troubles as they will to no other. His mind must be broad enough and his heart big enough to weigh the matters well and give the right advice. He meets with all kinds of problems, many that would tax a dozen minds beyond the limit. People with their domestic affairs come to the pastor and his wife for a word of consolation. There is a husband, who feels he is right in his rigid stand, and there, too, is the wife equally claiming her right in the affair. They have come to the pastor for him to help unravel the tangle. Many people will confess to the pastor that which they would not discuss with an attorney.

Here comes a mother whose children are trampling her heart to the earth, and she seeks some ray of hope from the pastor. There is a wife whose husband forbids her to attend "that church." Still the pastor must always smile and be of good courage. Many seek his advice in their financial worries, young people seek his counsel in love affairs. He is indeed the bureau of information, comfort and consolation.

Many times I have thought of all this, as a pastor of more than a quarter of a century, and have been made to wonder, "Who on earth feels it his duty to encourage the pastor in his difficulties?" Unpleasant and Undue Critisism

My opinion is, that of all people who should look well in dress, it is the pastor and his family (if such is ever possible).

The Pastor's Wife

I have said that if there ever was a place reserved in heaven for a single soul on earth for filling any certain place in this world, it should be the wife of a minister. There is one thing sure, you can't do His will if you don't know it. To know His will is to know what the Bible says, and then you have to understand it to know how to obey it. To be a good servant is always to please Him, or just being faithful to His will.

I am sure that I am searching, and expect to keep on looking, into the truth—the Word of God—to see what I can do to please Him and to be a faithful servant.

The Christian's Perfection

The reader may be surprised to find out from the Bible that the Christian's divine perfection has everything to do with our unchallenged faith in the absolute Deity of Jesus the Christ.

The Lord said to the doctors of His day, "Except ye believe that I Am, ye shall die in your sins." The pronoun "He" in the above verse is added, and it is not in the original like King James puts it. Thus, the Lord informs one and all that we must believe that He is, not only the Begotten of God after the flesh; but that He is in deed and in truth the "I Am" God, and believe it we must—or else we will die in our sins.

Our Lord, in His prayer while in the flesh, reveals a Christian's perfection in connection with Deity, and the Apostle Paul confirms it. Read it, according to John 17:23.

Herein the secret of the Christian's perfection is revealed, namely, "I in them." For "He is made unto us Wisdom, Righteousness, Sanctification and Redemption," and when He actually comes to abide in us, He at once becomes all of that to us, for us and in us—yea, a perfect salvation upon the basis of our real faith in the understanding Christ, even the Jehovah Saviour.

"Thou in me"—Herein shines out the light of the perfect Deity of Jesus. Jesus could not be our only God without the Father in Him. But with all the fullness of the Father in Him, He at once becomes all of God for us, yea, all that God is and shall be to us for time and eternity.

The reader may ask, "Where is the word 'Perfect' or 'Perfection'?" Here it is, "I in them, and thou in me that they may be made perfect in One." There you are—ONE, yea just one God and our perfection in that ONE—even the Holy One—the Blessed One—the "I Am." Not a manmade Trinity of three Lords, but just ONE Lord, One God—One Faith—One Body—baptized into One Name (Jesus) and by the One Spirit into that One Divine Being. One in Him for time and endless eternity. Hallelujah!

Apostle's Confirmation

The Apostle Paul obtained his teaching from no man, but direct from Heaven. In his speaking on the absolute Deity of Christ and our perfection in Him, he warns us in these words:

"Beware lest any man spoil you through phil-

osophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ.

"For in him dwelleth all the fullness of the Godhead bodily.

"And ye are complete in Him, which is the head of all principality and power.

"In whom also ye are circumcised with the circumcision made without hands, in putting off the body of the sins of the flesh by the circumcision of Christ:

"Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him through the faith of the operation of God, who has raised him from the dead." Col. 2:8-22.

In these inspired verses we find not only the word "complete," which means perfection, but also the road leading us to it by baptism in water in His Name—yea, in the Name of Him in Whom dwells all the fulness, of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Ghost which is signified by the word "Godhead." Mind you, "in Him" (Christ) dwells, not only all the fullness of the Deity, but the Almighty, actually lives in Him now and forever. Yes, all this Godliness was and is foreordained for our perfect salvation and eternal bliss.

This now brings us face to face with the following:

"And we know that the Son of God is come, and hath given us an understanding, that we may know Him that is true, and we are in Him that is true, even in His Son, Jesus Christ. This is the true God, and eternal life. Little children, keep yourselves from idols. Amen." I John 5:20,21.

What is Eternal Life?

The above Scripture plainly declares, the true God is eternal life. And this eternal life is in the Son. Thus, he that has the Son has also the Father, or endless life. Gen. 18:12. "Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, After I am waxed old shall I have pleasure, my lord (Abraham) being old also?" This statement made by Sarah was at the time when three men came to visit Abraham. As the scene opens we see Abraham sitting at the door of his tent. No doubt Sarah was carrying on some type of work inside. It had been a long time now since they had left their home country, and both were getting old. It, no doubt, was a constant thought in both their minds about the promise from God that they (by Sarah) would be the parents of a son, in fact, they might have conversed upon this matter the very day when these three men came. Abraham looked up and invited them to be entertained after the usual custom. One of these men was God and the other two were angels. NOTICE TO ALL SCHOOLS, Teachers, Students.

Considerable confusion has resulted in the last few days from recent changes in Selective Service regulations affecting those classified IV-D. This is especially in connection with students of our schools who feel they are going to have to continue in school throughout the year, or run the risk of re-classification. We are sending you the latest information that is available. We have before us two letters from Lt. Colonel Simon P. Dunkle, who is the authority on these matters.

Two changes in the Selective Service regulations have been made. The first cancelled the deferment of all "pre-theological students." These were the men in the last two years of college who expected to enter training for the ministry as soon as their college term was over. They are no longer eligible for classification as IV-D, and have been inducted into the military service. The larger denominations have been hit hard by this ruling, but we were not affected by it, since our ministerial students are not required to go to college before entering training of the ministry.

The second change directly affects many of our young men. It has been ordered that the religious education of our students must be maintained throughout the year, except for brief periods of vacation. No doubt you have all received this notice from Washington. We may comply with this rule by either of two methods: First, our schools may remain open throughout the summer and classes continued for all boys classed IV-D. If that is not possible or desirable, practical field work of importance to the training of these

young men must be arranged during the summer months. Col. Dunkle's letter states that "there is no reason to conclude that this work must be done within the walls of a classroom." It seems they are quite willing to accept field training of a practical nature for which credit will be given by the school toward graduation.

The school and student should work together in arranging the summer training. Doubtless reports of the activity of the students should be furnished the school from time to time.

We must understand that public opinion would be strongly against our boys being out of service during the entire summer. The Selective Service Board doubtless has this in mind and are trying to be fair to all concerned. We must fully cooperate with them in every respect. Thus far, no student of ours in any of our schools has failed to receive proper recognition, as far as we can learn. Although it has never been prohibited for our students to work their way through school, the outside employment should be of a temporary nature and consistent with their religious duties. We can assure any students following this program that they will be fully protected in maintaining their draft deferment.

The students, their parents, and friends have a right to know that we are fully complying with Selective Service regulations and that no evasion of these regulations is being made.

VISION OF CHRIST IN SKY REPORTED BY 500 BRITONS

Ipswich, Eng., May 8.—(U.P.)

More than 500 witnesses who professed to have seen a vision of Christ on the cross in the skies over Ipswich during a recent air raid alert crowded the Church of St. Nicholas last night to hear their vicar, Rev. Harold Green, express complete confidence in the authenticity of the vision.

"I have satisfied myself beyond every doubt of the authenticity of the vision of Jesus Christ on the cross which was seen in the sky by hundreds of people," Green told the congregation. "I regard the sign as a definite good omen, and if only a dozen people had seen it instead of hundreds I would still say it was God's call to this our nation."

The vision was said to have lasted for 15 minutes during an alert on April 27 and Green, who acknowledged he had not seen it himself, said he had examined the testimony of a great number of witnesses before accepting the vision.

"Some witnesses saw only the cross," he said.
"But many more who stayed to gaze at it have described it to me in such a way that they could not have been mistaken, that the figure of Christ appeared on the cross with bowed head and crossed feet and remained hanging there for some little time after the cross appeared."

Green said the vision did not disintegrate as clouds do, but "vanished suddenly and intact."

he visits the sick and make his calls, she is censured as being jealous of her husband. If she stays at home she is backslid and ought to repent. If she seeks to look neat and appear well in her clothes and has some pride in her personal appearance, she then is spoken of as being too proud, yet if she takes no thought of her appearance she is too slouchy to be a minister's She is expected to attend every prayer meeting and special service throughout the whole week, and always be a little early in coming to service, be sure and take an active part in the singing, praying, testifying and altar service. Nine times out of ten she should be able to entertain all the passing ministers and evangelists in her home, cook and keep up her housework herself, for if she had a maid to help her, some good saint would surely lose the victory. If she fails to get around and greet all the folks at every service, some feel she slighted them on purpose. Then above all these things, she should be able to preach in case of emergency. Then, too, it happens to fall her lot to be the only one left in the whole world to have a word of encouragement for the pastor, especially when he has met with some things that make him lose sleep, and spend hours weeping and praying for his flock.

The Pastor's Service And Family Appreciated

The pastor's family generally is uninvited to many homes of his people, yet they feel he should not fail to visit them freely. An invitation many times would make a pastor and his whole family feel like they were appreciated. Any little act of kindness shown toward those who are over the work of God as leaders of the flock, many times drives away dark clouds that the devil has gathered around the pastor's home. How easy it would be for any church to occasionally show their pastor and his family that their efforts are indeed appreciated. The church will be more than repaid. Any preacher can preach with greater unction when he feels that his people love and appreciate his efforts.

The Apostle Paul asked the Corinthians, "If we have sown unto you spiritual things, is it a great thing if we reap of your carnal things?" (1 Cor. 9:11). He then answers the question by explaining how they that ministered in the temple at the altar were partakers of the altar. referring to the order of worship of the old covenant which was ordained of God through Moses. Then he makes this statement: "Even so, hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel." (1 Cor. 9: 14). Bud Robinson said: "Ministers receive less for their services to mankind than any other men of profession in the world." Yet they serve in matters pertaining to the eternal welfare of souls. Why should a person think and ponder over a five dollar bill for days afterwards, when he gave it to some minister or perhaps his own pastor.

Many are the slurs and jeers that befall the lot of a preacher, yet he should never feel blue. He is expected to be satisfied with whatever is given him, no matter how hard he has labored. If some one mentions raising his salary or a spe-

cial offering, I can almost hear a good (for nothing) brother saying, "Well, he shouldn't be in need very bad, for I gave him five dollars one time (about three months ago, perhaps.)"

The Pastor, Worthy of Honor

It would be well for every church to remember what Paul has said in 1 Tim. 3:17, "Let the elders (pastors) that rule well be counted worthy of double honor, especially they who labor in the word and doctrine." It does not always give the pastor the "big head" for some member of his flock to give him a compliment occasionally, I rather think he is deserving of such.

People will pay dear for the services of a lawyer and never think of it, even if he loses the case. How should they regard the services of their pastor? He is called of God to "watch for the souls of his flock, as they that must give an account." (Heb. 13:17). He stands as a watchman on the wall, and has the case of many souls' eternal salvation on his heart. He stands as he who speaks the greatest message to all the world, the message of the Gospel. He is the one who brings the good news to those in the paths of sin. "How shall they hear without a preacher?" (Rom. 10:14). Is his service worthy of due consideration? Should he be criticised, or his family, when they try to appear their best?

Some even glory in the slander of the minister. Some will never mention a good deed of a pastor, but seem delighted to speak of his mistakes and failures. An accusation once turned loose on a minister goes with such rapidity that it's impossible to step. It appears that the evil mind feasts upon the tainted reports of another, and more especially that of a preacher. The apostle Paul must have known a few things when he wrote, 1 Tim. 5:19, "Against an elder (pastor) receive not an accusation, but before two or three witnesses.."

It isn't yet possible for a pastor and family to live and serve in this world, and then board and room in heaven. Does the pastor's home receive due consideration? Have you considered him and his family human beings the same as yourself? Have you failed to go a step or two out of the way to show an act of appreciation? Dear sister, have you ever thought that a little love token handed by you to the minister's wife would cause a world of cheer in that poor laboring soul? Have you been guilty of offering criticism when the pastor's wife appeared in a new dress?

Let me add, a discouraged pastor and family is indeed a subject of pity and sympathy. If anything in the world, to my mind, would make the angels bow their heads and weep, is to look down and see a poor preacher, a victim of some scandal-monger's vile lips, with all he possesses in this world—his reputation and influence—at stake, and him discouraged. Of all the great men and women in the world, it is those who have hazarded their lives for this Gospel of the New Testament. It is the most unpopular profession that a man can choose, yet for the sake of souls for whom Jesus died, your pastor and his family has answered that call to the ministry by saying: "Here am I, send me!"

This is not a shocking thought, because it is common. The moving picture show is the ideal of our people, they think more of the theatre than they do the house of God. You may not think that is so terrible, but to those who do not think so let me tell you it is one of the outstanding causes for our moral declension, for the theatre is the breeding grounds of suggestive lewdness and the source of our juvenile delinquency. Mothers and fathers ought to be aroused to the lack of spirituality in their own lives and arise like a Joshua to proclaim, "As for me and my house we will serve the Lord." Take your family to the house of God, instead of frequenting the questionable places of lewdness. Jesus said "As in the days of Noah, so shall it be at the coming of the Son of man." They ate they drank, and they gave in marriage. In other words it was just a time and an age when they fulfilled the lust of the flesh. We live in a day of drunkenness. the camp bakery, and it was very good. We always had good bread to fill up on. Soup and stew most of the time, but we got meat every day, - not much of it, but the soups and stews were good. They were cooked by the internes and that made a big difference. The first month was the hardest, after that everyone got used to their jobs and tried to find some new way to make things nicer. The cooks got to be miracle workers after the first month or so, and they could turn a real meal out. Of course there were seldom any desserts, and no sugar or milk for our cereals in the mornings. Our cereals were stale bread soaked in water and then brought to a boil and cooked until mush, no pieces of bread in it. That with tea was our daily breakfast. We could buy eggs in the black market and also through the canteen so we managed to have about five a week per person. Your mother had money with her when she came to camp. All money was put in a camp bank and we were only allowed to draw out \$100.00 a month to be spent in the camp canteen. Your mother had enough for a year when I left and she could get more, \$100 Mix., through the Swiss consul from the American government anytime she wanted it. She did not want it as long as she had some of her own. Eggs and fruit were sold through the canteen and divided evenly among all, also peanuts and honey. Your mother often traded her honey for someone else's peanuts, as she did not like sweets. We all chipped together often, the fourteen of us, some had flour, others baking powder, and some gave eggs; then we made pancakes and cooked them on a little individual stove we had made.

Our camp life was really bearable, especially to one who had been used to the life of a missionary. It was very hard for the business people who had been taken out of a life of ease and plenty. For those who could trust in the Lord and prove once more that underneath were the everlasting arms we found grace and strength to meet every need. For those who had not God to trust, it was especially hard and trying mentally. Well, all I can say is that your mother is not in real need; she is getting along very well, everything considered, and she has the desire of her heart—to be able to stay in the land of her adoption. I would not have come if I could have stayed, but I had not a choice. I signed on the deferred list, but my name was on the list anyway. I am a naturalized citizen so I did not dare to refuse to come.

If you have any questions I will be glad to answer them if you will write me. I will send a message back to you from your mother. Pray much for the dear ones over there and the work.

God's Smile Was Flidden Behind The Clouds


